



Weekly Message



When I was in middle school, there were times I didn't want my fellow students to see my parents drop me off or pick me up in the school parking lot. I was embarrassed of my parents. Why? I have no idea. Maybe it was our station wagon. Or I didn't want to look like a little kid. But in retrospect that was a silly thing to do. I was a kid. And I had two parents who loved me and had built a wonderful family. I



was afraid of the other kids' judgment. How silly! I should have been afraid of forgetting or downplaying my family, which is where my identity had its deep roots.

This is a way to understand Jesus' words to his disciples this Sunday, when he says, "Don't be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna." Fear, in this sense, refers to where we find our deepest identity and our highest love. That's why Jesus says next that when we acknowledge him before others, he will acknowledge us before the Father. It doesn't mean we're brash or boastful. But rather we unhesitatingly and humbly embrace our identity as followers of Jesus and children of God the Father. 

Back To Ordinary Time

The Church has its own way of marking the passing of time and the liturgical seasons of the year. Ordinary Time is the longest season of the liturgical year. During Ordinary Time, we celebrate the whole life of Christ and learn the meaning of living as his disciples.



We reflect on and celebrate the life and teachings of Jesus Christ, making Catholic Ordinary Time an *extraordinary* time to learn and follow the teachings of Christ in our daily lives and to grow as his disciples. We also learn about and celebrate the lives of the saints.

Ordinary Time is an extraordinary time to learn and follow the teachings of Christ!


The season of ordinary time is divided into two periods, with the first falling between the end of the Christmas season and the start of Lent, and the second at this time of year, between Pentecost and the start of Advent.

Ordinary in the sense of Ordinary time is derived from the word ordinal, meaning "to count". We call Ordinary time ordinary because the weeks are named in number order: The Second Sunday in Ordinary Time follows the Fist Sunday in Ordinary Time, and so on.

During the season of Ordinary time, the Lectionary readings focus on the ministry and teaching of Jesus. *Source: Sadlier.com*

Green is the color of Ordinary Time. We teach our younger students that green is our "growing time". Listen closely to the gospels each week. How is Jesus inviting you to grow in your relationship to Him? Watch for ways to celebrate Ordinary Time in the coming weeks. Enjoy this Extraordinary Ordinary Time,

"Fear no one."

These are the first words of today's Gospel. Jesus is sending the Twelve on a dangerous mission; sharing His message will not be easy. He reassures them that the Father is intimately aware of everything that goes on with them; every hair on their heads is accounted for. Jesus references a sparrow in this conversation but, as I often do, I like to think of a flower. **The Creator, who watches over this,**



created US. He created you and me for so much more. When I use my macro lens, I am just so awestruck by the details. If I didn't get that close, I would miss the fine points of God's creation. 'Fear no one' is a reminder, that sharing His message of love and mercy, getting up close and personal may have a cost, as it did for the Twelve. On the plus side, maybe it will allow us to deepen our own faith or to make a new friend or to find we are more alike than different if we take the time to listen and be vulnerable. Fear no one. The Father's got your back (and every hair on your
