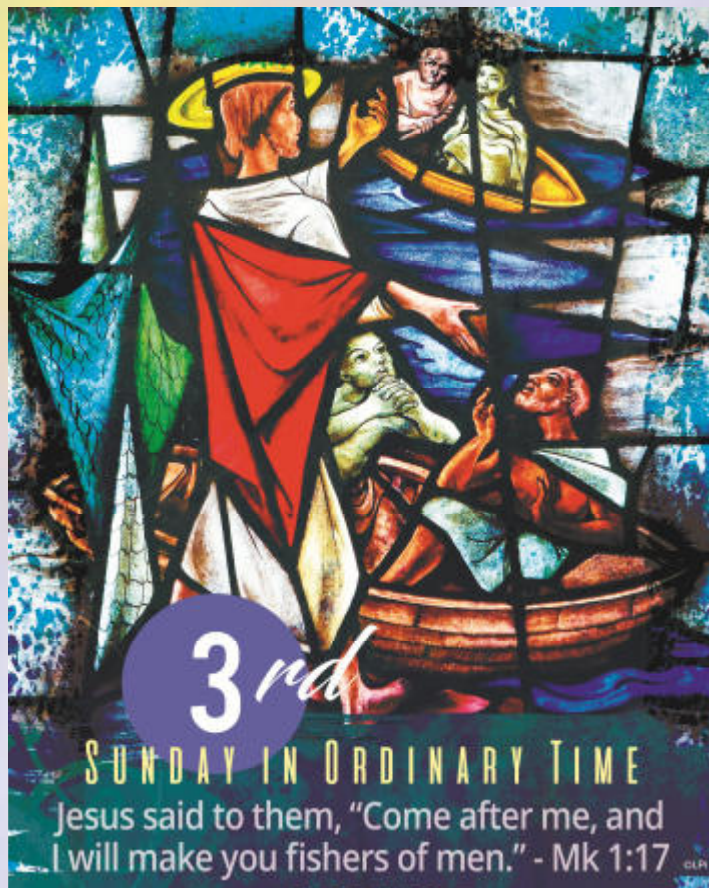

Pastor Dan's Weekly Message



GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

It was a normal day by all accounts, but John just wasn't feeling himself. He was a little lightheaded and out of sorts. Later in the afternoon, he experienced a sharp pain in his chest and arm. Quick thinking and action brought John to the emergency department with a diagnosis of a significant heart attack. Surviving this ordeal, he found himself face to face with his cardiologist, having an honest conversation about things that needed to change. "I came close to death," John found himself thinking. Then came the remorse. He was a young man with a loving wife and children who were very close to facing life without him. John found himself with intense sorrow for living an unchecked and self-indulgent life that almost brought him to his demise. He wanted to change.

We all have our wake-up calls. We have experiences and encounters that force us to really think twice about choices we have made and directions we have taken. Often, we find ourselves looking at those we have hurt square in the eye and wallowing in our foolishness. We regrettably realize that we have allowed our needs to lure us into making some cruel mistakes. We impulsively say things and flippantly do things that reveal our unredeemed and unhealed self. It is a self we stumble over and try to tame but can't quite seem to master and control. Help!

We spin our wheels, naively thinking that we will somehow, perhaps through persistence, get ourselves unstuck. But, we don't. We just get out of the car, feeling very helpless, and ignorantly look at the mess we got ourselves into. Did we ever think to ask someone for help? Or, taken the advice of One who is wiser and avoid this route altogether? "Come after me," are words that Jesus says to all of us. In order to heed his invitation, we must leave our ego-self behind and follow.

When we really see and understand the freedom, peace, justice, and love he offers, we find ourselves with such sorrow in our hearts for how foolish and silly we have been. All the misguided choices and sinful actions come full view and we see how risky our random impassioned behaviors really have been. Repentance is beautiful. When done with a sincere and contrite heart, it directs us to the glory that can be ours, ignites us with the challenge of living a life in service of others and reminds us that all is well. ©LPI

Stewardship Corner

The examples of discipleship in today's readings are so wonderful! In the first reading, Jonah shows what it means to follow God - without fully knowing the outcome. And don't we sometimes just **need** to know the outcome? We want to know that what we're doing matters. We want to know all the steps it's going to take to get from start to finish. But God asks us to follow and trust him. And then in the gospel, the apostles *drop their nets and follow Jesus*. Again, they leave all they do know and follow Him without knowing all the details. Imagine what it would have been like to be one of the apostles and have Jesus call you to follow him. He's compelling and insightful. He looks at you with love and while he knows your faults and failings, he calls you up to play an important role in His Story. **He still calls us today!** Faith requires trust in God, not needing the answers of how He might accomplish it in your life. Are you willing to follow? Friends, it is from this relationship with God (discipleship) that we are able to be good stewards of all God gives us (each breath, our time, home, money, relationships, etc.). May we be the best stewards.

What are the golden dishes I see on the altar at Mass?



The plate is called the paten, and it holds the Eucharist, (the Body of Christ) which people receive at Communion time. The special bread used at Mass is called a host. The fancy cup is called the chalice and it holds the precious Blood of Christ. The bread and

wine used at Mass undergo a transformation during the Eucharistic Prayer. Fr. Dan calls down the Holy Spirit, then uses the same words Jesus spoke at the last supper. We call this consecration-the point when plain bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ.

If you've been wondering about why the paten and chalice are gold, think about it this way. We receive a very precious gift in the sacrament of the Eucharist. Such a gift deserves beautiful and precious containers.

What an amazing gift! When we receive, we become close to Jesus in a very special way. The next time you receive Communion, take time to thank Jesus for the great gift of the Eucharist.

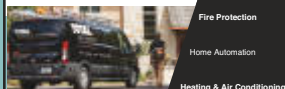
