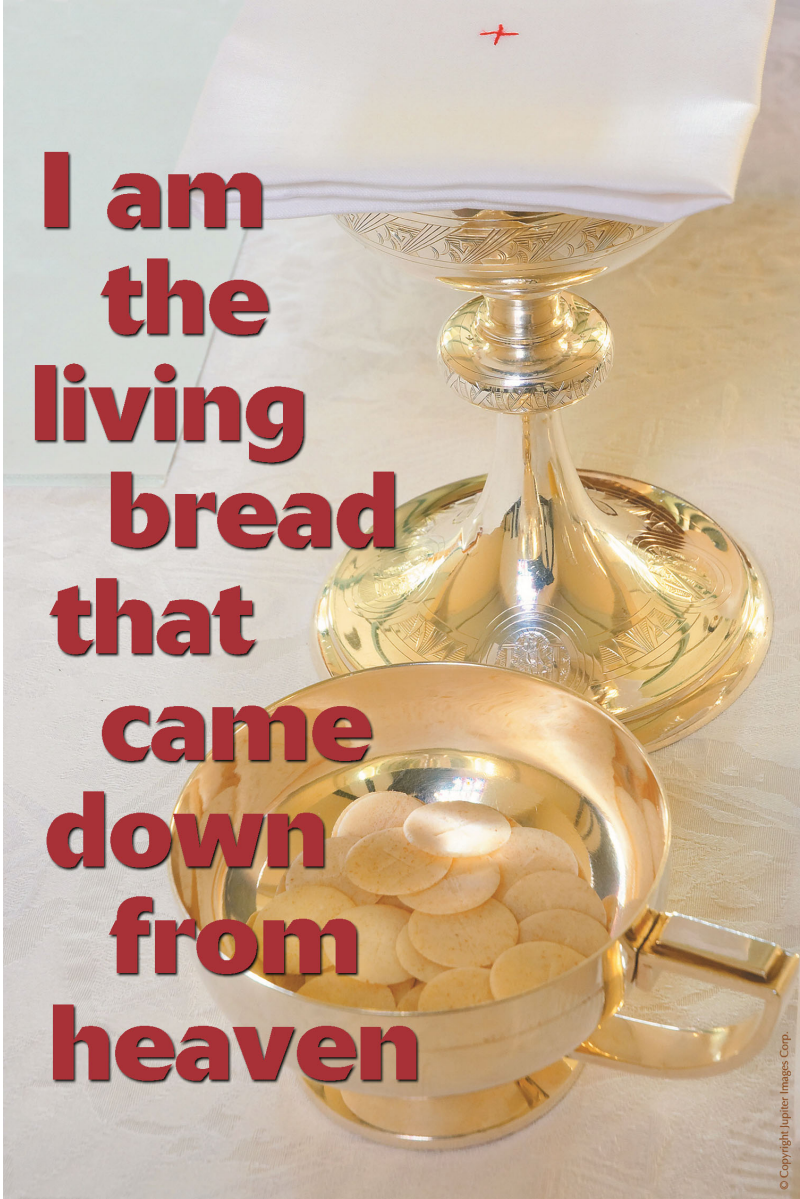

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

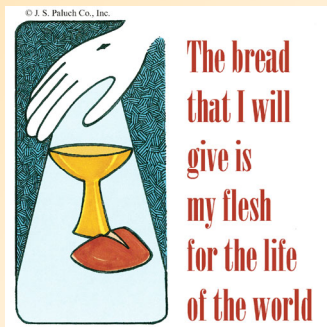
The solemnity of the Body and Blood of Jesus (also called *Corpus Christi*) is a solemnity of respect and love for Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist. The Catholic Church says that in the Holy Eucharist we have the presence of Christ "*Par Excellence*." In the Eucharist, Jesus is really, truly, substantially, and abidingly present, in His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity for the nourishment of the faithful. While it is true that Jesus abides in each one of us, for we make up the Body of Christ, the presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist is unique; it is "*Par Excellence*." That is why we genuflect in front of the Tabernacle. Our belief in the Real Presence is why we have Adoration, Benediction and Processions.

This universal feast day (solemnity) was put on the calendar by Pope Urban IV in the year 1624. However, although the feast of *Corpus Christi* began officially in 1624, devotion to the Blessed Sacrament goes back to the very beginning of our faith. The reality of the bread and wine being substantially changed into the body and blood of Jesus, comes directly from Our Lord's command, "This is my Body, this is my Blood, do this in memory of me."

It is out of love of Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist that we are having a procession at the end of the 11:30 a.m. Mass on June 18. This is not a new devotion. Processions have taken place throughout the history of the Church. In the difficult period of the Black Plague, for example, it was common for the sick to see the Blessed Sacrament being carried through the streets. The Real Presence of Christ brought comfort and spiritual strength to the people. Today we are not in a dire physical situation in our country but we are in a dire spiritual situation. We need the Real Presence of Jesus in our lives for spiritual strength. If you are able, please join us after the 11:30 a.m. Mass as we honor Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

SCHEDULING

THE USE OF PARISH FACILITIES AUGUST 2017 THRU JUNE 30, 2018

The calendar year for the use of parish facilities by parish ministries is from August 1st through June 30th. **During the month of July no events are scheduled.** This allows time for the extensive summer cleaning and repairs in the buildings. When summer maintenance projects require August scheduling, part or all of August may also be unavailable for use by parish and other organizations.

The calendar committee will meet after July 1, 2016 to approve the scheduling of events for the months through June 2017. All organizations requesting space must submit the official scheduling forms (available in the rectory). Forms must be completed in full and returned to the rectory no later than June 30, 2016.

No organization should assume that the space and meeting times available in past years will continue to be available during the 2017-18 school year. All groups and parish organizations are, therefore, reminded to await the confirmation of available space for dates submitted before finalizing plans for events.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

At the heart of today's solemnity is a eucharistic procession, held in many parishes, that calls to mind the procession of Holy Thursday, yet has a purpose different from the somber adoration in the night watch. In the late Middle Ages, a procession through the city with the Blessed Sacrament was an occasion of heartfelt joy and great emotion. In a time when people seldom approached the altar to receive Holy Communion, the procession through the streets, past homes and workplaces, was a vibrant reminder that Christ was with them as a dear companion and guide.

Every year on this day, a joyful procession winds through the streets of Rome from the Lateran cathedral. A few years ago, Pope John Paul II, deeply moved at the sight of the throng accompanying the sacred host, said that we ought to feel profoundly united with the faithful everywhere in the world at such a moment. "Before our mind's eye all the Churches of the world, from East to West, from North to South, are present." Originally this feast was on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday, but after the calendar reform of 1970, its title was expanded from "Corpus Christi" to "The Body and Blood of Christ" and in the United States it was moved to the Sunday after Trinity Sunday. Even though Easter season ended two weeks ago, this beautiful feast is aglow with Easter light.

ADDING NAMES TO THE PARISH SICK LIST

It has always been the goal of St. Eugene to offer our parish community an opportunity to pray for those parishioners who are ill and in need of our prayers. We have tried to keep close track of these names for our Bulletin as they are made available to us.

However, now we face an important privacy issue, very much like the issues faced by hospitals, health institutions, and certainly by other parishes.

We cannot (by law) publicly let our parish community know the health status of any of our members without their permission.

We appreciate the fact that often friends, neighbors, and acquaintances wish to do something special for a person who is ill, and ask to place their name on the list to be prayed for. While their intentions are surely good, we simply can no longer accept names in this manner.

Names for the sick list placed in the Bulletin have to be called in by the person who is ill, or by a member of their immediate family. At the time they call in the name, they will be asked whether they are the sick person him/herself, or a member of their family, and if they give permission for the name to be placed on the list. They will be asked for the **correct spelling** of the sick person's name. If a **family member**, they will be required to give **their** name for our records.

Thank you for your patience regarding this process. We wish to do all we can to offer our parish community the opportunity to offer prayers for those who are ill — but we must also be cognizant of the fact that all members of our congregation are entitled to their privacy in this regard.

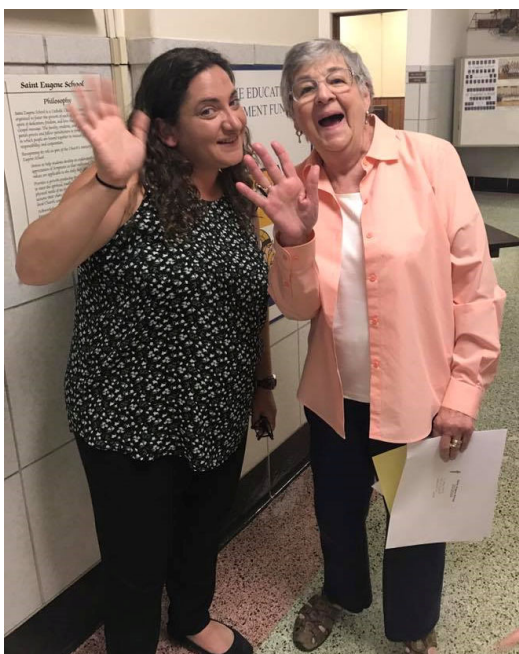
