


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

old As I move through my 39th year in education, I can't help but start to realize the reality of TIME. The reminders that Time waits for no man are everywhere when you are an educator. In high school, it's there in that 4-year period during which young boys and girls grow into young men and women right before your eyes. Or later, it's a wedding or birth announcement from a former student. Even later, it's a reunion where students who were 18-years old when you were 22 still call you Mister. Or sometimes it's the worst sort of reminder when it's the announcement of a death that has come too soon. In each of those scenarios, we are reminded that, as Hemingway once wrote, "Time is the least thing we have of."

I don't think anything really reminded me of Time more than the recent death of Brother Patrick King, FSC. Brother Pat spent thirty-four of his sixty-two years as a Christian Brother stationed at Hudson Catholic over three separate stints. His first stint lasted from 1966-1978; his second from 1981-1991; and his third from 2000-2012. I was lucky to spend 18 of those years with him as a colleague. To me, Br. Pat was the closest thing to an immortal that I have ever come in contact with. He NEVER aged! Whether it was 1985 when I first arrived at Hudson, or 2005 when Br. Pat was in the middle of his final Hudson Catholic assignment, he ALWAYS looked the same. And I think that Br. Pat was ageless because working with young men and women kept him young. And make no mistake, when you work in high school, those students are always in high school in your eyes, no matter how old they may really be.

Brother Martin Zewe, FSC, who entered the novitiate with Br. Pat in 1961, delivered words of remembrance at his funeral that covered their own sixty-two year friendship. Br. Martin spoke of the ways in which Br. Pat touched the hearts of his students as St. La Salle asks us all to do. He pointed out that Br. Pat rarely if ever missed a day and that true to his nature, Br. Pat was tutoring students up to the day he died.

Months later, Tom Bender, Hudson Catholic Class of 1969, eulogized Br. Pat at our celebration of Br. Pat's life held here at Hudson Catholic. Again, I listened as Tom remembered the ways in which Br. Pat touched the lives of Tom and his classmates, not only from 1966-1969, but continuing through today.

In The Fellowship of the Ring, J.R.R. Tolkien wrote, "All we have to decide is what to do with the time that is given us." Br. Pat used his time to "Touch the hearts of his students" as St. La Salle instructed. And in doing so, he exemplified the Lasallian principles that remain the foundation of a Hudson Catholic education. As you read through this document, please note the incredible people who have not only given their time to Hudson Catholic, but also their talent and treasure. In doing so, they have each touched the lives of our students.

If there is one place where Time does seem to stop, it just may be high school. As I tell my staff at the beginning of each school year, the students are 14yrs old to 18yrs old for eternity. WE get older, not the students. And that's why our alumni, our friends, our families and our stakeholders are so important. Your continued support helps change the course of young lives each and every year. Each of you lives the Lasallian mission and touches the heart of a student. In doing so, you manage to hold off Time, yourself, if just for a little while. Because that's the trade-off. When you help with the formation of young people, a little bit of their youthful joy, their energy, their fearlessness and their hopefulness rub off on you and you live on through their lives, and, like Br. Pat, you're ageless because of it.

Congratulations to our donors for putting us over the top on our \$300,000 goal, with a grand total of \$321,917!

Gifts by alumni and friends of Hudson Catholic to the 2022-2023 Annual Fund set yet another record high this year, the highest amount ever raised for The Fund!

Unrestricted cash comprised 88% of our Annual Fund giving, which provides the school with needed dexterity for use against any variety of needs, some of which are unanticipated and unbudgeted. Unrestricted giving culminated 13.6% higher than a year ago.

Last year, we surpassed our goal of \$250,000 by raising \$258,455. We raised that goal by 20% this year, to \$300,000, and we surpassed that by 7.3%. Year over year, we experienced a 25% increase in total giving to The Fund!










Which is why I do this work in Advancement. I do not see them everyday. I do not teach them. Nor mentor them. But I see their promise. I revel in their achievements, and I know their aspirations, just as I knew mine a half century ago. They are why I come to my role everyday with a zest and zeal to try and give them the very best high school experience and life-changing education, the same as I can say that I had, that we had.

As we begin our 60th year of operation, Hudson Catholic is a school where kids come each day, look forward to being here, and are in no rush to go home at the end of the day. They are with friends, caring teachers, and strong and resolved administrators, all enjoined in delivering a Lasallian education, gifted to us by our beloved Christian Brothers de La Salle, that addresses the whole person and stresses the importance of service to others.

We are a school that consistently delivers better than expected outcomes given the socio-economic and academic backgrounds from which many of our students emanate.

We are a school that conquered the pandemic, never closing or losing time to widespread illness or misguided policy decisions. Our last three graduating classes took a direct hit from restrictions placed upon society for two years. They toughed through it and came out the other end just as strongly as other classes before them.

And what I call "the added value of a Hudson Catholic education" collectively saved 51 Hawks and their families (with has many following behind them in the Dual Enrollment Program) \$5.5million in college tuition while earning an Associate degree from St. Peter's University over the course of three years of study on both campuses, all while earning their high school diplomas.

For all these reasons, and many more, Hudson Catholic has become a 'Shining School on a Hill'— a place where young Hawks annually stretch themselves toward becoming great citizens and leaders of tomorrow. We know that because our 8,000 alumni have proven that over and over again. Life at Hudson Catholic is good. Very good. It is vibrant. It shines! It is building incredible stories in the lives of our students. And it has terrific supporters in its alumni and friends, whose gifts and donations enable so many of these incredible outcomes.

THE YEAR in ADVANCEMENT

In a year when high inflation and volatile market conditions battered the economy, we, the Hawk community, produced an exemplary result. For the 2022-2023 year, Non-Tuition Revenue of \$1,142,581 just topped the prior year, by \$1,955, essentially flat on a percentage basis, at 0.2%. This result could not have been achieved without an increase of 12% in the number of donors who supported Hudson Catholic. These new donors came mainly from the ranks of our alumni, who offset some modest declines in the segments of Friends, Non-Profits, and Parents/Alumni Parents.

Highlights of the year include a 25% increase in total giving to The Fund for Hudson Catholic, to \$321,917, on top of a 63% rise from the prior year. This moved the all-important split of Unrestricted funds vs. Restricted funds from 42.5% - 57.5% to 46% - 54%. Moving this needle a full 5% from two years ago is a welcome development, as we always seek to improve the ratio in this direction, to provide the Administration with the dexterity to manage the daily cash management needs of the franchise and meet unanticipated or unbudgeted costs that may arise. This proved immensely important this year, as leadership was faced with and successfully navigated the first fully-loaded, non-subsidized budget in the school's history.

It should be noted that Restricted funds will always be an important component of Non-Tuition Revenue, due to the important role that external scholarship organizations play in subsidizing tuition costs.

Other categories with revenue increases were Gross Revenue for Events: 19%, and Grants: \$60,000 vs. \$0 last year. And while Leadership participation in giving declined from 55% to 33%, revenue from leadership giving grew from \$39,979 to \$142,580.

Revenue declined for gifts to the Hudson Catholic Scholarship Program: 62%; Alumni Association gifts: 46%; Family Fundraising: 13%, and tuition assistance grants from external scholarship organizations: 6%. The decline in HCSP giving is of an extraordinary nature, attributable to prior year non-repeatable gifts made to establish a scholarship fund and several awards.

It has been a stiff challenge to grow our revenue while enduring a two-year drop-off of gifts from the Alumni Association, from \$184,297 to \$31,704, but the reality of the matter is that the Association helped to sustain the school during the pandemic and bought time for the Advancement function to take root, organize its plans, and execute to the point where we have arrived today — reaping the benefits of a broader, healthier support base and revenue mix. 




