

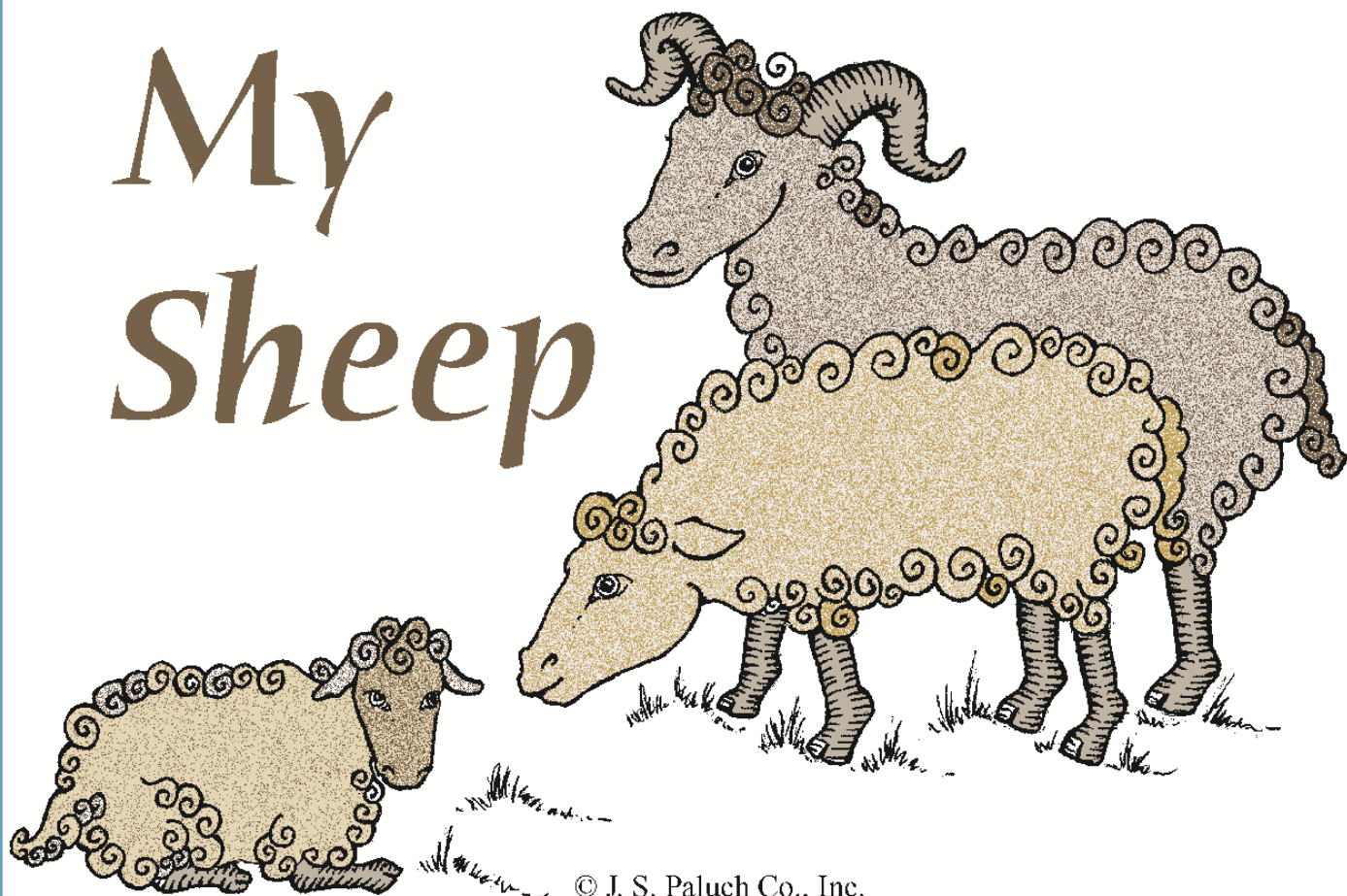

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...

The beginnings of the Church: disciples gathered around Jesus



All four gospels report that Jesus gathered disciples around him from the very beginning of his public ministry. These gathered disciples represent the earliest nucleus of what would become the Church. So, for example, the Gospel according to Mark offers this account in chapter three:

Jesus went up the mountain and called to him those whom he wanted, and they came to him. And he appointed twelve, whom he also named apostles, to be with him, and to be sent out to proclaim the message, and to have authority to cast out demons. So, he appointed the twelve: Simon (to whom he gave the name Peter); James son of Zebedee and John the brother of James (to whom he gave the name Boanerges, that is, Sons of Thunder); and Andrew, and Philip, and Bartholomew, and Matthew, and Thomas, and James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus, and Simon the Cananean, and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him. Mark 3:13-19

The text tells us some important things about this earliest community gathered around Jesus. The gathering of these disciples who will become apostles is a work of grace, that is, a sheer gift. They gather around Jesus, because he calls them. And he calls them simply because he wants them. It is nothing that they have earned, merited, or deserved. It is a pure gift that he calls "those whom he wanted." And it is by a like grace that we find ourselves in the community of disciples we call Church.

Mark says that Jesus "appointed twelve." The original Greek phrase actually reads, "...he makes the twelve." He creates or forms a community, the Twelve. That mirrors our own experience in the Church: The Lord brings us together to form a community not based on anything other than his call.

The purpose of this community is extraordinarily important and clearly focused: they are "to be with him and to be sent out." There is a paradox in this. It seems that it ought to be either "to be with him" or "to be sent out from him." In fact, it is both. The community of disciples stays in the company of Jesus, they learn from him, and they experience him first hand. At the same time, he sends them out in mission to carry his message and his healing reconciliation to the world beyond the community. Again, this echoes our experience of being part of the community of the Church. We are called to be in the company of Jesus, to share in his word and sacraments. We are also called to move beyond ourselves to bring him and his ministry into the world.

The passage from Mark then gives the names of the individual disciples and even their nicknames. This community is, indeed, a community but it is certainly not an anonymous crowd. People are known individually and by name. Although it may not always be the case with our experience of church, the ideal is that we too are not just part of a crowd but known and loved individually, just as we would know and love others. Then, we know that both together and individually we are called *and* sent.

Finally, the name of Judas Iscariot who betrayed him appears. His name signals the fragility of the individuals who belong to the community and of the community itself. The grace and the call come from the Lord, but they can only

take hold of those who are willing to respond. Again, we know that the Church embraces saints and sinners, those who are strong and those who are weak.

Question: Do I actually have a sense that we are Catholic, because we have been called to be in the company of Jesus? Do I have a sense of purpose that directs me to share Jesus with others in word and in action? Do I connect with others who have similarly been called by Jesus?

Today we celebrate the 3rd Sunday of Easter. Throughout the entire Easter Season the paschal candle stands next to the ambo in our sanctuary. This candle symbolizes the risen Christ who conquers sin and death and, for that reason, is lit during baptisms and at funerals as well.

Each year, a new paschal candle is prepared during the opening rites at the Easter Vigil. It is marked with a cross, an alpha and omega, and the numerals of the year. Five grains of incense, representing the wounds of Christ, are also embedded into the wax.

Mother's Day is only a week away. Here in our country, we set aside this special day to remember and celebrate these special women in each of our lives who, with our fathers, have been instrumental in not only bringing each of us into this world, but have also helped to provide loving homes that are much needed today. We honor these women who have cared, nurtured, fed, and even sacrificed for us because of their deep maternal love for us.



Whether living or deceased, hopefully a prayer of thanksgiving will be said for your mom. If you might wish to have your mother remembered in a special way at all our Mother's Day Masses, as well as having their name on our altar throughout the year, you can do so by writing in your mother's names on the special Mother's Day envelope provided in your May packet of your Sunday offering envelopes including also your Mass offerings for this purpose. They can be placed in the collection basket at church, mailed to or dropped off at the rectory and their names will be added to the memorial page that will be included in our parish bulletin as well as placed on our altar for an entire year. In addition, our living and deceased mothers will be remembered at all the Masses on Mother's Day.

Just to let everyone know, Fr. Greg Rom, our retired resident assistant, will be away from St. Eugene's for a month from May 5th thru June 6th. He will be the temporary administrator for Christ Our Savior Parish in South Holland during this period. The pastor there, Fr. Gosbert Rwezahura, will be going home to visit his family in Tanzania. This is only a one-month assignment as Fr. Gos and Fr. Greg are friends. So, if you don't see Fr. Greg during the month of May this is why. He'll be giving Fr. Gos a little respite to see his family. We will miss Fr. Greg while he is away.

Dear Fr, Yanos and Parishioners of St Eugene Parish,

Thank you for your generous donation of \$ 8,392.00 to St. Josephs UCC- Ukrainian Hero Fund (Fund Zakhystu Heroyiv).

The fund was established in 2014 to provide medical assistance and rehabilitative services in the U.S. for wounded Ukrainian Soldiers, support the front-line soldiers through our network of army chaplains, and to provide support to the wives and orphans of soldiers killed in the ongoing struggles in Eastern Ukraine.

In response to the current attack on Ukrainian cities and their citizens, this fund is currently providing urgently needed medical supplies, protective equipment, and equipment to assist in the search, rescue and transport of the wounded and displaced. This fund has NO administrative costs; all funds collected are used solely for the designated purpose of helping the soldiers, their families and innocent citizens of Ukraine.

Since the war in Ukraine began on Feb. 24, 2022 people such as yourself have been opening their hearts with prayer and financial assistance for those who have been wounded, killed, orphaned, terrorized and displaced as a result of the unprovoked attack. We are truly grateful for the outpouring of support during these extremely difficult times.

ST. EUGENE FACILITY RESERVATION REQUEST FORM

One of the key ingredients of an effective parish is its people. The dedication and invested time of our volunteers is truly appreciated. Our collective efforts bring spiritual opportunities, social gatherings, athletic events, financial support for the parish, and just plain fun to our parish community. These activities require planning and reserving a location for these activities. In an effort to make the room reservation process more efficient, a new procedure will be put into place beginning May 1st. Reservations by established parish and school groups/ministries can be made during the month of May. All outside groups can begin reservations June 1st.

Like last year, we are utilizing an online calendar system to make room reservations more accessible. There are two ways to make your reservation: online or a printed yellow form as in years past. The yellow form and online form can be found on the parish website home page beginning May 1st in the section titled "St. Eugene Parish Facility Reservations 2022-2023" or at the rectory office. You only need to fill out an online form or yellow form, not both. Completed yellow forms can be mailed or dropped off at the rectory during normal business hours, to the attention of the Parish Scheduler. Online forms are simply submitted online and the Parish Scheduler will be notified of your submission. **Just because you submit the form, does not guarantee you will have that space during that time.** The primary contact person listed will receive the confirmation, if the event is able to be scheduled.

The 4 most important take-aways are:

1. Only a filled-out form (whether online or printed) can reserve a location. While verbal communication is informative, a filled-out form is necessary and required.
2. Kindly fill out the form completely: contact person's name, phone number and email; the actual time the function begins, etc. Incomplete forms will delay your reservation.
3. Please notify the rectory in the event of a cancellation, so the room can be made available to other groups/ministries.
4. Past reservations do not automatically renew for this year and submitting the form is not confirmation of your reservation.

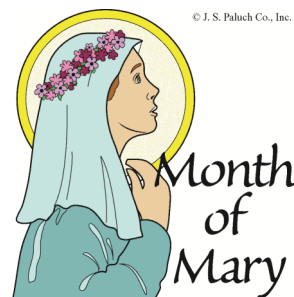

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION Third Sunday of Easter

The Gospel today sees Peter and his colleagues after the Resurrection, returning to Galilee and resuming the family business. They are fishing by night. Although it is true that fish feed by night, the mention of darkness here is more about the human spirit than it is about fishing advice. Modern life keeps darkness effectively under control; much of the world has been glowing radiantly through the night for a century. Yet just as surely as the Risen Christ breaks into Peter's fishing, so does he break into the usual patterns of our own darkness, electric lights notwithstanding. It is Easter, and we are the people of the light.

In our tradition, Evening Prayer, celebrated in monasteries, parishes, cathedrals, and homes everywhere, is a kind of solemn protest against the darkness and its claims, an act of praise for our light-bearing God, and a commitment to carrying that light forward. Sunset is a turning point of our day, felt less acutely in an electrified world, but still an effective reminder that one day darkness overtakes us all. Yet our Eastering has taught us in a hundred ways that the victory belongs to the Bearer of Light. Easter summons us to transform our everyday "blackouts," perhaps in a way as simple as a whispered prayer of thanks at evening for the blessings of the day.

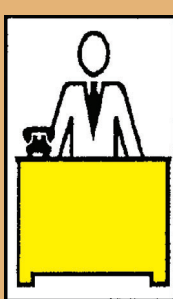
