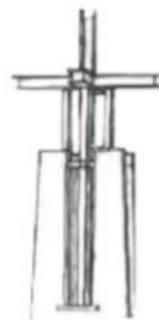

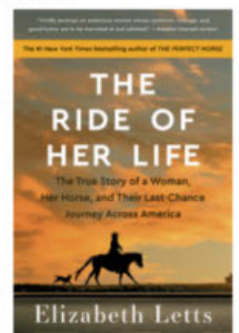

Summer can be a great time for Catholic teens to grow in their faith through prayer, service, and community building. Connecting with other Catholics through shared activities and building strong relationships with peers and mentors are also key components of a faith-filled summer. Here are some specific ideas:

**Prayer and Spiritual Growth:**

- Adoration: Spend time in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, either in a chapel or before the tabernacle, and consider visiting multiple adoration chapels.
- Rosary and Divine Mercy Chaplet: Make a commitment to pray the Rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet regularly, either individually or with others.
- Spiritual Reading: Choose a spiritual book or read about the lives of saints to deepen your understanding of the faith.
- Daily Mass: Commit to attending daily Mass during the summer, even during the week, to make it a priority.
- Night Prayer: Pray Night Prayer (Compline) under the stars, reflecting on the day and seeking God's protection.
- Learn a New Prayer: Challenge yourself to learn a new prayer or memorize a Bible verse each week.

**Community and Service:**

- Serve at a Soup Kitchen: Volunteer at a local soup kitchen or homeless shelter to serve those in need.
- Yard Work for Others: Offer to do yard work for elderly or homebound neighbors.
- Make Care Packages: Assemble care packages with snacks, drinks, and notes of encouragement for the homeless or those in need.
- Visit the Sick/Homebound: Visit those who are sick or homebound in your parish, bringing them flowers or a card.
- Serve at a Parish Event: Volunteer at parish events, to help with setup, serving, or other tasks. The Scally Brothers Concert- St. Bruno's, July 10, 6:30pm. Help needed at 5pm.
- Fun and Fellowship: Attend Summer Camps or Retreats: Participate in Catholic summer camps or retreats that offer

**Spiritual Growth and Community Building Activities:**

- Movie Nights: Host a movie night with friends, watching faith-based films or documentaries.
- Backyard Barbeques and Rosary: Invite friends over for a barbeque and include a family rosary.
- Hiking and Outdoor Activities: Enjoy the natural beauty of your area by hiking, biking, or camping, and incorporate prayer or reflection into these activities.
- Stargazing and Prayer: Stay up late and pray Night Prayer under the stars.

**Other Ideas:**

It is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and was designated a Milwaukee Landmark in 1975. *Marquette University*, 1145 W Wisconsin Ave, Milwaukee, WI 53233. *The Cathedral of Saint John the Evangelist* The seat of the Catholic Archdiocese of Milwaukee for over 150 years! 812 N Jackson St, Milwaukee, WI 53202

- ✗ Does the email ask for financial information, gift cards, or money?
- ✗ Is the email coming from an email address that you do not recognize and that is not published in the bulletin or website directory?
- ✗ Is the grammar or the spelling in the email incorrect or "off"?

Did you answer "yes" to any of these questions? If so, the email is not from us! Do not click any links, report the email as "phishing" and delete it from your inbox and trash.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
