From the desk of *Father Rich Yanos*

Today we celebrate the 3rd Sunday of Easter. Throughout the entire Easter Season, the paschal candle stands next to the ambo in our sanctuary. This candle symbolizes the risen Christ who conquers sin and death and, for that reason, is lit during baptisms and at funerals as well.

Each year, a new paschal candle is prepared during the opening rites at the Easter Vigil. It is marked with a cross, an alpha and omega, and the numerals of the year. Five grains of incense, representing the wounds of Christ, are also embedded into the wax.

It's that time of year when most priests and deacons in the Archdiocese celebrate their ordination anniversaries. Our Ordination Day anniversary, like a wedding anniversary, is a significant reminder to us of the commitment we made to serve you, our parish families. I ask that you keep all of us in your prayers, as you always hold a special place in ours. For those of you who may wish to know these dates and the anniversary years being celebrated, they are:

Mother's Day is only three weeks away. Here in our country, we set aside this special day to remember and celebrate these special women in each of our lives who, with our fathers, have been instrumental in not only bringing each of us into this world, but have also helped to provide loving homes that are much needed today. We honor these women who have cared, nurtured, fed, and even sacrificed for us because of their deep maternal love for us.

Whether living or deceased, hopefully a prayer of thanksgiving will be said for your mom. If you might wish to have your mother remembered in a special way at all our Mother's Day Masses, as well as having her name on our altar throughout the year, you can do so by writing in your mother's name(s) on the special Mother's Day envelope provided in your May packet of your Sunday offering envelopes including also your Mass offerings for this purpose. They can be placed in the collection basket at church, mailed to or dropped off at the rectory and their names will be added to the memorial page that will be included in our parish bulletin as well as placed on our altar for an entire year. In addition, our living and deceased mothers will be remembered at all the Masses on Mother's Day.

Just to let everyone know, Fr. Greg Rom, our retired resident assistant, will be away from St. Eugene's for a month from April 20th thru May 17th. He will be the temporary administrator for Christ Our Savior Parish in South Holland during this period. The pastor there, Fr. Gosbert Rwezahura, will be going home to visit his family in Tanzania. This is only a one-month assignment as Fr. Gos and Fr. Greg are friends. So, if you don't see Fr. Greg during the end of April thru mid May this is why. He'll be giving Fr. Gos a little respite to see his family. We will definitely miss Fr. Greg while he is away.

Finally, next weekend the Little Sisters of the Poor will be here. They will be speaking at all of our Masses at both St. Eugene and Our Lady, Mother of the Church to share with us about their vocation and to let us know about the phenomenal work and mission they are about.

The Little Sisters of the Poor provide asylum and care free of charge for men and women over sixty years old who lack the means and family to care for them. Although they are a Catholic religious order, their homes for the aged were and continue to be open to all regardless of religion, race, or ethnicity. Please be generous in your assistance to their compassionate work and ministry.


New Bible Group

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I always feel a little sad when someone begins to speak to me with the words, "Father, I know you're so busy, but ..." It happens a lot. And I get it. He or she is trying to be respectful of my time. But it saddens me because a priest makes Jesus present to people in a special way, and Jesus *always* has time for us. Don't we all feel at times that God just doesn't have time for us?

Nonsense. Just look at the stunning "Road to Emmaus" story we hear this week. It's the day Jesus rose from the dead. And the Risen One appears in disguise to two disciples. He walks with them, chats with them, and eventually eats with them. It could have been hours he spends with them — two unnamed persons — in the middle of nowhere. On the day he rose from the dead!

My friends, please take this to heart: The Risen Jesus is not too busy to spend time with you! He doesn't have "better things to do." You and I are members of this crucified and risen Body. He therefore has all the time in the world to be with us. So, I challenge you this week to approach him confidently in prayer and conversation. After all, being with you and me is the reason he rose from the dead.

“I Am Not Afraid — I Was Born to Do This.”

Have you ever felt like you weren't doing the work you should be doing?

We have all had jobs that leave us feeling unfulfilled. Bored. Dreading the next day. We may even experience a sensation of unfamiliarity, of being unable to recognize ourselves.

Most of us have also been lucky enough to have a job that we love — a vocation, a calling that makes us look in the mirror and think, *This is who I'm supposed to be. I recognize this person.*

For me, that work is the work of marriage and motherhood. The hours are terrible, the pay is even worse, and my coworkers are frequently disappointed in me — but it doesn't matter. When I look in the mirror every morning and see my tired, wrinkled face gazing back, choruses of “I said I don't want the BLUE SHIRT, MOMMY, ugh!” and “Honey, I've got an early meeting, I'm so sorry but I have to run,” ringing in the background, I think to myself: *I recognize this girl. She was born to do this.*

Christ's own disciples did not recognize him on the road to Emmaus. It wasn't until he took the bread and broke it that their eyes were opened, and they realized they had known it all along — “Were not our hearts burning within us?”

In that moment, Christ was doing the very work he was born to do, making the sacrifice.

I don't know what kind of vocation you are called to. I don't know what kind of work reveals your true self. But I hope that whatever work you are doing, you can look in the mirror and feel your heart burning within you.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

What are the requirements for being a confirmation sponsor?

Answer:

Although many dioceses have specific requirements for who can be a sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Code of Canon Law identifies certain requirements that are true for all dioceses and parishes. First, the sponsor should be chosen by the one to be confirmed (or, in some cases, by the parents or even the pastor). Second, a sponsor must be at least sixteen years old (unless the local bishop has chosen another age, or a special exception has been made). Third, the sponsor must be a Catholic who has been confirmed and who has already received the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Beyond this, they must lead “a life of faith in keeping with the function to be taken on.” Fourth, they can have no sort of canonical penalty or impediment. Finally, they cannot be either the father or mother of the one to be confirmed (See Canons 893, §1 and 874, §1).

In some cultures, it is customary for one of the confirmand's godparents to act as sponsor, although this is not required by Church law.

To learn about the requirements for your parish or diocese, you can consult your pastor or your parish or diocesan director of religious education or the diocese's office liturgy and worship.




