



From the desk of Father Rich Yanos



Our congratulations go out to all the boys and girls of our parish who have celebrated their First Communions this weekend. What wonderful days these are as we welcome our youngest members to the Lord's Table for the first time!

Talking to many of our 1st Communicants in the weeks before they received their First Communion, it was so moving to see and hear the enthusiasm with which they were approaching their First Communion Day. We often hear how children have a unique way of influencing their parents; this is always evident at this time of year, as many of our parents are brought back to the practice of their faith because of their children's reception of the sacraments. How powerful it is to hear a parent tell me that they've come back to Mass or Reconciliation because they've realized how important it is to model their faith now for their young son or daughter. How true this is!

If only each of us realized the impact this role of modeling our faith has on our children. When your children see that on Saturday night or Sunday morning – no matter what – God comes first before any other activity, and you affirm this by giving priority to God and coming to church through your participation at Mass, there is no doubt that what you are teaching them will leave a deep impression and that they will take this example with them into their adulthood. This is truly when parents have fulfilled their promises that were made at their children's baptisms to raise them to the best of their ability in the ways of our faith. To you who are taking this commitment seriously, our deepest gratitude and support.

I would also like to express a sincere "thank you" to Mrs. Margaret Kinel, school principal and Director of Religious Education, and Mrs. Kristy Michel, our 2nd Grade teacher and catechist, as well as all our dedicated Religious Education teacher/catechists who helped make this year's First Communion Mass the true celebration it was.

Forty years ago today, May 7th, I, along with thirteen of my seminary classmates laid prostrate on the floor of the main chapel at St. Mary of the Lake Seminary in Mundelein. We stood before God, our families, relatives, and friends and knelt before Cardinal Joseph Bernardin as we pledged our obedience to him and his successors on our Ordination Day. As I recall it was a very rainy and miserable day. Because of the rain, we were unable to offer the first blessings that newly ordained priests traditionally offer to their family and friends and those that request them outside the main chapel at St. Mary of the Lake. We were directed to move inside to the classroom building to share these intimate and emotional moments. Our ordination class, the Class of 1983, was the first class to be ordained by Cardinal Joseph Bernardin, as Cardinal Cody had died the previous year. We were also one of the last classes to be ordained at St. Mary of the Lake where our diocesan ordinations have taken place since the early 1900's. Priesthood ordinations currently take place at Holy Name Cathedral.

Forty years seems, on the one hand, to be a long time, yet on the other hand, these years have flown by so quickly. It wasn't until I started to reminisce about all the experiences that I have had in the parishes I have served over those years that it really struck me and hit home that this anniversary really is a significant milestone for me and my classmates. As one of our parishioners recently said to me..." Father, anyone who does anything for forty years today is a big deal." I suppose this parishioner is right.

As I look back over these past forty years, I am filled with mixed emotions. I cannot say that these have been easy years. When I look back at particular moments and assignments and experiences, I sometimes wonder how or why I'm

still doing what I am doing today...as I'm sure many of you do as well. Over these past forty years we have lost half of our class. Some have married and have families; others are doing respectable work as professionals in a variety of service fields and one passed away not long after we were ordained. As I look back even further to my high school seminary days at Quigley North, I recall we began as freshman in 1971 with a class of eighty-three, we graduated as seniors in 1975 with sixty-three and of these numbers only one went on to be ordained to the priesthood. That "one" would be me. I am continually humbled by this reality because as I look back at all my classmates whose lives went in other directions, some of whom are close friends today, I can't help but think that any one of these passionate, talented, gifted, brilliant and caring men would have made excellent priests. I believe, though, that God has a plan for each of us. My hope is that we are all living up to and fulfilling whatever that plan may be for us.

As I look back over these past forty years I am filled with mixed emotions, I also do so with feelings of great contentment, joy, satisfaction, and gratitude. I can honestly say I have never been happier, never felt a greater sense of accomplishment than I do today, never felt more blessed by and with the friends that have walked these past years with me, never been more grateful for the faith that is expressed, felt and lived in the parishioners that have truly been inspirations to me and the motivation to continue living the commitment I made forty years ago.

I am convinced that good friends (priests and lay), that have both affirmed and challenged me over these years, are the reason that I have been able to maintain a healthier outlook on life, to realize that you need a sense of humor to get through some of life's most difficult and challenging moments and that our lives are truly a gift both in the here and now and even more so in the life yet to come.

Over the years, my brother priests here at Queen of Peace and I have preached on vocations. We have shared some of our own personal vocational stories. We encouraged all in our parish to pray for potential vocations to the priesthood and religious life. We asked all to consider recommending someone you personally know that has the gifts, potential, personality, and qualities of a potential candidate to the priesthood or religious life. If we don't invite others to these vocations by recognizing in them the gifts that they can offer to others in the service of God and His Church, how will they ever know that they have these gifts? How will we ever fill the void that is currently being created in our country regarding the diminishing numbers of priests, brothers, and sisters?

I ask you, then, to pray that young men and women today will hear the voice of God calling them to serve His Church and that they will have the courage to say "yes" to that sometimes-quiet voice in our world that is filled with many distracting noises. I also ask you to pray for me and my classmates as well as all your parish priests and deacons, that we may continue to be faithful to the call we received many years ago. I am forever grateful to you for sharing the gift of your faith with me over these past five years here at Queen of Peace. You continue to be the inspiration that spurs me on amid the many challenges that confront me daily. God bless you. I thank you all for the support and encouragement you, my family and friends, and the parishioners of all the parishes I have served, have given me over these past forty years.

P.S. This is also a significant Anniversary for Fr. Jacek Dada. It is his 30th! Please congratulate him for his years of service to the Church along with all your parish priests.

Next weekend we celebrate Mother's Day – a day when we in America remember and honor the special women who were instrumental in providing each of us with the life we enjoy, whether by birth, adoption or their "fostering" of us. We celebrate all these women who cared, nurtured, fed, loved, and even sacrificed for us because of their deep maternal love for us. So don't forget to remember your moms next week whether they are still with you here on earth or waiting for us in heaven.

Here in our country, we also set aside this special day to remember and celebrate these special women in each of our lives who, with our fathers, have been instrumental in not only bringing each of us into this world, but have also helped to provide loving homes that are much needed today.

Whether living or deceased, hopefully a prayer of thanksgiving will be said for your mom. If you might wish to have your mother remembered in a special way at all our Mother's Day Masses, as well as having their name on our altar throughout the year, you can do so by writing in your mother's names on the special Mother's Day envelope provided in your May packet of your Sunday offering envelopes also including your Mass offerings for this purpose. They can be placed in the collection basket or dropped off at the parish office and their names will be added to the memorial page that will be included in our parish bulletin as well as placed on the altar for an entire year.

Here in our archdiocese, we will also be asked to participate in the annual Mother's Day Catholic Charities parish collection. This is one effort our parish always responds so generously to. The reason being...your support of this worthwhile endeavor feeds the hungry, houses the homeless, cares for children, strengthens families and helps to keep seniors independent. Your support of this collection gets transformed into the compassion that Catholic Charities has become known for that protects the poor and gives the precious gift of a fulfilling and dignified life to those less fortunate than we. Please be generous and remember that as you drop your offering into the basket in next weekend's 2nd collection, you become the only source of hope to those who seem to not matter in the eyes of so many in our world.





Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

If you had to summarize the essential core of the Christian life, what would it be? Mercy, truth, or love, perhaps? The readings today suggest another word which may surprise you. That word is *priesthood*.

St. Peter says to us, "You are a 'chosen race, a royal priesthood..." To be part of a priesthood is to offer a particular sacrifice in order for the community to survive and thrive. Jesus is the great high priest because he offers the one perfect sacrifice which heals and perfects the entire human race. Peter the Apostle wants us to know that all the baptized share in this priestly ministry. The whole of our lives, including every detail, is meant to become our acceptable offering to God.

The baptized exercise this priesthood in many ways, I'll mention three. At Sunday Mass, in private prayer, and in daily work. At Mass, we offer the sacrifice of our lives with that of the priest, who symbolizes Christ the Priest. In our prayer, a "morning offering" prayer is a great way to offer up all the joys and sufferings of the day to come. In our daily work, we sacrifice our time, comfort, money, and energy to do good for others. All this gives the deepest possible meaning to our lives: we share in the priesthood which saves the world. That's at the core of our faith.

Divine Savior's Marian Shrine, Now known as the Queen of Peace Statue, Will be coming to a new location!

The Unification Committee has approved the relocation of the beautiful Marian Shrine, from the campus of Divine Savior, to Saint Eugene's Church. The shrine was erected by the parishioners in 1987, and was ironically named the Queen of Peace, the name of our new parish. It is fitting that she is moved to the new location.

The Queen of Peace is an 8' stainless steel sculpture weighing 1,200 pounds. The brick base that she sits on cannot be moved and will need to be reconstructed. 3G Construction has been hired to move the statue and replicate the base. The owners of 3G Construction are long-time active parishioners. The statue will be placed in a prominent place along Foster Ave.

We are asking for your financial support for the success of this project. Our goal is to raise \$30,000 which will cover the relocation cost, build a new base, beautify the landscape around the statue, and include lighting and benches.



May is National High Blood Pressure Education Month, recognized by the CDC and National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute to help raise awareness of hypertension.

Your heart health is important! By maintaining a healthy blood pressure (as dictated by your doctor), your heart isn't strained.

If you've been diagnosed with high blood pressure, or hypertension (B/P >130/80), you should monitor your blood pressure on a daily basis, usually around the time you take your medication.

Be certain to record your results and share with your doctor, who will adjust your medication accordingly.

The next Blood Pressure assessment after Mass is as follows:

May 13th 5:00 pm at St. Eugene location

May 14th 8:30 am and 11:30 am Masses at St. Eugene location

10:00 am Mass at Our Lady, Mother of the Church location

Please note: I will be suspending the B/P assessments at the churches during the summer months, June, July and August, resuming in September, dates to be determined.

Should you wish me to check your blood pressure because you have concerns, please call the rectory at St. Eugene's and we can arrange to meet to assess.

PS: I'm still looking for nurses to assist with B/P assessments after Masses.




