As a follow-up to last week's Commitment Weekend for the Annual Catholic Appeal, I encourage and invite those who were unable to make a pledge last weekend, to do so this weekend or next.

Our focus for the past two weeks has been drawn from the theme of the Annual Catholic Appeal and the Word of God: "Making all things new...God's promise and our responsibility."

Paul re-affirms that promise of making all things new when he proclaims, "Death is swallowed up in victory" in today's second reading.

The sayings of Jesus that Luke collects and puts together in today's gospel passage point us to directions for living out our responsibility. We do so with discernment, with honest self-knowledge and with a cultivated good spirit.



The Annual Catholic Appeal not only invites us to offer financial support through our contributions but also to renew our sense of hope and responsibility, as we stand before God's promise to make all things new.

LENTEN GUIDELINES

It's hard to believe that in just a few days we will begin the season of Lent. The following are the main guidelines we as Catholics follow as we enter this holy season.



Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those bound by this may only take one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted, if necessary, to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid food between meals is not permitted.

The special Pascal fast and abstinence are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

By the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer the Church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. All the faithful and the catechumens should undertake the serious practice of these three traditions. Failure to observe individual days of penance is not considered serious, but failure to observe any penitential days at all or a substantial number of such days must be considered serious.

Stations of the Cross will be offered each Friday throughout Lent at 7:00 p.m. in church.

All in our parish are invited to join us in church for a special morning Mass as we honor St. Joseph on his feast day, Saturday, March 19th at 8:30 a.m.



With the start of the Lenten season this coming Wednesday, we are fortunate this year to have the return of our Knights-of-Columbus-sponsored Friday night Fish-Frys. This year, we will be back to normal regarding enjoying and eating your meal in the Shaunessy Center Gym. You can also order your meal(s) for pick-up/take-out.

I just wanted to put a little plug in for our Knights of Columbus who have worked so hard to pull this Fish-Fry together despite all the challenges they had to face in response to all the safety protocols of the current pandemic. For this reason, I ask all in our parish to affirm their efforts by coming out and ordering their usual options of pizza, pasta, shrimp and, of course, their delicious fried fish options to enjoy with family and/or friends.



All the information you need can be found in today's bulletin. The fish-frys will be held every Friday in Lent except for March 18th due to the need to set up the gym for the following day's St. Joseph Table. Please support the efforts of our Knights who do so much for so many. Thanks.







TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION - The Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The reign of God comes about because people commit to reversing their lives completely, to embracing new vision, new values. Many popular television shows exploit an unattractive side of human nature by pitting contestants against one another, even to the point of performing dangerous stunts or devious schemes, to gain money or favor.

At the liturgy, we counter that impulse by committing ourselves to live generously. In response to Christ's total gift, we offer bread and wine as the emblems of our lives, our hopes, our joys and sorrows. The bread and wine carried to the altar contain our lives, and by offering our lives to God, we prepare to receive the gift of God's own life. We are to become what we receive: the body of Christ.

On Sundays, this self-giving is often accompanied by a collection and procession of gifts for the poor and money for the upkeep of the parish. There are certainly other methods of collecting money, some perhaps more efficient. Yet the act of giving from our abundance, and attending to the needs of the poor, opens us up to participation in the changes the Reign of God requires.
