LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Jesus compares the Kingdom of God to a mustard seed, the tiniest of seeds. When planted, the tiny mustard seed grows into a tremendous tree with large branches. So too in each of our lives small things can have profound effects. God can use one of our more insignificant gestures to radically change another person's life. It may be the kindness of a smile, our willingness to accommodate someone, listening to someone's story, helping someone who is hurting, standing up for someone who is right or complimenting someone on something they did. We all have God given gifts and talents. What are some of yours? Our task is to use our talents creatively, consistently, lovingly, and generously. Because we are always guided by the Holy Spirit, things that may be insignificant or unnoticed to us can profoundly change the life of someone else. While we may think we are small and insignificant, God can make us large and magnificent. All we have to do is open ourselves to being used. We trust that God will take care of the rest. . ©LPi

Stewardship: Belong, Believe, Become

"...seek first the kingdom [of God] and his righteousness, and all these things will be given you besides." Matthew 6:33

In today's Gospel, Jesus speaks about the Kingdom of God. He often correlates the Kingdom of God to simple ideas - if not for your benefit, then definitely for mine! - although understanding the Kingdom of God will always remain a bit of a mystery.

At every Mass during the Our Father, we pray the words "thy kingdom come." As disciples of Jesus, one of our responsibilities is to help bring about the kingdom. But what does that mean? In his book "Living the Lord's Prayer," Albert Haase suggests that we bring about the Kingdom of God through

- + our awareness of God's love
- † our love of others
- † surrendering to the present moment
- † living in a state of peace and joy

Which one of these do you think God is calling you to live more deeply? Ordinary time (the liturgical season that runs now until Advent!) is a perfect time to focus on living out these realities in our everyday lives. Just focus on one! It can be difficult to live in the present moment and accept whatever comes our way in this "age of distraction." But we should be open to the fact that, "What God arranged for us to experience at each moment is the best and holiest thing that could happen to us." (Abandonment to Divine Providence by Jean-Pierre de Caussade) The things we face in our everyday lives are moments in which God can sanctify us (make us holy!) and ultimately reveal the Kingdom of God more deeply.

Ordinary Time

Why do we have GREEN for Ordinary Time?

It seems like we've been celebrating a LOT since Easter. We've seen white-which is the color for our liturgical celebrations and red-for Pentecost. We are now back to Ordinary Time, the longest liturgical season. The color of Ordinary Time is Green. We teach our little ones that green is our "growing time." In the next few weeks we will share some ways to grow in faith as a family.

Today's gospel, Mark 4:26-24, Jesus uses parables to teach about the Kingdom of God. A parable is a short, simple story which Jesus told to explain an important truth. Jesus talks about the tiny mustard seed and the way it grows into a large and sturdy plant that birds can live in. In Jerusalem, the mustard seeds are so tiny even smaller than the mustard seeds we can buy in the spice aisle at the Pick & Save! The Kingdom of God grows from small beginnings like that tiny mustard seed. The Word of God is planted in our hearts, and as we grow in kindness, love, understanding, and forgiveness, we share the Word with others. This is the way God's kingdom grows too!

In one small group, we've talked about looking for the opportunity to further our prayer. Recently a member had an opportunity to pray more. She was pulling garlic mustard weeds and lamenting to God about why there were so many. She found herself feeling frustrated with her own complaining and remembered something we'd talked about in our small group about offering up a task for the sake of others. So she started praying for the group members and any burdens they'd shared. She continued to see more and more weeds and the start of those garlic mustard plants are so tiny, what a big job! (Apparently garlic mustard seeds can hang around for 8 years!) Another group member said, "Thank you! At least I know you'll be praying for me for 8 years!" Adopting a new mindset in favor of prayer rather than despair is a real fruit of faith sharing!!



The May apples featured here over the past 8 weeks are just starting to bear fruit. (Apparently they are edible but only at a particular time, so I'll just admire and not partake.) What sort of fruit are YOU bearing in your faith life? Pray about belonging to (or starting) a small faith sharing group. Believe in the power of the Holy Spirit when
