



From the desk of Father Rich Yanos

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we hear Jesus say just before his Ascension into heaven, "...you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, and to the ends of the earth." His Ascension into glory marks the beginning of our responsibility in the Church to continue his mission. And that is the hallmark of the Church's life—to teach and to do what Jesus taught and did.

Though it is hard to believe, we are almost one year into the Renew My Church process that has brought our three parishes of Divine Savior, St. Eugene, and Our Lady Mother of the Church together as the newly formed Queen of Peace Parish. When you think about all that has happened over this past year to get us to this point as well as all that is currently in the works it is mind boggling. I am so grateful to our Queen of Peace Unification Team who have been faithfully meeting monthly working diligently on the many projects that have helped us to get to where we are today. Looking back, this team is made up of five parishioners from each of our three parishes. Over the past year they have not only gotten to know each other better but we have come to appreciate the uniqueness of each of our parishes. We have worked together to solicit the input of all our parishioners that resulted in the new name for our parish — Queen of Peace. We have been working together on the creation of a new logo for our newly named parish that will be made public very soon. This will enable us to print new parish stationary, letterhead, and envelopes. We have a subcommittee working on the relocation of the Queen of Peace statue that was formerly located on the grounds of Divine Savior. This statue is being relocated to her new location here at St. Eugene.

I want to thank all those who are sending in their contributions for this project that is estimated to cost around \$30,000. \$20,000 of this total is the cost for the moving of the statue alone. The remaining amount will be needed to beautifully landscape and light the area around the statue. If there are enough funds, we are planning on installing some benches around the statue so that parishioners can spend some time praying, relaxing, and reflecting around the Queen of Peace. The new location for this statue will be along Foster Ave. so that all those driving by will be able to see it.


Over this past year I have worked with the former maintenance man of Divine Savior and his wife as they thoroughly cleaned out the convent, church, and former school of Divine Savior. This was all done in preparation for the sale of the Divine Savior property which has been in the works for the past many months. Hopefully soon we will have some news to share regarding this process. As you know the Village of Norridge currently owns the eastern portion of the Divine Savior campus (the soccer field). They would like to secure the entire property for their future planning.

Well before our parishes unified, much work on the part of the Archdiocese has gone into the evaluation of the condition of our parish properties and facilities. A year ago, I received a summary of estimated Repairs and Maintenance costs for both campuses of St. Eugene and Our Lady Mother of the Church. The focus of these estimated costs was water infiltration for both the church and school, masonry and lintel repairs/replacement, window replacement, roof repairs/replacement, plaster repairs, mechanical and electrical repairs, tuckpointing work and sitework across the campus. Most of this work is focused on the parish office/rectory that has been neglected for far too many decades when necessary and long overdue maintenance had been deferred for years as all our parish resources over those years were spent to maintain the operation of the school. Fortunately, the school now finds itself in a much healthier financial situation with the significant increase in enrollment over the past two years. For this reason, it is now time to address the issues of our deteriorating parish facilities. The estimate given me a year ago to address these issues was \$2,726,000 for St. Eugene's campus alone. With an additional substantial amount for Our Lady Mother of the Church's campus. I have asked the Archdiocese to assist me in getting some of these projects underway. Currently, masons, roofers, and window installers have been sent to offer estimates for some of these projects that we hope to get started this summer. I will keep our community aware of any progress in these areas.

I cannot begin to tell you know how challenging it has been over these past six months without a Business Manager/Operations Director. This was further complicated by a new payroll system that the Archdiocese implemented. As you can tell from all the wake and funeral announcements you hear at Mass every weekend, we have had almost 60 funerals since January 1st, and we are only five months into the year. Needless to say, we are being kept very busy. Somehow by the grace of God we are getting by.

I just wanted to give you all a little update regarding the many things we have been working on over the past 10 months. More information will be forthcoming. I thank everyone in our community of faith for your support, assistance, and cooperation as we work together to build this new reality that is still in its formative stages. May we continue to pray for one another as we look to a bright future together.

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Traditionally, the four writers of the Gospels are symbolized by four creatures that make their way into Church art and architecture: Matthew, an angel; Mark, a lion; Luke, an ox; and John, an eagle. These images can be found in churches across the world, a nod to those who recorded the stories of Jesus for us, thousands of years ago.

Today's Gospel was written by John. There are a few reasons why John is symbolized by an eagle, but my favorite explanation is that his writings soar like an eagle into the sky with their beautiful, poetic language. The prayer we hear today is no different — Jesus invokes God in a long discourse that might seem mystifying at times, the same way that a poem can be perplexing to understand when we are unfamiliar with the pacing or format.

Consider holding onto the shortest sentence in this prayer: "I pray for them."

Jesus prays for us. For me. For you.

Let that sink deep into your being.

Jesus is on your side. He is aware of what you are holding at this moment. He is aware of your pain, your faith, your mission. And He's rooting for you. This prayer was recorded thousands of years ago, far before you were born. Since before you were born, you were held in prayer. With that certainty, we live.

Divine Savior's Marian Shrine, Now known as the Queen of Peace Statue, Will be coming to a new location!

The Unification Committee has approved the relocation of the beautiful Marian Shrine, from the campus of Divine Savior, to Saint Eugene's Church. The shrine was erected by the parishioners in 1987, and was ironically named the Queen of Peace, the name of our new parish. It is fitting that she is moved to the new location.

The Queen of Peace is an 8' stainless steel sculpture weighing 1,200 pounds. The brick base that she sits on cannot be moved and will need to be reconstructed. 3G Construction has been hired to move the statue and replicate the base. The owners of 3G Construction are long-time active parishioners. The statue will be placed in a prominent place along Foster Ave.

We are asking for your financial support for the success of this project. Our goal is to raise \$30,000 which will cover the relocation cost, build a new base, beautify the landscape around the statue, and include lighting and benches.

The Living Rosary

One year ago, on May 22, 2022, the founder of the Living Rosary was beatified, Blessed Pauline Marie Jaricot. She also founded the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, which we contribute to every year on World Mission Sunday. In response to the Jubilee year in 1825, Blessed Pauline founded the Association of the Living Rosary. Members would each recite a decade of the Rosary daily. Ten years later, Blessed Pauline was sick, and went to Mugnano, Italy to pray before the relics of St. Philomena. Blessed Pauline was healed. Today we pray the Living Rosary for the triumph of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and in honor of its patron, St. Philomena. The next decade available is the Resurrection. To pray this decade daily, please contact the rectory office.




"If You Can Write a Recipe, You Can Write a Liturgy!"


