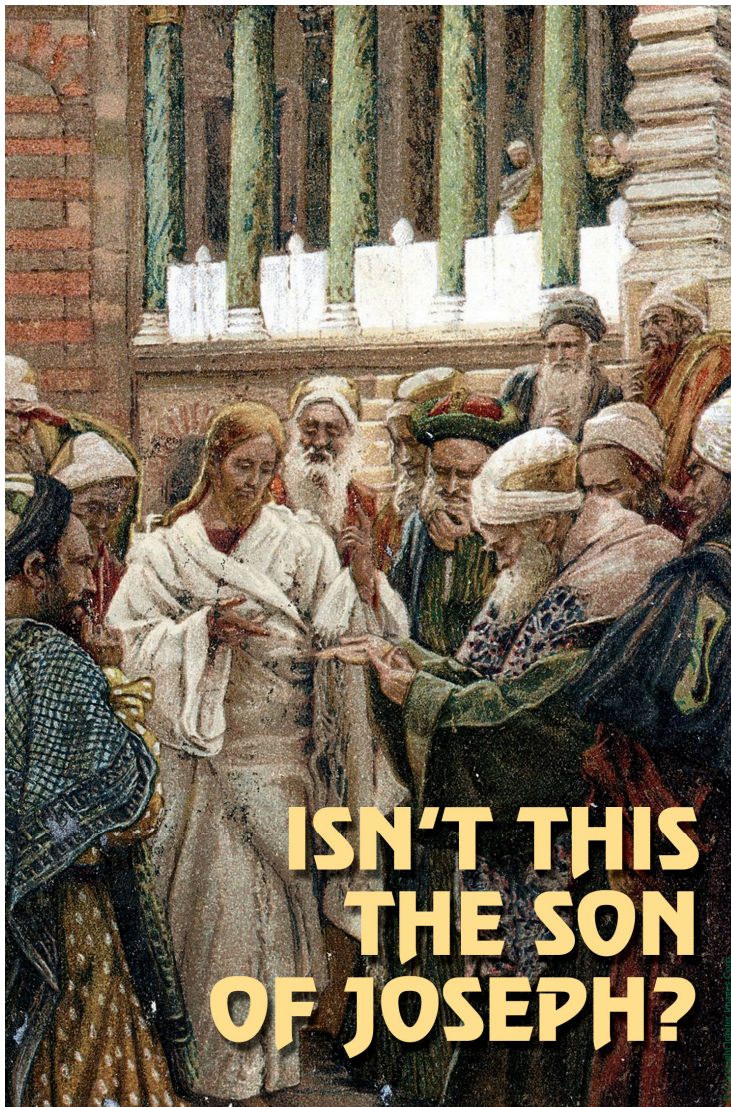

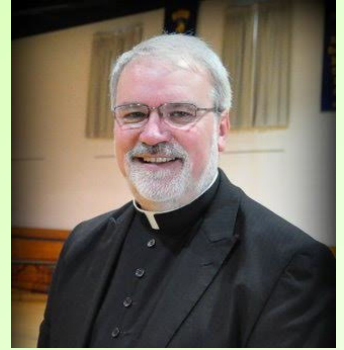

From the Pastor's Desk...

Today, February 3rd, is the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time and is also the Feast of St. Blaise. Legend tells us that Blaise was a doctor as well as a bishop. He was said to have healed a boy who was choking on a fish bone. Because of this event, Blaise has been and continues to be the patron saint of people who suffer from illnesses of the throat.



Traditionally on this day in many parishes, people have their throats blessed. The candles used in this blessing are traditionally blessed on Candlemas Day (the day before) and are tied in the shape of a cross and then touched to people's necks. Because the Feast of St. Blaise falls on a Sunday this year we will be offering the Prayer of St. Blaise over the entire congregation as the final blessing of this weekend's Masses. There will be no "individual" blessings this particular year. This day falls in the middle of the "flu season" and is a good reminder that we need to visit the sick and pay extra attention to anyone who is prone to illness during the winter.



Thanks to all those who participated in the opening of Catholic Schools Week last weekend. We had many new families attend our Open House who found out what a great learning environment our Catholic School would be for their children. I thank our principal, Ms. Cathie Scotkovsky, our dedicated teachers and staff, our School Advisory Committee Members and all of our school organization members who helped to make our Open House the successful event that it was.

As a Catholic parent, one of the most important decisions in your life and in the lives of your children, is that of choosing the education that will most benefit them. I ask you to consider the following reasons why a Catholic school would be right for your children. Catholic schools:

- have a proven record of academic excellence;
- work closely with you for the good of your children;
- continue the religious formation of your children begun in your home;
- have clear and precise goals;
- provide a challenging and affirming atmosphere;
- maintain a secure environment;
- have educators who believe that all children can succeed.

Because I feel so strongly about the necessity, value and benefits of a solid Catholic school primary education, I would like to see many more of the available seats in our grade school filled next year. Our school principal would like to speak with you regarding how you and we can make a solid full-time Catholic Education possible for your children.

We are now accepting enrollment applications for our St. Eugene Parish Day School, Pre-school and Pre-K.

If the possibility of a Catholic School education might be of interest to you, I strongly encourage you to give us a call as soon as possible, as we are making placement decisions for students for the 2019-2020 School Year. This is a decision you will not be sorry you made.

The 2020 Mass Book will open Tuesday, February 12, at 9:00 am. Please remember that there are some days when individual Mass Intentions will not be available such as All Soul's Day, Mother's Day and Father's Day. On these days we will have only one Mass Intention that will be for all of our deceased loved ones (All Soul's Day) as well as all of our living and deceased mothers and fathers (Mother's Day and Father's Day). There will be an opportunity, however, to include the names of your own personal deceased loved ones for All Soul's Day and for your individual living and deceased mothers, fathers, grandmothers and grandfathers, etc. for Mother's Day and Father's Day on the special envelopes that will be provided in your monthly offering envelopes. These names, when submitted to the parish office or dropped in the collection basket, will then be printed on special pages in our parish bulletin as well as kept on our altar throughout the year.

I want to give all in our parish an update on Fr. Phil Grib's health. After speaking with his Jesuit Community superior and caretakers, it has been decided that the planned February 10th, 11:30 a.m. farewell Mass and reception for Fr. Phil will need to be postponed indefinitely for now. This is certainly much to his and our disappointment. Unfortunately, he has not bounced back from his early January fall as quickly as we had all hoped. Fr. Phil was moved from Resurrection Hospital this past week to the Resurrection Life Center across the street on Talcott. He had not been eating for many days so the decision was made to provide a feeding tube to enable him to get some nourishment. He can certainly benefit from your prayers, so please remember him in your daily prayers and Masses. You can visit him if you like, but having many visitors might be a little overwhelming for him in his current condition.

In light of all the upset and news about the child abuse scandal, Bishop Bartosic has asked that each parish in our Vicariate host a 30 minute or so listening session to provide our parishioners an opportunity to openly express and share your feelings, thoughts, ideas with each other and with their pastors. These comments and opinions will be recorded (written down) and shared with Cardinal Cupich at a Vicariate-wide listening session that will be held in March. To honor this important request and to solicit your feedback we will be gathering in the Shaunessy Center at 12:45 p.m. right after the 11:30 a.m. Mass on Sunday, February 17th. All in our parish are invited to attend and offer your valuable input.

AN ONGOING MISSION

In his hometown synagogue, Jesus' neighbors are amazed by his words. Nevertheless, they remind each other, "Is this not Joseph's son?"

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The song of the angels, "Holy, Holy, Holy," resounds from our lips at every Mass. There was a widespread belief in the first religions of the world that God stirred creation into being by a word, a song, a musical note. Music and a sense of God's presence have always been inseparable. In the liturgy, your voice is invited into this song as the priest names the reasons for our praise. "Heaven and earth are full of your glory," and we are not passive onlookers, but participants in this glory. Catholic prayer no longer assigns this angelic hymn to a choir, but gives it to you to sing. Even if your voice is thought to be suitable only for a well-insulated shower stall, you are called into this song.

We are born to sing--just listen to a baby testing the full range of newly-discovered vocal abilities. Soon we get shushed and hushed into quiet, and given lots of messages that our voices are unwanted, and that we need to raise our hands in order to be heard. All of that is overturned in liturgy, the place where God waits to hear us come alive in the song of all creation. In heaven, everyone's in the choir; why not start practicing now?

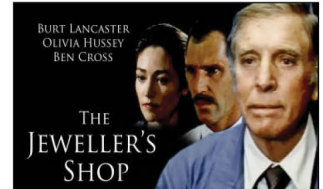

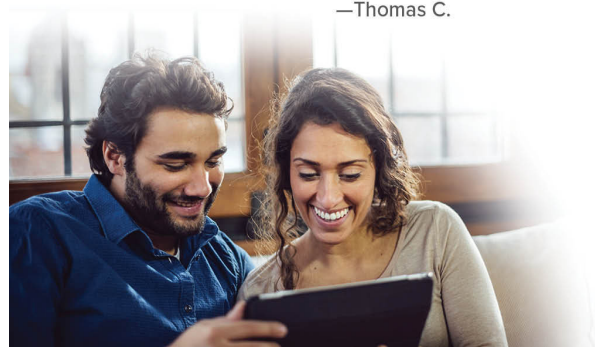

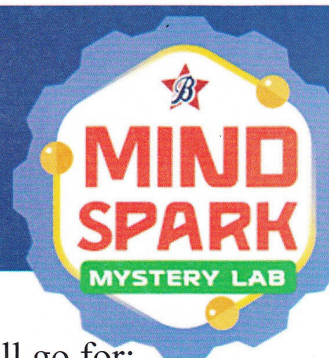
