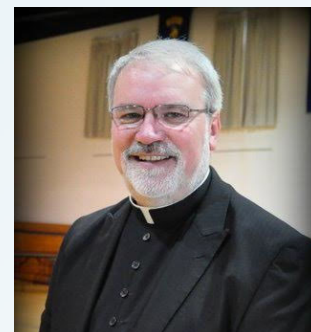

From the Pastor's Desk...



The major seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, Triduum, and Easter are now past, but about half the year remains for us to celebrate our redemption in Christ in a more general way.

Before we resume the counted Sundays of Ordinary Time, however, we devote this Sunday and next to celebrating two profound mysteries of our faith: The Most Holy Trinity and the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

A special feast in honor of the Most Holy Trinity began in monastic communities as early as the ninth century. By the fourteenth century, the whole Western church was observing it as it does today, on the Sunday after Pentecost.

Just a reminder that we will celebrate Corpus Christi Sunday next weekend. Before the reality of COVID-19 and social distancing, we would be celebrating Corpus Christi with a special Mass at 11:30 a.m., followed by a procession around the church, stopping at four altars, reciting prayers, singing hymns, and ending with Benediction in the church. Unfortunately, this will not be able to happen this year due to all the challenges safety restrictions require. Hopefully, next year things will be back to normal.

Many in our parish have been asking me why we are still asked to wear masks in church because they heard on the news that last weekend was the first weekend parishioners could go to church without the requirement of wearing a mask. Unfortunately, that report was misleading. Although the President lifted the mask mandate for double-vaccinated individuals, he also left it up to each individual institution to make their own decisions about mask wearing.

In response to the President's announcement, our Archdiocese has offered two proposals from which our parishes may choose. Basically, the first proposal comes down to allowing fully-vaccinated individuals to not have to wear a mask, while unvaccinated individuals will still be required to do so. This would involve the verification of each person's double vaccination. Unfortunately, we do not have the volunteers/personnel to do this in an expedient manner. The second proposal is to maintain our mask wearing requirement for all Mass and liturgy attendees until we reach Phase 5, which is anticipated in the next few weeks.

This past Tuesday, our Parish Council will have met to discuss these issues and decide which proposal our parish will be taking. Whichever we choose will go into effect on Monday, June 7th. It will be announced at all the Masses next weekend. So, we ask that all be patient for just one more week as we take these next steps to slowly, but surely, get back to normal. Aside from the mask issue, we will more than likely still have to

register, sanitize our hands and be seated as we have been doing. At least until we move into Phase 5, here in Illinois, and we receive the OK to change these health and safety procedures.

As always, thank you for your patience as our staff and volunteers work hard to make the celebration of Mass and our liturgies beautiful and safe as we continue to manage within important health guidelines.

Father's Day is only three weeks away. Here in our country we set aside this special day to remember and celebrate these special men in each of our lives who, with our mothers, have been instrumental in not only bringing each of us into this world, but have also helped to provide a loving home and a strong male role model that is much needed in today's society. We honor these men who have cared, nurtured, fed, and even sacrificed for us because of their deep paternal love for us.

Whether living or deceased, hopefully a prayer of thanksgiving will be said for your dad. If you might wish to have your father remembered in a special way at our Father's Day Mass, as well as having his name on our altar throughout the year, you can do so by writing in your father's name on the special Father's Day envelope provided in your packet this month. They can be dropped off in the basket at the registration table in church, placed in the mail slot in the front door of the rectory, or mailed in along with your contribution in the next few weeks and their names will be added to the memorial page(s) that will be included in our parish bulletin as well as placed on our altar for an entire year.

Everyone have a peaceful and blessed week.

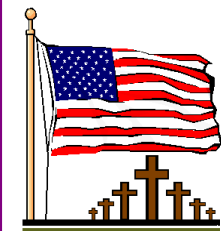

THE MYSTERY OF THE BLESSED TRINITY

The first reading from Deuteronomy emphasizes both God's awesome greatness and amazing nearness. It might seem beyond belief, but the God of all creation speaks to us, protects us, and guides us. The second reading from Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans describes how we are to relate to the three persons who are one God. We are led by the Spirit to meet God the Father as adopted children. Our adoption is such that we are even heirs with our brother, Christ, the second person of the Trinity, in whose sufferings we must also share. FEAST OF FAITH**Liturgy and the Holy Trinity**

The Trinity is the central mystery of our faith. We believe that God is one, yet three: total unity and rich diversity. God is not a monolith, but a dynamic community of persons, a perfect, loving harmony of three. And the liturgy is the work of the Trinity. We begin all our liturgical celebrations with the sign of the cross, a reminder of our Trinitarian baptism, and the simplest of all professions of our faith. We believe that God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and we gather in the name of this triune God. Throughout the Mass, we address our prayers to God the Father, through Christ our Lord, in the Spirit's power. And the Father hears our prayer, transforming bread and wine into the Body and Blood of his Son by the Holy Spirit. The Church is "the sacrament of trinitarian communion" (Sacramentum Caritatis, 16). It is the Trinity who holds us together as well. In the words of Saint Cyprian, we are "a people made one by the unity of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit" (quoted in Sacramentum Caritatis, 16).

ADDING NAMES TO THE PARISH SICK LIST

It has always been the goal of St. Eugene to offer our parish community an opportunity to pray for those parishioners who are ill and in need of our prayers. We have tried to keep close track of these names for our Bulletin as they are made available to us.

However, now we face an important privacy issue, very much like the issues faced by hospitals, health institutions, and certainly by other parishes.

We cannot (by law) publicly let our parish community know the health status of any of our members without their permission.

We appreciate the fact that often friends, neighbors, and acquaintances wish to do something special for a person who is ill, and ask to place their name on the list to be prayed for. While their intentions are surely good, we simply can no longer accept names in this manner.

Names for the sick list placed in the Bulletin have to be called in by the person who is ill, or by a member of their immediate family. At the time they call in the name, they will be asked whether they are the sick person him/herself, or a member of their family, and if they give permission for the name to be placed on the list. They will be asked for the **correct spelling** of the sick person's name. If a **family member**, they will be required to give **their** name for our records.

Thank you for your patience regarding this process. We wish to do all we can to offer our parish community the opportunity to offer prayers for those who are ill — but we must also be cognizant of the fact that all members of our congregation are entitled to their privacy in this regard.

ST. EUGENE FACILITY RESERVATION REQUEST FORM

One of the key ingredients of an effective parish is its people. The dedication and invested time of our volunteers is truly appreciated. Our collective efforts bring spiritual opportunities, social gatherings, athletic events, financial support for the parish, and just plain fun to our parish community. These activities require planning and reserving a location for these activities. In an effort to make the room reservation process more efficient, a new procedure will be put in place beginning June 1st. Reservations by parish and school groups/ministries can be made during the month of June. All outside groups can begin reservations July 1st.

This year, we are transitioning to an online calendar system to make room reservations more accessible. There are two ways to make your reservation, online or a printed yellow form as in years past. The yellow form and online form can be found on the parish website home page beginning June 1st in the section titled "St. Eugene Parish Facility Reservations 2021-2022" or at the rectory office. You only need to fill out an online form or yellow form, not both. Filled out yellow forms can be mailed or dropped off at the rectory during regular business hours to the attention of the Parish Scheduler. Online forms are simply submitted online and the Parish Scheduler will be notified of your submission. **Just because you submit the form, does not guarantee you will have that space during that time.** The primary contact person listed will receive the confirmation, if the event is able to be scheduled.

The 4 most important take-aways are:

1. Only a filled-out form (whether online or printed) can reserve a location. While verbal communication is informative, a filled-out form is necessary and required.
2. Kindly fill out the form completely: contact person's name, phone number and email; the actual time the function begins, etc. Incomplete forms will delay your reservation.
3. Please notify the rectory in the event of a cancellation, so the room can be made available to other groups/ministries.
4. Past reservations do not automatically renew for this year and submitting the form is not confirmation of your reservation.

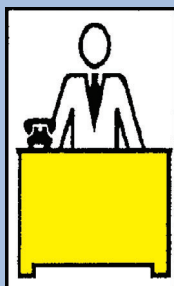
