



SAINT OF THE WEEK

SAINT CHARLES BORROMEO



Saint Charles Borromeo lived during the time of the Protestant Reformation, and had a hand in the reform of the whole Church. During the Council of Trent, Charles was entrusted with several important offices

connected with the Vatican. Saint Charles deserves the credit for keeping the Council of Trent in session when at several points it was on the verge of breaking up.

Eventually, Borromeo, was allowed to devote his time to the Archdiocese of Milan, where the religious and moral picture was far from bright. Specific regulations were drawn up for bishops and other clergy. If the people were to be converted to a better life, Borromeo had to be the first to give a good example and renew their apostolic spirit.

Charles took the initiative in giving a good example. He allotted most of his income to charity, forbade himself all luxury, and imposed severe penances upon himself. He sacrificed wealth, high honors, esteem, and influence to become poor.

Work and heavy burdens of his high office began to affect his health, leading to his death at the age of 46.

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

Both of our readings focus on the forgiveness of God. The first reading, from Wisdom, is a prayer for mercy, based on God's love for all created beings. The God who created us cannot reject us!

The Gospel presents the appealing story of Zacchaeus, the "little man" whose life was changed by an encounter with Jesus. The focus of the reading comes as the conclusion: "I came to find and save people who are lost."

The encounter is initiated by Jesus. We have here an example of Jesus' consistent identification with sinners and the power of that identification for conversion. The identification is often expressed by Jesus eating in the home of sinners, a gesture detestable to the Pharisees of the time.
