

# Weekly Message



Traditionally, the four writers of the Gospels are symbolized by four creatures that make their way into Church art and architecture: Matthew, an angel; Mark, a lion; Luke, an ox; and John, an eagle. These images can be found in churches across the world, a nod to those who recorded the stories of Jesus for us, thousands of years ago.

Today's Gospel was written by John. There are a few reasons why John is symbolized by an eagle, but my favorite explanation is that his writings soar like an eagle into the sky with their beautiful, poetic language. The prayer we hear today is no different — Jesus invokes God in a long discourse that might seem mystifying at times, the same way that a poem can be perplexing to understand when we are unfamiliar with the pacing or format.



Consider holding onto the shortest sentence in this prayer: "I pray for them."

Jesus prays for us. For me. For you.

Let that sink deep into your being.

Jesus is on your side. He is aware of what you are holding at this moment. He is aware of your pain, your faith, your mission. And He's rooting for you. This prayer was recorded thousands of years ago, far before you were born. Since before

you were born, you were held in prayer. With that certainty, we live. - Father John Muir  $\bigcirc$  LPi



Celebrating the 50 Days of Easter
The Ascension of Jesus

Did you know?

- In the Catholic faith, Ascension Sunday traditionally falls 40 days after Easter, which is a Thursday. It is a holy day of obligation, but many dioceses move Ascension Thursday to be celebrated on the seventh Sunday of Easter.
- Jesus ascended into heaven.
- Mary was assumed into heaven. The simple difference here is that Jesus ascended on his own abilities, and Mary was brought up.
   These happened at different times, this is just explanation of a wording difference.
- When Jesus ascended into heaven, he told the apostles to wait on the Holy Spirit to come upon them. They stayed and prayed for 9 days until Pentecost Sunday, making the first novena.
- A novena is a prayer prayed for 9 days and the concept is based on this event.
- The ascension of Jesus is the 2nd glorious mystery of the rosary. (Source: Catholic Icing)

Read Acts 1:8-11



Imagine you were present with the disciples when Jesus ascended to Heaven. Try to picture the events, and how you would feel. Say a prayer to the Holy Spirit to help you share the love of Jesus with your family and friends.

We are nearing the end of the Easter season, and will celebrate Pentecost next Sunday. A few more big celebrations after Pentecost, and we are back to Ordinary Time.



# They worshiped, but they doubted.



Have you ever been presented with an opportunity to talk about your faith or pray with someone but you weren't sure you had the right words to say? Well, even after <u>all</u> the 11 disciples had done and seen with Jesus, they doubted, too – so we are in good company. Let me remind you that the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, is within you and the right words WILL come to you **but only if you open your mouth and speak**. Jesus told his disciples to **go** and **make** disciples. And sometimes the first few times you offer to pray with someone on the spot it might feel awkward; DO NOT let that stop you. Making disciples starts with a casual conversation about faith, a genuinely sincere prayer for your friend's worry, or a story of how God sent something difficult your way and how a 'holy moment' provided relief or maybe even an answer to your situation.

Here is an example – what words could you share about this lily, this picture perfect flower that someone gave you when you were sick, and how it made you feel? You might relate the warm feeling of delight and gratitude you felt when they showed up at your door. You would comment on the beauty of the pale shade of pink, you'd share how it lifted your spirits when you were having a bad pain moment. You would marvel at how much longer it lasted than you expected with more blooms on the stem. You would thank that person silently every time you beheld their gift. You would share

this story over and over because the simple gesture and the beauty of the bloom and the love it came with made a difference in your life. With a mere hundred words (+/-) you CAN convey a Holy Spirit encounter in your life and plant a seed that may give another person pause; it might just lead them to Christ. **Stop**. **Think**. **Do not doubt. Pray** about sharing a 'holy moment' – a God filled moment – with someone in your life. Then **GO AND DO IT** knowing that God is with you always until the end of the age. ~Mary Kral: Shared Director of Adult Formation & Human Concerns


