



Weekly Message



Patience is rooted in Hope

Life, like the church, is often burdened with evil, smallness, and impurities. The Lord's parables give us a hope-filled perspective on all three.

Evil: in Jesus' parable about the good farmer whose enemy plants weeds at night, Jesus tells us that God is not the cause of evil but permits evil to exist with good out of his patient love. He *will* finally deal with it, but his love lets things stay messy for a time.

Smallness: It's funny that Jesus says his kingdom looks like ... wait for it ... a bush. What a letdown! Yet this little shrub still somehow has room for all the birds of the sky. The smallness of the Church, and even our own little lives, still provides plenty of room for all whom God sends.

Impurities: divisions and hypocrisies in the Church and our own hearts exasperate us. Recall that Jesus compares his kingdom to a lump of dough with impure leaven eating away at it and therefore making it expand. It's the secret of the Cross. Not how we'd prefer it. But finally, great news.

The field, the bush, the loaf: all three parables invite us to embrace a patience rooted in hope: one day the field will be weeded, the bush filled with birds, and the risen loaf leaven-free. — Father John Muir ©LPi

Celebrating Ordinary Time Series

Try new family prayers and devotions Ordinary time can be a meaningful time to worship and pray together in new ways. Each month of the year is dedicated to a particular devotion within the Catholic faith. The month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood of Jesus, a devotion that goes all the way back to the early church. In 96 AD, Pope St. Clement I wrote: Let us fix our gaze on the blood of Christ and realize how truly precious it is, seeing that it is poured out for our salvation and brought the grace of conversion to the whole world. The first blood sacrifice goes all the way back to the Garden of Eden when God sacrificed an animal to



provide garments of skin to cover the shame of their sin. The blood sacrifice of animals continued throughout the Old Testament as the Israelites attempted to atone for sin and idolatry, but our own efforts could never breach the chasm of sin between us and the Kingdom of God. It took the perfect sacrifice of the blameless Lamb of God, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, to atone for humanity. His blood poured for ours. Here is a very simple prayer for your family to add to your devotions:

At the moment of consecration when the priest raises the chalice, pray in silence:

Precious Blood of Jesus, cover us and the whole world. Source: Catholic Mom





WISDOM

When I pray for myself or others, I frequently ask the Holy Spirit for the gift of wisdom. It wasn't until I participated in *The Rescue Project* video series, that I was granted the **wisdom** to know what I was asking for: **to see reality the way it is**, not the way the world is trying to squeeze me into its way of thinking.



From Pope Francis: The first gift of the Holy Spirit, according to [the] traditional list, is wisdom. It is not merely human wisdom, no, the fruit of knowledge and experience. In the Bible [today's first reading]we are told that, at the time of his coronation as king of Israel, God asked Solomon what gift he wanted to receive. Solomon did not ask for wealth, success, fame, or a long and happy life, instead he asked for "an understanding heart that knows how to distinguish good from evil" (1 Kings 3:9).

This is wisdom: it is the grace of being able to see everything with the eyes of God. It is simply this: Seeing the world situations, conjunctures, problems, everything with God's eyes. This is wisdom. Often we see things as we want to see them or according to our heart, with love, with hate, with envy. No, this is not God's eyes. Wisdom is what the Holy Spirit does within us so that we can see everything with God's eyes. This is the gift of wisdom. (Pope Francis series on Gifts of the Holy Spirit 4/12/2014) Are there any conflicts in your life that need to be reassessed based on this perspective of wisdom?
