

## Weekly Message



A life-long Catholic friend of mine recently mumbled to me, "I can't stand all these converts to the faith. They're always rocking the boat." It surprised me because he is dedicated to evangelization, and yet he struggles with openness to new Catholics. It made me realize how easily I close my heart to those whom I perceive to be outsiders who



become new members of the Catholic community. Almost unconsciously I reduce the world to the categories of "us" and "them." The result is that meaningful community silently shrinks in my life. Don't we all do that to some degree?

This week Jesus' punchy parable about the two sons blows up that black and white world. One son said he wouldn't get to work, and then did. The other said he would, and then he did not. "Which did the will of his father?" asks the Lord. Like so many of us, in identifying the first as the answer, the religious authorities manifest hidden hypocrisy in refusing to follow Jesus. They — like us — intuit the correct path but simply won't do it. The tax collectors and prostitutes are indeed following Jesus and thereby getting to work in the kingdom of God. Everyone is called to do God's will regardless of the labels we may apply to them.

This week let's reject the convenient but damaging categories of "insiders" and "outsiders." Instead, let's embrace a grateful attitude that Jesus is calling fallen, weak, and broken men and women like you and me. Then we begin to see that the tax collectors and prostitutes aren't them. They are us. And Jesus wants all of us working in his boat, no matter the rocking. — Father John Muir ©LPi

## **Child & Family Ministry**

#### Transubstantiation

The bread and wine still look like bread and wine. The bread and wine will still taste like bread and wine. The bread and wine. The bread and wine will still smell and feel like bread and wine. Yet, what was bread, is no longer bread but now Jesus, now the Eucharist. Our earthly human eyes see one thing – bread, but our faith eyes see something



different – Jesus. We trust our faith eyes more than our human eyes because we trust Jesus. Jesus told us the bread becoming Him is truth, so we know that it is truth.

It is a miracle. A miracle is something that we cannot understand. A miracle goes against what nature can do, but it is still real and true. Our five senses cannot see a difference, but our faith alone does. We do not need to understand it to believe it! This is faith.

For preschoolers, I would explain in even simpler terms. Say to these littlest, "Raise your hand if you have seen the priest hold up the big white Host — a big white circle at Mass." Let them all respond. Then, to be sure that everyone is visualizing the same moment at Mass, show an actual picture of a priest holding up the Eucharist at Mass.

Pointing to the Eucharist in the picture, say, "with the words of the priest and by the power of the Holy Spirit the big white Host becomes the Eucharist! That is Jesus!"

Jesus said, "This is my body." Since we know we can trust Jesus, we believe it!

The host may still look like round, flat bread, but is really Jesus . . . His Body, His Blood, His Soul, and His Divinity, His kingship and Godliness. SOURCE: Catholic Link

At the first Family Class in September, we gathered around the Altar and talked about the miracle of transubstantiation. One of the children said, "I want to see that miracle". 

#### Ordinary vs. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

The words ordinary and extraordinary have several shades of meaning in our culture and in our Church. In our cultural context, the word "ordinary" can mean "normal, standard or commonplace; having no special or significant features." Sometimes we even associate the word "ordinary" with "plain" or "unimpressive" — It is just an ordinary day. On the other hand, our cultural use of the word "extraordinary" can mean something "remarkable, special or grand" — She is an extraordinary musician!

In the Church, we use the word "ordinary" most frequently when referring to the liturgical season, "Ordinary Time." In this context, "ordinary" comes from the Latin term *ordinalis*, which means "numbered" or "ruled." It can also be "ordered." This is the origin of our word for "ordination." Likewise, when the Church refers to something as "extraordinary" it simply means it is "extra," or "outside" of the ordinary.

Every liturgical celebration is an action of Christ and the Church — that is, the faithful people, who are united and "ordered" under the bishop of a diocese. Because priests and bishops offer the sacrifice of the Eucharist in the person of Christ, and deacons assist with the distribution of the Eucharist, they are the "ordinary" ministers. That is what they are ordained to do — it is a normal part of their ministry. Lay men and women who distribute Holy Communion do so as extraordinary ministers because it is outside of their normal responsibilities as members of the liturgical assembly.

The Church allows for extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion to assist the ordinary ministers when required by the size of the congregation. Extraordinary ministers should receive adequate spiritual, theological and practical preparation so they can fulfill their role with reverence

and respect for the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Their extra-ordinary role is to assist the ordinary ministers in the distribution Holy Communion to the congregation. In the United States, extraordinary ministers do not purify vessels, they do not distribute Holy Communion to ordained clergy and their number should not be increased beyond what is necessary for an orderly and reverent distribution of Holy Communion.


