Pastor Dan's Weekly Message





As we approach Holy Week, we wanted everyone to know about some changes to how things are normally run in order to maintain social distancing and safety protocols

Palm Sunday

Normally we would gather in the gathering space and process in; however, this year, as you come into church you will receive a palm branch from ushers and then be seated. Deacon Joe and Fr. Dan will sprinkle palms as they process in, so hold up your palms during the procession!

Holy Thursday

In order to keep safety protocols we will omit washing of feet this year. The procession of the Blessed Sacrament at the end of Mass will only be the server, Deacon Joe, and Fr. Dan.

Good Friday

Veneration of the Cross will be different than in years past. Deacon Joe will bring the cross in front of each section of pews. Parishioners are encouraged to make a sign of veneration in their pew: a profound bow, a genuflection, kneeling, or out-stretched arms.

*We will be taking a collection for the Holy Land like in years past.

Please leave donations in the receptacles when entering/leaving church. Thank you!

Easter Vigil (at St. Paul's)

Candles will be handed out as you enter church. Parishioners are encouraged to be seated like a normal weekend Mass as there will not be a gathering outside. Candles will be lighted in a sequence by ushers and then collected after the singing of the Exsultet.

Easter Sunday

There will be required registration at St. Bruno's due to the limited seating and no required registration at St. Paul's.

Stewardship: Belong, Believe, Become

Christ became obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Phil 2:8-9

Obedience. How does that word sit with you? Often obedience is something we shy away from especially if we value individualism. But faith requires obedience. Palm Sunday is here and we see on full display the obedience of Jesus, who followed His Heavenly Father's will all the way to the cross. He flips the script on our first parent's disobedience in the garden. While praying *in the garden* he said: "Abba, Father, all things are possible to you. Take this cup away from me, but not what I will but what you will." (Mark 14:36) He shows complete surrender and obedience to God's will.

Are we bold enough to become obedient to God's will in our lives? Our BECOMING who God created us to be hinges on our acceptance of God's will for our lives. And the beautiful thing is that God walks with us every step of the way, making this thing they call life, more joyful and peaceful than we can imagine.

Fun Facts for Catholic Kids 'of **ALL Ages** What is the Triduum?

This is the most important time in our liturgical year, from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil. The liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are: Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper, Good Friday of the Lord's Passion, Easter Vigil on Saturday evening-Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord. Honor Holy Week together. The last week before Easter is especially important. Make sure your child knows that this last portion of Lent leads up to the celebration of Easter.

Palm Sunday marks Jesus' entry into Jerusalem to cheering crowds, but that within a few days many of those same people would turn against him. Explain that this shows how quickly anyone can succumb to the temptations of evil and turn away from God. Use *Holy (Maundy) Thursday* to tell the story of the night before Jesus died, and how he chose to spend his Last Supper with his "family" of disciples. Consider making a family meal to remember the words of the Last Supper. (Matthew 26:17–29; Mark 14:12–25; Luke 22:7-38)

Make special note of Good Friday. The day that Jesus died is a sad one for Christians, but you can still make it resonate with a child. Discuss the details of the crucifixion in an age-appropriate fashion, and focus on the sacrifice Jesus made for everyone and the glory he knew was to come afterward.

Paint eggs together, but point out that you aren't just making something for the Easter Bunny. Eggs represent the promise of new life, and believers can focus on Jesus' coming rebirth even as they remember his death.

End Holy Week by looking to the joy of Easter. Explain to your child that on Saturday, we celebrate the evening Easter vigil. It's also a time that we welcome new Catholics into our parish family. Source: Teaching Catholic Kids.org


