The Word of God, part 1

Given last week's parable of the Sower and the Seed, since the seed was a symbol of God's word, I was inspired to share what it means when the Roman Catholic Church uses the phrase, the "word of God." Between Protestants and Catholics, though we share common ground in our understanding of the person of Christ, in the need for believing in him as the Son of God, and accepting that he is indeed the Messiah promised to Israel who came to save us by means of his suffering, death and resurrection, still there remain many points of divergence. Even among Protestants, though there may be a general agreement that the Bible is the word of God, there remain among them many distinctions about how literally it should be interpreted.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) teaches that, "By natural reason man can know God with certainty, on the basis of his works. But there is another order of knowledge, which man cannot possibly arrive at by his own powers: the order of divine Revelation" (CCC, para. 50). St. Paul teaches that what can be known about God is evident because, "Ever since the creation of the world, his invisible attributes of eternal power and divinity have been able to be understood and perceived in what he has made" (Rom. 1:19-20).

But it was God's desire to reveal himself even more to us than by means of the beauty of creation. God inspired the patriarchs, the prophets and the authors of the Old Testament, led by the Holy Spirit, to put down what God revealed to them. Jesus brought it to fulfillment: "In all wisdom and insight, he has made

known to us the mystery of his will in accord with his favor that he set forth in him as a plan for the fullness of times, to sum up all things in Christ, in heaven and on earth" (Eph. 1:9-10).

The document on this matter from the Second Vatican Council, *Dei Verbum*, teaches that "Sacred Scripture is the word of God inasmuch as it is consigned to writing under the inspiration of the divine Spirit, while sacred tradition takes the word of God entrusted by Christ the Lord and the Holy Spirit to the Apostles, and hands it on to their successors in its full purity, so that led by the light of the Spirit of truth, they may in proclaiming it preserve this word of God faithfully, explain it, and make it more widely known" (DV, 9)

So, clearly, the Bible is the word of God, but the statement above also includes the notion of *sacred tradition*. While it is true that in Matthew 15 and Mark 7 Jesus denounces the so called, Tradition of the Elders, elsewhere Jesus' teaching and that of St. Paul reveal that tradition plays a part in God's word. At the Last Supper Jesus said: "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on his own,... and will declare to you the things that are coming" (Jn. 16:12-13). After Jesus is gone, the Holy Spirit will be their teacher within the Sacred Tradition. St. Paul told the Thessalonians, to "Therefore, brothers, stand firm and hold fast to the traditions that you were taught, either by an oral statement or by a letter of ours" (2 Thes. 2:15). He distinguishes the written word from oral tradition but gives them equal weight. If you think about it, the Bible itself was the development of Tradition. In the New

Testament we have the teaching of Jesus, but he wrote none of it. It was the work of his followers.

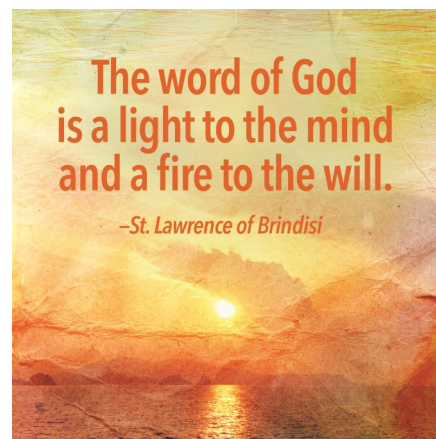
In fact, although the books were accepted as inspired and listed in a Council at Carthage in 397 AD, the canon (the accepted collection of the inspired books) was not finalized in the most definitive sense until the council of Trent (1564).

So, the word of God is principally both Scripture and Tradition, for it was within the Sacred Tradition that God's revelation was consigned to the written word and it was within the Tradition that it was determined to be inspired. This word is safeguarded by the teaching authority of the Church. (More on that next time.) There are a number of other books that were in circulation in ancient times. They were not ignored but considered and not accepted as inspired.

May the word of God continue to animate our lives and our actions, and may this seed sown in our hearts and minds bear much fruit in our lives 100, 60 and 30 fold.

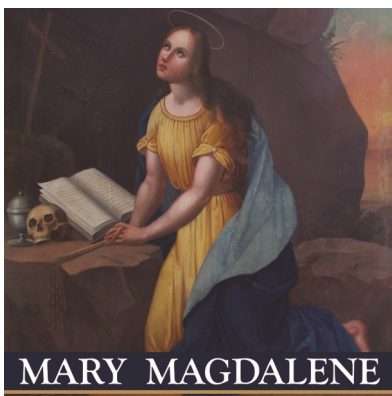

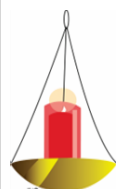

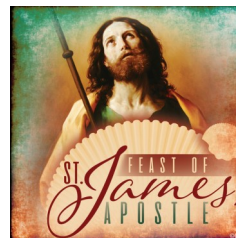

St. James the Apostle ~ July 25



Saint James the Apostle is also called James, son of Zebedee, or James the Greater to distinguish him from the other James in Jesus' group of twelve. Most of what we know about Saint James is recorded in the New Testament. He and his brother John were collected by Jesus along

the sea of Galilee. Matthew 4:18-22 tells the story of Jesus calling first Simon Peter and his brother Andrew and then the sons of Zebedee. In Mark 3:17 the brothers receive a nickname from Jesus who calls them "sons of thunder" because of their many extreme reactions, like that in Luke 9:54 when they offer to call down fire on a Samaritan village.

Saint James was part of Jesus' intimate circle, a witness to the Transfiguration, the resurrection of Jarius' daughter, and the agony in the garden of Gethsemane. In A.D. 44 Herod Agrippa had "James, the brother of John, killed by the sword." (Acts 12:2) He is the only apostle whose martyrdom is written of in the New Testament.

According to Spanish tradition, his body was taken to Santiago de Compostela, Spain where his relics were rediscovered in 9th century. This tradition has sometimes been attributed to a passage in the Song of Roland which tells of St. James appearing to Charlemagne in a dream, prophesying that Charlemagne would conquer the Moors in Spain. This was followed by a vision of stars which if followed would lead to the saint's lost tomb. In the Middle Ages Compostela was a hugely popular pilgrimage site. The saint's relics continue to rest in the cathedral there and one can still undertake the pilgrimage.

Bins are located in the front and side entrances of Assumption, and the front entrance of Resurrection to place your donations.

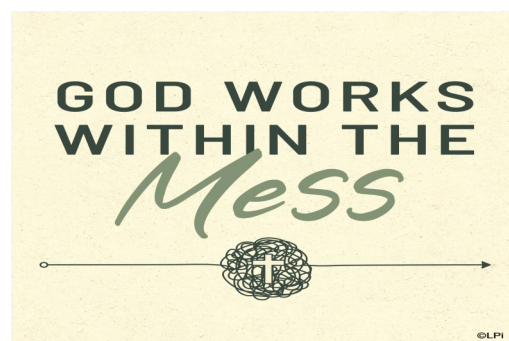
