FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...

Today we celebrate with Catholics and many other Christian churches throughout the world the Second Sunday of Advent and the beginning of the second week of a four-week season of preparation for Christmas. This season has always been a difficult and at the same time good one for many of us because it is constantly reminding us of the value and importance of patience and waiting. One of the biggest obstacles we face during Advent is that we do not like to wait. If we have to stand too long at the



checkout counter or if our popcorn takes too long to pop in the microwave or if we're still operating from a dial-up connection as opposed to having a digital line, we get frustrated and become impatient. Deep down we all know there is a value in waiting. It teaches us patience. More importantly it helps us to realize we are not in total control of our lives. As much as we would like to think that we are. This season reminds us that there are things in life worth waiting for. When we get good at waiting, we might even realize that waiting can be half the fun. It makes the event for which we have waited even more pleasurable.

We are so programmed in our society to jump from one season to the next without ever stopping to pause and reflect upon what we've just done or even been through. The Halloween decorations are put away and without a breath the Christmas decorations are put in their place. I've even heard Christmas songs on the radio for six weeks already. All of this frenzy of activity short circuits our spiritual preparations for Christmas. We jump from Thanksgiving to Christmas without a pause. Somehow, we must reclaim this holy season, and not just because this is what is expected of us. We need to do it for ourselves to give us some sacred space so that our season of Advent prepares us for a season of joy.

If you might be looking for ways to use the Season of Advent to seriously prepare for Christmas, then consider the following:

- keep the season at home with your own Advent wreath (we all need visual reminders to remain faithful to our ideals)
- make all of your Christmas preparation activities like shopping, baking, card writing, decorating etc., opportunities for prayer. You've heard the words of the song, "Whistle while you work", well try the same thing by praying while you work.
- make it a point to become more active and to participate more in daily or weekly mass, come to the Advent Communal Reconciliation Services that will be held here at St. Eugene on Tuesday evening, December 21st at 7:00 p.m. Confessions will be heard in English and in Polish
- take another look at your bible at home...read it!, especially the gospel of Luke this year. Pick up some good Catholic meditation books to help you make the most of the season.
- get more involved in other charitable activities.
- finally, don't get trapped into celebrating Christmas before Christmas arrives; this way Christmas won't already be over for you before it truly arrives.

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is celebrated on Wednesday, December 8th. This celebration of Mary, the Mother of Jesus Christ, being born without original sin is a holy day of obligation in our Church. For this reason, all Catholics should be attending Mass on this day. Our schedule of Masses on Wednesday, December 8th is: 6:30 a.m., 9:00 a.m., and 7:00 p.m. Please join us as we honor and celebrate Mary's Immaculate Conception.

Next weekend the 2nd Collection will be taken up for one of the worthiest causes of all – the retirement care of the thousands of men and women of religious communities who, for many generations, have been our teachers, mentors and caregivers in our schools and hospitals, as well as in a host of other care-giving institutions. Each year, Catholics throughout our country are asked to offer their support for these dedicated men and women who for most of their lives have worked for practically no salary and received little or no healthcare benefits. This annual Retirement Fund for Religious was begun some years ago by our bishops to help defray some of the escalating costs that were being incurred by religious communities trying to provide health care for their increasing numbers of aged members.

Many of us would not be who we are or where we are today, were it not for the care and persistence of the religious sisters, brothers and priests who were responsible for our spiritual and educational needs. This is our chance to say "thank you" for all that these dedicated men and women have given to us over the years. Please show your support and gratitude by your generosity in this year's Retirement Fund for Religious Collection being taken up next weekend. Envelopes were provided in your monthly packets or are available at the doors of church as well as in the vestibule. Thank you for your generosity in this most worthy of causes.

On behalf of Cardinal Cupich and myself, I want to thank all in our parish for the generous support and commitment you have made to this past year's Annual Catholic Appeal. Together you have enabled our parish to reach its goal of \$50,423.94. As Cardinal Cupich shared in a recent letter to me, this is a remarkable sign of your faith-filled commitment. He asked me to communicate his gratitude to the people of our parish and to encourage us all to pray for the renewal of this local church in the Archdiocese of Chicago, especially as we face challenges together but as we also continue to rely evermore deeply on the Lord who walks with us.

Please know of my gratitude as well.

We have once again purchased the "Little Blue Books" for you to use as another way of coming to appreciate the rich meaning and traditions of the Advent Season. Please be sure and take a copy home or to work with you. These books are back by popular demand and they make great companions for meditation and for interesting reading. They will be available at all masses until all are gone.

For the past few years, I have wanted to illumine the bushes and shrubs that surround our beautiful church building during the Advent and Christmas seasons. This year, we have finally been able to get this accomplished thanks to the assistance of our Knights of Columbus who have graciously volunteered their time to decorate the landscaping around the church with blue and white lights. I want to thank Steve Tomzik for coordinating this project as well his brother Knights for getting it done. I think you will be pleased with the warm and inviting new look around our church that you will see in the weeks ahead.

Have a great start to the season of Advent everyone!





### A DEEP CHANGE OF HEART

When John proclaimed a baptism of repentance, as today's Gospel relates, he called people to a deep change of heart. For John the Baptist, repentance was not simply regret for past failings, but a commitment to orient life around God's desires and purposes. What might living in alignment with God's desires look like? Our readings offer some clues. Baruch indicates that when mercy and justice are embraced like a royal garment, we may see the fruits of repentance. Paul notes how the Holy Spirit has been active within the church in Philippi, forming them to live in a loving and united community of faith, so they may witness to the love of God. And John himself suggests that a repentant heart clears a path for God to enter, leveling the mountains and valleys of our resistance, so that God might dwell within.



# SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Look around most Catholic churches, and you will discover an image of John the Baptist, often in the old baptistery, or in a window near where the font is or was located. He has two feast days in the calendar: one commemorating his birth, and the other his death. There are only three nativities in our calendar: for Jesus, for Mary, and for the Baptist. John's birthday is reckoned according to the schedule given in Luke's Gospel of the angel's announcement to Mary. The angel tells her that her cousin Elizabeth is in the sixth month of pregnancy, and so Mary hastens to help her. Reckoning Christmas as December 25, we count backwards nine months to March 25 for the Feast of the Annunciation. Then we count forward three months to June 24 for John the Baptist's birth. Halfway to Christmas, his nativity gives ample reason for rejoicing in the summer, and his symbols of fire and water are used playfully in bonfires and dives into the sea. Even at the polar opposite of Christmas in the calendar, the energy of Christ's birth in the Incarnation provides cause for rejoicing.


