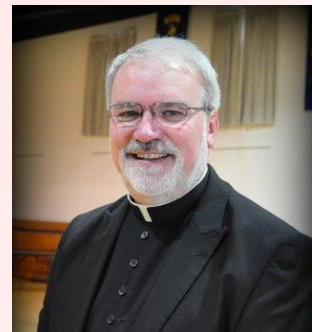

Today we celebrate World Mission Sunday. During this Extraordinary Mission Month let us remember the mission at the heart of our Christian faith – to share the Good News with the world! There would normally be a 2nd Collection taken up today for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith that helps support the priests, religious and lay leaders who embody Christ's mercy and presence among the most vulnerable communities in our world. They have been charged to proclaim the Word persistently; when it is convenient and inconvenient. Let us then, pray and offer our support for the Church's worldwide missionary efforts. Because there are no collections being taken up at Mass during these days of COVID-19 we ask that you offer your support of this worthy cause by either dropping your offering in the baskets at the registration tables when you enter church, by dropping them off at the rectory or by mailing them in to the parish office. Thanks so much for your support.



Just a reminder to all who may be watching our live-streamed Sunday Masses that the time has been changed from the former 9:30 a.m. Mass to the new 11:30 a.m. Mass. So, if you would like to celebrate Sunday Mass with your St. Eugene Community you can now do so at 11:30 a.m. every Sunday, "live," or any time after as a recording. Simply go to our parish website at www.st-eugene.org and click on [here](#) in the area that says St. Eugene Parish YouTube Channel. It's that simple.

Sunday, November 1st, is **All Saint's Day** – A Holy Day of Obligation. This means that all Catholics are obliged to attend Mass on this day. On this day we celebrate and honor those men and women of days gone by, that have led and modeled for us, exemplary lives of faithfulness and solid Christian living. Though the obligation to attend Mass has been lifted at this time for those concerned with contracting COVID-19, still, all are encouraged to return to Mass where safety protocols are being fully followed. **There will be three Masses offered for All Saint's Day - Saturday, October 31st, at 5:30 p.m. and on Sunday, November 1st at 9:00 a.m. and 11:30 a.m.**



On Monday, November 2nd, we will celebrate the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed with **ALL SOUL'S DAY**. Because this day falls on a Monday this year there will be one Mass celebrated at our usual 9:00 a.m. Mass time and an additional evening Mass celebrated at 7:00 p.m. to remember all those whose funerals were celebrated here at St. Eugene over the past year, in addition to all of your departed loved ones. All in our parish are invited and encouraged to attend this special evening Mass to honor and remember your deceased friends and family members.



Everyone is encouraged to sign-up for this evening Mass as we do for our Sunday Masses by going on-line to do so. If you are not able to, you can call the parish office to sign up as well. There will also be room for some walk-ins. This Mass will be a powerful expression of remembrance for those who have gone before us, not only in our parish community but within your own families as well. At this Mass the opportunity will be given to acknowledge your deceased loved ones by filling out the form on page 9 in today's bulletin.

In addition, if you would like to remember your deceased loved ones in a more permanent way, you may write their names in the spaces provided on the special All Soul's Day envelope that was included in your October/November Sunday envelope packet. The envelopes can be placed in the regular Sunday offering basket at the registration tables of church and can also be mailed in or brought to the parish office throughout the week. The names that you submit will then be published in our parish bulletin within one or two weeks after All Soul's Day (this is so we can gather all the names submitted that will come in late after All Soul's Day) and placed upon the altar during the month of November and throughout the next year.

We hope that this time of prayer together will renew our hope and heal our pain and grief. In the sharing of our grief, we believe that our grief is diminished. May our loving God continue to bless and comfort you as you mourn the loss and celebrate the memories of your loved ones.

I hope all in our parish are doing as best as you can in coping, navigating and addressing the challenges we are all facing as a result of the times we are living in. The one consolation in all of this is that we are all having to work through this together. May God's peace and strength help us all get through this.

IN GOD ALONE

Isaiah speaks to us today of Cyrus, King of Persia, anointed by the Lord. God calls Cyrus by name and leads him in service to the Israelites. In this passage we hear that it is the Lord who gives Cyrus his title, who arms him against his enemies, and who opens doors and unbars gates before him. And God does all of this so that the people will know that “I am the LORD,” and that “there is none besides me” (Isaiah 45:6).

Paul opens his letter with essentially the same notion—that in God alone we find our grace and peace. Paul also gives thanks to God on our behalf, calling to mind our work of faith, hope, and love. And in the familiar Gospel reading, Jesus tells the Pharisees to give to Caesar what is Caesar’s and to God what is God’s.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Sadly, one of the most difficult reforms of the Second Vatican Council for the Church to embrace has been one of the most thorough and beautiful: the sacrament of penance. Because it is individual and private, it has been difficult for the changes to take root. Sometimes a priest may be grounded in the earlier form, and at other times the penitent may resist the priest's attempt to blend in the proper texts and rituals. Perhaps because the new form is almost identical in structure to the old, it has been difficult to insititute. It may also be true that with the liturgy in English now, it is far more clear that the Eucharist, too, is a "sacrament of reconciliation."

It is certainly true that there are different skills and gifts in ministry, and experienced penitents know that not all priests are equally at ease in this sacramental encounter. Sometimes a difficult experience can drive people away from a liturgy that is spiritually rich and rewarding. Yet we know that one bad meal seldom puts people off restaurants forever: the dinner gong tends to dispel bad memories, and so we try again. Individual confession and absolution is for us both treasure and tradition. If you haven't been for a while, consider coming back to praise God for this gift of mercy.

SAINTS ISAAC JOGUES (1560-1646) AND JOHN DE BRÉBEUF (1593-1649) AND THEIR COMPANIONS - October 19

Their mission was to New France, but these missionaries found in present-day New York State and the province of Ontario a world wildly different from the homes they left behind. Six Jesuit priests, Fathers Isaac Jogues, John de Brébeuf, Anthony Daniel, Gabriel Lalemant, Charles Garnier, and Noël Chabanel—and Jesuit lay volunteers René Goupil and John LaLande—shared the gospel with the Native Americans they met, in languages they painstakingly learned, and through images they creatively adapted to the indigenous cultures (for example, John de Brébeuf's “'Twas in the Moon of Wintertime: the Huron Carol”). But their evangelization was caught up in turmoil beyond their control: a smallpox epidemic, battles between French and English trading interests—the traders united only by their willingness to exploit the Native Americans—and conflict among the tribes themselves, Huron, Mohawk, Iroquois. The missionaries' perseverance despite exhausting hardships, their steadfast courage in facing unspeakable tortures, and undaunted love even for those who martyred them, bore fruit, immediately in Kateri Tekakwitha's sanctity, eventually in the Catholicism that still flourishes in the United States and Canada.
