


Our 3/6 total Sunday Collection was \$4,084 209 adults and 52 children attended Mass.

SAINT OF THE DAY

ST. TURIBIUS OF MOGROVEJO March 23rd



Saint Turibius of Mogrovejo was born in Spain in 1538, and studied law at the University of Salamanca. When his judicial wisdom drew the attention of King Philip II, the king asked that Turibius become a consecrated missionary archbishop for the Spanish

colony of Peru.

At the time, Turibius was a layman, and protested the king's plan. His arguments did not change the king's mind, and he was consecrated as a bishop and sent to Lima, Peru.

Turibius traveled through the rugged, mountain diocese, where he found many of the worst effects of colonialism upon the enslaved and the oppressed natives, and on the colonists who seemed to have lost their souls.

The new archbishop led his people with constant prayer and penance, traveling through the territory to administer sacraments, teach the faith, and establish schools, seminaries, and hospitals.

Turibius united the Peruvian Church and held several local councils of the clergy.

In 1606, Turibius became seriously ill and died on March 23. His body was found to be incorrupt the next year.

Today's Scripture

The first reading presents the ultimate paradox of God: always "other," yet ever "near." God is revealed in the burning bush as a God of holiness and power. It is the image of the totally other, transcendent God.

Our Gospel focuses on our need for conversion. In strong language, Jesus warns that if we do not change our ways, we will not be saved. Yet this very warning is filled with hope. We are always given the time and the need for conversion. The image of the fig tree so simply illustrates this.






The Greenwood Lake Gaelic Cultural Society was founded by a group of individuals in the Greenwood Lake community in 1975. The society was founded upon the principles


