

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...

Today we celebrate Passion (Palm) Sunday. On this day we reflect upon the triumphal entrance of Jesus into the holy city of Jerusalem and the beginning of the horrible series of events that led Jesus to His being condemned to death and to His crucifixion on the cross.

As we embark upon this Holy Week, I encourage each of our parish members to truly make the effort to attend and participate in the Liturgies of the Sacred Triduum – Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Fortunately, this year we can celebrate these days in church.



As is usually the practice on Holy Thursday, the collection taken up this night is given to a needy and worthy cause. This year we will be sending our Holy Thursday contributions to Taller de Jose located at 2831 W. 24th Blvd. in Chicago. Taller de Jose is a Ministry of Accompaniment that offers companionship and personal attention to people who have difficulty finding their way in a complex social services system. They collaborate with services in the city, they listen to clients and then connect them with the resources they need. A Companero/a makes social services more accessible.

In 2005 Sr. Carol Crepeau and Sr. Kathy Brazda of the Congregation of St. Joseph and Rev. Robert Casey met in the Little Village neighborhood of Chicago to begin the CSJ tradition of discerning with the community (the dear neighbor) the most pressing needs.

In 2006 to connect people to services and services to people, an advisory board consisting of community members was established. It was made up of the staff of Our Lady of Tepeyac Parish and friends and associates of the Congregation of St. Joseph.

In 2007 after their co-founders and other stakeholders developed the concept of a ministry of accompaniment, Sr. Kathy was hired as the Executive Director and worked to build support for the ministry of accompaniment and lay a foundation for all that would follow.

In 2008 Taller de Jose opened its doors on Sept. 8th, with a staff of three Companeras. During this first year of operation, the formation of important community partnerships enabled the staff to accompany 150 individuals in their search for resources.

Today, Taller de Jose serves nearly 1,000 individuals each year in collaboration with over 100 partner organizations. They also participate in the collective impact work of community networks, including the Marshall Square Resource Network and others.

Ultimately, Taller de Jose accompanies individuals, serving as a bridge to connect them to health, legal and social services needed to achieve each individuals' goals. Please support their important mission by offering your financial contribution to Holy Thursday's collection.

Each year you have generously supported the work of the Church in the cradle of Christianity through the Good Friday Collection. The Holy Land Franciscan Friars are most grateful to you for your generous support. They could not perform and provide the missionary activity they do and preserve the "Christian Presence" in the Holy Land without the spiritual assistance and material support of people here in the United States. This year your help is especially needed. You already know from the many news reports, of the challenges and problems in the Middle East. Know that your contribution to the almsgiving collection on Good Friday is going to a good cause.

Your regular weekly offerings as well as the special collections above can all be sent into the rectory or dropped off in the rectory mailbox slot if you will not be attending church services. Your support during this challenging time is most appreciated, welcomed and much needed.

Our Parish Communal Lenten Reconciliation Service with individual confessions will take place here at St. Eugene this coming Tuesday, April 12th, at 7:00 p.m. Confessions will be heard in English and Polish. I invite you to join us in receiving the healing power of Jesus and the gift of God's grace in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please plan on joining your parish community on Tuesday, April 12th as you make your personal preparations for Holy Week and Easter. No confessions will be heard on Holy Saturday, April 16th.

All in our parish are invited to participate in The Way of the Cross through downtown Chicago on Good Friday, April 15th. Everyone is asked to gather at 8:30 a.m. at the Daley Center Plaza (Dearborn and Washington) and will conclude at Holy Name Cathedral around 11:30 a.m., stopping at the Veterans Memorial on the river walk, on Michigan Ave. in front of the Tribune Tower Plaza, and at the Water Tower Plaza. During the procession, we will follow the cross silently through the busy city, living the memory of the Passion of the Lord, with stops that include gospel readings, meditations, and choir music. This event is sponsored by the Lay Ecclesial Movement Communion and Liberation (CL), a lay Catholic movement present in over 70 countries, and in several cities throughout the United States. Everyone is welcome to join in the Way of the Cross.



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Later this week, the Chrism Mass is celebrated in every cathedral in the world in preparation for the Easter Triduum. Only a bishop can consecrate chrism, pure olive oil infused with rich fragrance, so this liturgy is a sign of the unity of the local Church and the bishop's ministry to all who will be baptized and confirmed in our parishes in the coming year. Chrism is also used in the ordination of priests and bishops and the consecration of new altars. Two other sacramental oils, the unscented olive oil for catechumens and for the sick, will be blessed in the same liturgy and transported carefully to every parish by the beginning of the Triduum.

Remember when Noah's dove returned with the sign of the world's rebirth? The dove carried an olive branch, a pledge that God was breathing the world to life again. Yet olives require human nurture. Olives are inedible unless they are cured by human labor. Olive trees grow on sunny slopes, away from the shade of city walls, so they can only be properly tended, cured, and laboriously pressed in peace time. The Chrism Mass with its olive oils expresses God's deepest desires for us, and our resolve to place our lives in service to God's saving, healing, loving plan.
