


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

write this as the 2022-2023 school year begins. Catholic education in the post-pandemic world has its own set of unique challenges. While the faces of our students may finally be unmasked and they no longer sit behind plexiglass shields, their lives have forever been altered by the past 2 years. Whether or not we want to admit it, the pandemic has impacted students and parents alike. We talk about a return to 'normalcy', but the truth is that we aren't going to return to anything. There are new realities, new hurdles and new expectations.

A faith-based Catholic education is a precious commodity. It is special. The hard truth is that the State of New Jersey requires every high school to provide specific core courses for a student to meet graduation requirements. A student can go to any high school across the state and study English, Math, Social Studies, Science, a World Language, Health and Physical Education. So what makes a Hudson Catholic education different? Why should a family pay tuition when they can go to a public school for free?

A Catholic education is a proven formula for success. There have been numerous studies comparing the post-secondary performance of students who attended public and private high schools. The results generally indicate that students who attended Catholic high schools had higher college grade-point averages (GPAs), were more likely to graduate, and were more likely to graduate with a STEM degree. This Catholic school advantage is wide-ranging, benefiting many subgroups of students, including non-white, low income, urban, and low-achieving students. Those are the factoids. They are the sales points that go in a generic Catholic school brochure. But Hudson Catholic isn't a generic Catholic school. The things that don't get in the factoid brochures are the intangibles that make all the difference. And Hudson Catholic has all those intangibles.

When our beloved faculty member, Mrs. Lucas-McGady, was ill before passing away last year, a group of recent graduates would go to her house to sit with her and her husband, Frank. A few weeks ago, one of last year's graduates called me to tell me that her father had passed

away and that she just wanted to reach out because she knew she was loved at Hudson Catholic and needed to connect. The fact that former students feel such a link to their high school that they can instinctively reach out in times of sorrow speaks volumes of what our education is really about. And in their times of joy, whether it's a wedding for an alum, or a victory on the football field, a scholarship to a college, and an "A" on a test in their hardest subject for a current student, they all want to share it with their family here at Hudson Catholic. Our students know they are genuinely loved and they give that love back. Because a Hudson Catholic education is rooted in faith, they know they can turn to us in the times that shake that faith, as well as those that confirm that faith. When your education is centered around God, you begin to see God in your daily life.

The support of our alumni and alumnae, our friends, and our extended families, is the only way we can continue to provide access to this special education. We are not immune to the economic realities of the world, nor are our families. Now, more than ever, we need to continue to open the doors to opportunity that only a Hudson Catholic education can provide. Almost 80% of our students receive some form of grant or aid that enables them to stay at Hudson Catholic. Because of your support, YOU enable them to stay at Hudson Catholic. YOU provide the means for them to experience that love, to be valued, to create a connection that provides a place to which they can always turn no matter where they are on their life's journey. Your support doesn't just give them access to a superior education; you give them access to a better life. Yes, your gift, no matter the size, actually changes lives. I can only ask you to continue changing more lives each and every year. For that, I can never thank you enough.

I invite you to stop by campus on any day. Come by during the day and see the incredible interactions between our teachers and students. Listen to the laughter in the hallways and see the faces of young people whose stories are just being written. Stop by after school and see just how many of our students stay on campus well into the evening. I want you to see the incredible diversity that blends into one fantastic student-body. And when you leave, know that you have given them that gift, and you have given us the gift of their presence.

THE FUND FOR Fludson Catholic

Appeals for the 2021-2022 Annual Fund drew a record response from alumni and friends of Hudson Catholic.

Congratulations to our donors for putting us over the top on our \$250,000 goal for the year with a grand total of \$258,455!

This is the highest amount ever raised for the Fund, proving that the best is yet to come for a school that is on the move and well-positioned to thrive into, past, and well beyond its upcoming 60th anniversary in 2024.

This amount comprised gifts from 375 donors. Although the total number of donors fell below our aspirational and symbolic goal for '790', our total exceeded that of the prior year (263) by 43%.

Clearly, we are on an upward trajectory in participation and total giving that is representative of a winning institution. It says that our graduates and the broader community believe in us, our school, its mission, and how the present administration is stewarding the school to better days and bigger heights.

Thank you to all who gave this past year! We hope to see more alumni join in supporting The Home of The Hawks in the coming year. Think of the powerful result we might achieve for 2022-2023 if each of our 2021-2022 donors told someone else about their support and asked that person, a classmate or friend, to support the great cause that is Hudson Catholic, the sole remaining co-ed Catholic high school in Hudson County!





THE YEAR in ADVANCEMENT

For the 2021-2022 year, Non-Tuition Revenue of \$1,140,626 represented an increase of 6.5% from prior year, despite donors having to weather the effects of the pandemic, the onset of a bear market, and the advent of high inflation.

The top challenge we faced internally was the need for Advancement to replace \$254,000 of non-repetitive revenue from 2020-21, which was partially filled by the addition of \$154,000 from an anonymous one-time gift of tuition assistance, which, in turn, becomes a challenge to replace in the year ahead.

Highlights of the year included an 11% rise in Unrestricted gifts and 4.1% rise in Restricted gifts, and a slight rise in the ratio of Unrestricted to Restricted Gifts from 41%/59% to 42.5%/57.5%. These are welcome increases, as we always seek to improve the ratio of Unrestricted v. Restricted funds. Unrestricted gifts help optimize our ability to meet unanticipated challenges as they arise, providing the Administration with flexibility in managing the overall franchise.

Annual Fund giving rose 63% year over year. Gross revenue for Events declined 34%. Tuition assistance grants from external scholarship organizations increased 75%, Gifts to The Hudson Catholic Scholarship Program grew 36%.

Within the revenue mix, while we remain ever grateful for having the support of our Alumni Association, the school is becoming less reliant on Association funding as a result of securing a broader base of continuing donors and growing that base. This is emblematic of an institution operating on an upward trajectory.

Some stories within the story. Grant solicitations are being de-emphasized but not discontinued, due to extreme competition for grants, a low incidence of success, and a disproportionate effort needed to build case statements and applications. We will pursue opportunities when invited, or when introduced to key foundation decision makers through alumni and donor relationships.

A drop-off in Leadership Giving was not unexpected due to some prior year windfalls but, as an organization, we must continue to raise the overall participation rate from its present 55%.

Looking ahead, we see opportunities to close gaps presented by non-repeating revenue and forge an increase in revenue: increased Annual Fund giving associated with greater connection with our supporters and greater engagement in numbers as we continue to acquire new contact information; a spring gala event featuring Hall of Fame inductions; higher returns on our Black & Gold Golf event; the addition of more events to our calendar; growth in giving to the Hudson Catholic Scholarship Program; increased giving among Hudson Catholic Leadership groups; and class gifts from reuniting classes.

LEADERSHIP in GIVING

Leadership in a private high school comes in many roles, and it is important for those in leadership positions to demonstrate their affinity for the cause they lead, and that their interests and those of the school are aligned. The amount of a gift is a very personal matter, therefore, we encourage only that each member of leadership participate.


