They are targeted for their faith. Those who perpetrate this crime against humanity do so with the intent of eradicating Christianity from the planet. They employ heinous methods of mayhem and torture. Pictures of the atrocities are rarely shown in the media.

We have taken the Arabic Letter "N" as our symbol. It stands for Nasrani or Nazarene,

one who follows Jesus of Nazareth. A Christian. This is the symbol jihadists use to identify Christian homes and businesses. Once identified. Christians must flee their homes or face persecution including the likelihood of being murdered for their faith. We have taken this symbol and converted it into a symbol of solidarity with those who are being persecuted. It was at St. Peter's Church in 1805 that St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was received into the Church. A widow and mother of five, the former Episcopalian eventually went on to found the Sisters of Charity. Elizabeth was the first person born in the (soon-to-be) United States to become a canonized saint (September 14, 1975), and it is at the Shrine Church of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton that they are pictured, above, where they attended the closing Mass of their pilgrimage.

Dear friends in the Lord:

Soon, our archdiocese will take up the collection for the *Church in Central* and *Easter Europe (CCEE)*. Many living in Central and Eastern Europe are still suffering the effects of living under communism. Grants funded by this collection are a source of hope to restore the Church and build the future in these areas.

The people of Armenia face many challenges, and recovery from a devastating earthquake in the late 1980s and the fall of the Soviet Union in the early 1990s is difficult and slow. Many children in Armenia live on the streets because of poor family situations or the need to earn their own money. The Sisters of the Immaculate Conception have used a grant from *CCEE* to fund a summer camp for 850 children from ages 8 through 15.

The camp is provided for children who are orphans, live in extreme poverty, or live in poor isolated villages. At camp, the children receive much-needed rest along with physical and spiritual support, all in a nurturing environment. Local and international volunteers help create an atmosphere of safety and trust while guiding and mentoring the children. Some of the camp activities include attending catechetical classes, hiking and field trips, participating in sports, and acting in theatrical presentations. While at camp, the children can experience the encouraging love and support of the Lord and others.

In order for projects like this to continue, the collection needs your help.

Please be as generous as you can be to this collection. Your donation will continue to restore the Church and build the future of *Central and Eastern Europe*.
