



I always feel a little sad when someone begins to speak to me with the words, "Father, I know you're so busy, but ..." It happens a lot. And I get it. He or she is trying to be respectful of my time. But it saddens me because a priest makes Jesus present to people in a special way, and Jesus always has time for us. Don't we all feel at times that God just doesn't have time for us?



Nonsense. Just look at the stun-

ning "Road to Emmaus" story we hear this week. It's the day Jesus rose from the dead. And the Risen One appears in disguise to two disciples. He walks with them, chats with them, and eventually eats with them. It could have been hours he spends with them — two unnamed persons — in the middle of nowhere. On the day he rose from the dead!

My friends, please take this to heart: The Risen Jesus is not too busy to spend time with you! He doesn't have "better things to do." You and I are members of this crucified and risen Body. He therefore has all the time in the world to be with us. So, I challenge you this week to approach him confidently in prayer and conversation. Building The Domestic Church—Celebrating The Entire Easter Season


Chances are you have packed away the Easter baskets and consumed the last of the Reese's eggs. Did you know that the Easter season actually lasts fifty days, from the Sunday of the Resurrection of Jesus to Pentecost Sunday. It is a way of prolonging the joy of the initial day.



So how do we continue to celebrate the 50 days of Easter? We've already observed the Second

Sunday of Easter with Divine Mercy. During the weeks leading up to Pentecost, I will share ideas on how to celebrate the Easter Season with

- Display a resurrection set. Just like you have a nativity set during Christmas, have a resurrection set and display it somewhere prominent during the Easter season. Keep it out through Pentecost.
- Make your own Pascal candle, or get a white candle blessed by your priest. Light it each night at dinner through the Easter season.
- Go on a walk to remember how the disciples meet Risen Jesus on



the road to Emmaus. At some point during the walk, take a break and read the story from the Bible Luke 24:13-35 to vour kids, then ask: When did the disciples finally recognize Jesus? Who helps you understand the scriptures? How can going to church help you experience God's love in times of trouble? Source: Catholic Icing




Care For God's Creation

Sometimes it seems we forget, it is **God's** creation. We read Genesis 1, where God gave Adam dominion over creation, which does not mean "domination or power over" but, as we read in Genesis 2, it means the ability to cultivate the land and care for it. It sounds like a partnership. God is asking us to be responsible stewards over the glory of creation, in which God remains present and active. "Domus", our common home, is the root word Pope Francis seems to use.

The earth is God's gift to everyone and everything, all needing each for survival and joy. Nature's resources belong to all, human and nonhuman, rich and poor alike, not for the profit and benefit of the few but for all. More and more we become aware of our interdependence with all God's creation, left in awe at the intricacy and responsibility of it all.

This God-given responsibility is demanding. Side-stepping consumerism, we might be surprised at the added time we have for family, friends, and civic and church responsibilities.

Is it a beautiful world where biodiversity flourishes, treated with affection and tenderness? Our hope is to hear of our cooperation "and God saw it was good". 
St. Bruno Book Club


