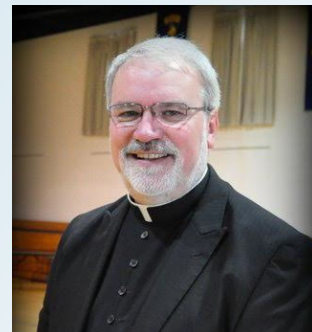

From the Pastor's Desk...

Next Sunday, October 18th, we join with the Church around the globe to celebrate World Mission Sunday. Last year, the Holy Father declared the entire month of October an Extraordinary Month of Mission, through which we recommit ourselves to the mission of God in recognition that our faith in Jesus Christ and our relationship with the People of God are missionary by nature. Our faith is a treasure to be given, shared and proclaimed.



This celebration also presents an opportunity to support the global network of missionary commitment, known as the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, through prayer — the soul of mission and charitable offerings from Christians throughout the world. The annual World Mission Sunday collection provides critical support to communities of faith in the most economically disadvantaged regions of our world. Working with limited means, these local churches bear witness to the Gospel amid poverty and turmoil, addressing all forms of material and spiritual need.

- Approximately 75 percent supports efforts of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith to help sustain over 1,000 mission dioceses in Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Pacific Islands.
- Nearly 10 percent supports the work of the Catholic Near East Welfare Association to alleviate poverty, foster Christian unity and promote interreligious dialogue in the Middle East, Northeast Africa, India and Eastern Europe.
- About 15 percent supports the operations of the Mission Office of the Archdiocese of Chicago, which builds bridges of love and support between global missionaries and members of the Church in Chicago.

Pope Francis has said that, “The Church is on mission in the world...Each of us is a mission to the world, for each of us is the fruit of God’s love.” Those serving in mission at the global peripheries, especially communities and individuals who follow the command to serve despite their own financial struggles, witness this message of service and self-sacrifice. By joining with them, we in turn bear witness to a message of love and compassion so needed in our world today.

Please be generous in your support of next weekend’s collection for World Mission Sunday and all the good works of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. We would normally be taking up a second collection to support World Mission Sunday. This year, however, due to COVID-19 and the many changes in our weekend Masses, there are no 2nd Collections or even 1st Collections taken up as you are asked to deposit your contributions in the basket as you check in at the registration table. For this reason, you can also drop your World Mission Sunday envelope in the basket as well. You can also mail it to or drop it off at the parish office. ADORATION of the BLESSED SACRAMENT

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament has resumed on Mondays from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. with Benediction beginning at 5:45 p.m. Those attending will be asked if this time period works best for them and will have the opportunity to suggest an alternative time period that might be better able to be attended. I am so grateful to our Adoration Team of parishioners for getting together recently to discuss how we could resume this beautiful devotion once again. Please be assured that we will be following all the same health and safety protocols that we do for our weekend Masses.



FIRST SATURDAY OF THE MONTH

Every first Saturday of the month ONLY, we will be offering an 8:30 a.m. Mass for those that wish to honor the 1st Saturday devotion that they were accustomed to. Again, Mass on Saturday mornings at 8:30 a.m. will only be on the 1st Saturday of every month unless it conflicts with a holiday or Holy Saturday when there is no morning Mass.

**SAINT TERESA OF JESUS (1515-1582)****October 15**

Let nothing disturb you; let nothing frighten you. Gifted with a passionate spirit, young Teresa dreamed of converting Muslims and becoming a martyr. *All things are passing; God never changes.* But her mother's death when Teresa was fourteen inspired lifelong devotion to Our Lady, and Teresa entered the Carmelites, Mary's order, despite her father's objections and her own fragile health. *Patience gains everything.* Initially, she enjoyed her lax convent's sociability and "busyness," but mystical prayer and John of the Cross's collaboration inspired her to reform the Carmelites. *Whoever has God, lacks nothing.* When her ideals encountered resistance and brought suffering, she maintained her peace—and humor. Discovered devouring leftovers, she told her mildly scandalized nuns, "When I fast, I fast! When I eat, I eat!" To nuns demanding less work and more prayer in the convent schedule, she retorted: "What we really need around here are fewer starry eyes and more strong arms!" *God alone is enough!* The italicized sentences here are her "Breviary Bookmark," the simple, profound prayer of Teresa, the first woman Doctor of the Church.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

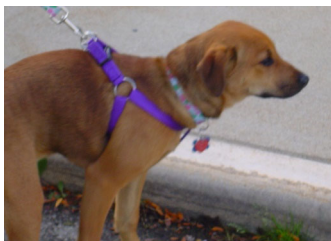
When the fathers of the Second Vatican Council met to discuss the sacrament of penance, they were required to draw up a new rite, including several forms. The hot button for debate was so-called "general absolution," by which a penitent could be absolved of sin without confessing to a priest. This was a difficult debate, compounded by widely varying traditions in both East and West. Some were surprised to learn that the Holy See had already given permission, during the First and Second World Wars, for this form. In 1944 the Vatican issued a decree saying this form was valid under extreme conditions, which bishops in mission lands and Latin America took as a kind of "blanket permission."

Thus, the fathers of the Council were alarmed to find this practice fairly widespread, not only in war, but in peaceful places with huge numbers of faithful and few priests. Although they eventually produced a ritual with three different forms, the forms are not considered equal, and the enriched and revised individual form is preferred. The enrichments include a welcome of the penitent, a sign of the cross with an encouragement to trust in God's compassion, new texts rich in the Word of God, praise for God's mercy, and a dismissal.

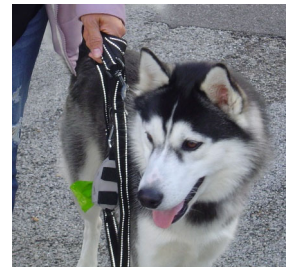
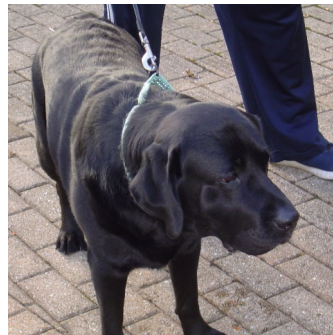
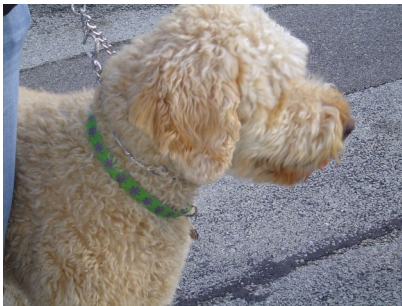
