



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A young, engaged couple sat on the couch in front of me as we chatted about their upcoming marriage. The young lady was struggling to trust her future husband. She told me her father had been unfaithful to her mother. She said of her fiancé, "I want him to prove to me that he won't cheat on me." The young man looked at me helplessly, raised his eyebrows and shrugged his shoulders. What evidence could he possibly give to validate such a proof? Nothing. All he could do was invite her to trust him.

We all are wounded by experiences of imperfect love. We also are tempted to demand from God proof of His fidelity and goodness. We are like St. Thomas the Apostle who, on that second Sunday of Easter, demands proof of the Lord's resurrection. "Unless I see the mark of the nail ... I will not believe." Our science, technology and mathematics can indeed prove a great deal. But there are some things that require trusting another person. We prove promises of love only by trusting.

St. Thomas indeed saw the wounds of Jesus and believed. But there is an even greater blessing for us who simply trust Him — and all the truths the Church proclaims — because of the trustworthiness of the Risen One who speaks. This week let's trust Jesus without seeing him.





The Doors We Lock

As a child, and even for a while as a teenager, I experienced an enormous amount of anxiety whenever I went to confession. For so many years I feared it. For so many years I waited in the confession line trembling, feeling sick to my stomach.

In the upper room after Christ's Passion and death, the anxiety of the disciples was so strong that they locked themselves away. But still Christ found a way into their midst. He would not be prevented from bringing mercy and hope to a place shrouded in despair. No door barred in a moment of fear could keep him out.

This is the genius of the sacrament of Reconciliation — and of all sacraments, really. Here we are, restricted in so many ways by an existence that is woefully physical. We feel fear, and our body reacts, just as we feel anger and our body reacts.

How can God deliver mercy to us in this fleshbound state? Through that very flesh which can feel so confining. Through confession, which requires a physical action, and the physical participation not just of the penitent but of the priest.

I don't know how or why my anxiety around the sacrament has lessened over the years. Sometimes, I still feel it come roaring back unexpectedly, and maybe one day it will come back to stay. It doesn't surprise me: after all, I am in the flesh, and I will, as Peter says today, "suffer through various trials." But in all of them Christ will find me. He will not be kept away.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Do children need to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before their First Communion?

Answer:

For centuries the Catholic Church has taught that a person needs to be in a state of grace (free from mortal sins) in order to worthily receive the Eucharist. To that end, Catholics should make an effort to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation any time they recognize the need for the sacrament (and in keeping with the precept of the Church that asks that we celebrate this sacrament at least once each year).

In the case of children preparing for their First Communion, the Code of Canon Law is very clear that they should also celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation before receiving the Eucharist for the first time: "It is the responsibility, in the first place, of parents and those who take the place of parents as well as of the pastor to see that children who have reached the use of reason are correctly prepared and are nourished by the divine food as early as possible, preceded by sacramental confession" (Canon 914).

While some might question the significance of the Sacrament of Reconciliation especially in the case of children who might not fully understand the reality of sin or the meaning of the sacrament itself - a child's "First Confession" can be a wonderful time for families to reflect together on the quality of their relationships, how they put their faith into practice, and, when it is possible, to celebrate the sacrament as a family. In the end, the celebration of these two sacraments marks important moments in the spiritual journeys of children and we hope their "First Confession" and "First Communion" help instill in them a love of the sacraments of the Church.

Sharing Our St. Joseph's Table

The tradition of a St. Joseph's Table is that any proceeds go to charity. While the money raised at the feast on March 18 will support charitable activities, there is always food left over. This year, we were able to share our abundance with our Sharing Parish, St. Eulalia.

The Quinn Center at St. Eulalia houses the many charitable activities for parishioners and the Maywood community at large. On Sunday, March 19, with the help of the Sparacino brothers, volunteers drove two car-loads of food to the Quinn Center. Some of the foods, like uncooked pasta and canned tomatoes and tomato sauce, will be used for future meals.

The rest of the food was used on Tuesday evening and Wednesday morning to feed participants in various activities. Pasta, salad, bread, tilapia, and two cakes were served up at their semi-monthly hot dinner on Tuesday night. As you can see in the pictures, it was a big hit! There were no leftovers! Upstairs at a Vaccination Clinic and a tutoring session, pizza was the treat of the day. And Wednesday morning, senior Bingo players feasted on a yummy frittata.

The Quinn Center is a busy place, and the staff program attendees are extremely grateful for the generosity of Queen of Peace Parish.

The Food Pantry was also busy. On Sunday, March 26, a grocery bagging session was held for their next food distribution on Tuesday, April 11. With Holy Week coming up and all activities in overdrive, the 10 adults and 6 children decided to get preparations under way early. In a little over an hour, they off-loaded, prepped, and filled 110 bags of groceries. Some of the groceries are donated, but a major portion is purchased with contributions from our parishioners. Our shoppers are expert at getting the most for your dollars. We really do depend on parishioner contributions; expenditures for a bagging session can range from \$500 to \$700. You can donate to the Food Pantry account by dropping off a check at the Rectory marked for the food pantry or just dropping a contribution in a plain envelope marked Quinn Center Food Pantry in with your weekly offering. It's really important that the envelope be marked for the Food Pantry. (Please note: financial contributions in the Sharing Parish envelope in our bimonthly packet of envelopes DO NOT go to the food pantry but to St. Eulalia/Sacred Heart parish for their parish needs. Contributions in the Social Concerns envelopes go for our parish's charitable activities – helping people with utility bills, money for food, emergency funds, etc.)




