



Today we celebrate the 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time and also the beginning of Catholic Schools Week.

As a Catholic parent, one of the most important decisions in your life and in the lives of your children, is that of choosing the education that will most benefit them. I ask you to consider the following reasons why a Catholic school would be right for your children. Catholic schools:

- have a proven record of academic excellence;
- work closely with you for the good of your children;
- continue the religious formation of your children begun in your home;
- · have clear and precise goals;
- provide a challenging and affirming atmosphere;
- maintain a secure learning environment;
- have educators who believe that all children can succeed.

Because we feel so strongly about the necessity, value, and benefits of a solid Catholic school primary education, we would like to see many more of the available seats in our grade school filled next year. Our school principal would like to speak with you regarding how you and we can make a solid full-time Catholic Education possible for your children.

We are now accepting enrollment applications for our St. Eugene School, Pre-school, and Pre-K.

If the possibility of a Catholic School education might be of interest to you...I strongly encourage you to give the school a call as soon as possible, as placement decisions are being made for students for the 2023-2024 School Year. This is a decision you will not be sorry you made. Enrolling your children in our school also helps to ensure our ability to provide a solid academic and faith-based presence for years to come.

Each year in our Archdiocese every parish participates in what is called the Annual Catholic Appeal. This pledge campaign is taken up in most every diocese in our country though it is often called by different names. I want to emphasize the importance of this annual appeal and thank all in our parish for helping to make this past year's campaign the success that it was.

The funds raised through this appeal are used specifically to maintain our diocesan pastoral center offices and the staff that serves all our diocesan parishes as well as providing the funding to keep parish churches and schools operating in areas of the city and suburbs that otherwise would have to shut their doors. Other areas funded by this Appeal include: Catholic Relief Services, Parish Vitality and Mission programs that support evangelization initiatives and liturgy enhancements, Catechetical and Faith Formation programs that support youth, young adult and religious education ministries, SPRED (Special Religious Education) in over 100 parishes, Respect Life Offices, Recruitment, Lay Formation through the education and formation of lay ministers as well as deacon and priest formation, Training of volunteer religious educators who work with children and adults among so many other faith development areas. The pledge procedure involves all parish members being asked to make a pledge. Every parish has also been given a required annual goal to achieve. This goal is based on 7% of the previous fiscal year's total ordinary operating revenue. For us at Queen of Peace Parish the amount this year that we are required to raise is \$89,127.00. (Note that it is larger than in the past since our total is based on our three parishes that have now become one). If contributions exceed this goal our parish will receive a rebate from those donated funds.

After much discussion, we feel that with the size of our registered membership and with the support of the goodness and generosity of our community of Queen of Peace we could more than pass this goal as you have so generously shown us in the past few years. The incentive for all in our parish to participate and do your part in helping us pass this goal is that Queen of Peace Parish will be able to keep 100% of every dollar we raise over our set goal. If there was ever a time that your parish could use these "extra" dollars, it would certainly be now. As your pastor I am sincerely asking and encouraging each of you to do your very best to support this Annual Catholic Appeal as you are able.

We are so hoping that you will help us achieve the goal of making this the most successful Annual Catholic Appeal ever. I want you to know that I have great faith in our community of Queen of Peace because I know of the love and dedication you have for your parish priests, past and present, and your parish and school community. We should also be aware that the Archdiocese generously gave \$50,000 to assist our parish and school for the 2020/21 school year. I ask you to respond through the direct mailing that has either already come or will soon come to your home, as many parishioners who have supported the Appeal in the past have already received. Just be sure to include the name of Queen of Peace on your pledge envelope so that our parish will receive credit for your contribution. Remember, if we surpass our goal of \$89,127.00 our parish will receive 100% of any amount that is raised over and above our required target.

All I can ask is that you do your best to help us reach our goal and I already know you will. Thank you for whatever you can do. May God bless you for your support and participation of this worthy Appeal that does so much for countless ministries in our Archdiocese not to mention our own needs, here at Queen of Peace, if we surpass our goal!

Friday, February 3rd is the Feast of St. Blaise. There will be individual blessing of throats at the 9:00 a.m. Mass this day. Legend tells us that Blaise was a doctor as well as a bishop. He was said to have healed a boy who was choking on a fish bone. Because of this event, Blaise has been and continues to be the patron saint of people who suffer from illnesses of the throat.

Traditionally on this day in many parishes' people have their throats blessed. The candles used in this blessing are sometimes blessed on Candlemas Day (the day before) and are tied in the shape of a cross and then touched to people's necks. This day falls in the middle of the "flu season" and is a good reminder that we need to visit the sick and pay extra attention to anyone who is prone to illness during the winter.

Because the Feast of St. Blaise falls on a weekday this year and not on a Saturday or Sunday we will not be doing individual blessing of throats at the weekend Masses of February 4/5, but there will be a general blessing of throats as the final blessing next weekend.

Important Information from the Parish Finance Office:

Charitable Contributions from Your Traditional IRA

If you are currently taking a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your Traditional IRA or if you are 72 ½ and must start taking an RMD this year, there is a way to save on your taxes AND help the Church at the same time.

Any money you receive from your RMD is, of course, taxable - <u>unless</u> you give it DIRECTLY to a recognized charity. This kind of charitable donation is called a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) and, as long as the IRS recognizes the recipient(s) as a bona fide charitable organization, it is not taxable to you. You can decide how much you wish to donate, to whom, and how much you wish to receive yourself; of course, the portion you receive is taxable income to you.

You could use a QCD for a general donation to our parish, to cover your Sunday offerings or a specific ministry of the parish. Or you could use it for your Annual Catholic Appeal contribution. It's up to you.

Begin by talking with your Financial Institution or Financial Advisor on the specifics of making a QCD donation. They will ask you for information concerning the amount and the name and address of the organization to which you want to donate; you may be asked to complete a form giving that information. Your financial institution will either mail a check directly to the charity or mail it to you for you to give to the charity. It's also possible to have the money transferred electronically.

That contributed money is NOT taxable to the donor as income, thus lessening the amount of your taxes. **However**, you (the donor) are not able to take that contribution as a charitable deduction on your taxes. People who have directly contributed to a charity such as a Church or other institutions known as bona fide charities have found that their taxes are lower than if they had received the RMD money and then given the amount to charity.

So, if you must take a Retired Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your Traditional IRA, please consider helping yourself and your church by giving a gift to your parish, Queen of Peace.







St. Blaise | February 3 Friday, February 3rd is the Feast of St. Blaise.

General blessing of throats: weekend Masses of February 4-5

You may be familiar with the annual "blessing of throats" that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Feb.3 we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

What is the difference between a "Saint" and a "Blessed"?

The process of proclaiming someone as a saint in the Catholic Church has evolved over the course of many centuries. In the beginning, those honored as saints were almost exclusively biblical figures or martyrs. However, after the legalization of Christianity in the fourth century, new holy women and men came to be honored as saints, and this was often done by popular acclaim or by the local bishop or abbot.

It was Pope Gregory IX (who was pope from 1227 to 1241) who officially proclaimed that only the pope had the authority to add someone to the official list (the "canon") of saints. This is the meaning of the word "canonization."

Today, the saint-making process includes several steps, including detailed studies of the person's life and a recognition that they died as a martyr or lived a life of "heroic virtue."

Once someone is recognized as a martyr or if a miracle is attributed to their intercession, they will be beatified and honored as "Blessed." This means that they can be celebrated by Catholics in a particular country or region or by the members of certain religious community. If another miracle occurs and is approved, then the "Blessed" is canonized and honored with the title "Saint," meaning that they are now officially recognized as a universal model of holiness and an intercessor.




