





hen Russia invaded Ukraine in February 2022, a humanitarian crisis began for Ukrainians, whose lives were shattered by the violence of war. Many left their homes in eastern cities in Ukraine for cities in the west, such as Lviv, farther from the most intense fighting. From the beginning of the war, the Holy Father pleaded for an end to the violence and expressed his love and concern for the Ukrainian people who were its victims. In solidarity with the victims of war, the papal almoner, Cardinal Konrad Krajewski, made two visits to Ukraine in March 2022. He first visited the cities of Rivne and Zhovka and other regions directly affected by the early conflict. He returned to Ukraine to celebrate Mass in the cathedral in Lviv and to deliver an ambulance donated by the Holy Father to the Center for Mother and Child Health to assist children displaced by the war.

The Holy Father's charitable outreach to victims of war, migrants and refugees, and the poor affected by illness and natural disasters is supported by contributions to the Peter's Pence Collection. When you participate in the collection, you join Catholics across the globe in supporting the pope's mission of mercy as well as the activities of the Holy See's dicasteries that assist his ministry.

Support for such papal efforts is rooted in the scriptural message to take care of the poor and expresses unity with

the Holy Father in two ways: through the ongoing activities of the Holy See and through the charitable works of the Holy Father on behalf of those most in need.

His trials were not over, however. The heretical sect of Gnosticism spread to Gaul. Gnostics proclaimed a secret, spiritual knowledge available only to a few. Irenaeus researched the Gnostic texts and exposed the falsehoods they taught, such as denying the divinity of Christ. His book Against Heresies is still being published today, over 1800 years after his death. May St. Irenaeus intercede for our own quests for greater understanding!



ST. IRENAEUS

Can you imagine sitting at the feast of the Apostles? St. Irenaeus was born in Asia Minor -- now Turkey -- and was tutored in Christianity by St. Polycarp, himself a disciple of St. John the Evangelist. Irenaeus caught the missionary zeal and became a priest sent to Gaul (modern day France). Following a persecution by the pagan Roman emperor Marcus Aurelius, Irenaeus replaced the martyred bishop in the region.



Divine Savior's Marian Shrine, Now known as the Queen of Peace Statue, Will be coming to a new location!

The Unification Committee has approved the relocation of the beautiful Marian Shrine, from the campus of Divine Savior, to Saint Eugene's Church. The shrine was erected by the parishioners in 1987, and was ironically named the Queen of Peace, the name of our new parish. It is fitting that she is moved to the new location.

The Queen of Peace is an 8' stainless steel sculpture weighing 1,200 pounds. The brick base that she sits on cannot be moved and will need to be reconstructed. 3G Construction has been hired to move the statue and replicate the base. The owners of 3G Construction are long-time active parishioners. The statue will be placed in a prominent place along Foster Ave.

We are asking for your financial support for the success of this project. Our goal is to raise \$30,000 which will cover the relocation cost, build a new base, beautify the landscape around the statue, and include lighting and benches.



Church Envelope

"In the end, that's all that matters. People were fed."

Those were the words of Quinn Center volunteer coordinator Martha Minnich after a busy, rainy grocery distribution on Tuesday, June 13.

For the past few months, we've been reporting on our parish's support of the Food Pantry at St. Eulalia's Quinn Center. Sometimes our support is planned in advance – the grocery bags prepared for the monthly drive-through distribution – and sometimes it's a little more serendipitous. After our St. Joseph's Table, we were able to share the leftovers with them; those leftovers fed attendees at three different Quinn Center events. After Fr. Yanos' 40th anniversary celebration, we were also able to take leftovers to the Quinn Center – trays of sandwiches, pizza bread, potato salad, and watermelon. The timing was perfect!

On Tuesday, June 13, those sandwiches were part of what went into the bagged suppers prepared for those coming to the grocery distribution. A total of 108 families (over 475 people) were fed that evening at the drive through.

If you recall, the weather that evening was not nice — chilly and rainy the whole time. Not only did people (and volunteers) turn out for the grocery distribution, people came for the vaccination clinic. Some of those people were Venezuelan refugees who walked to St. Eulalia from their temporary housing. They were early, cold, wet, and hungry. But God did provide. A small café called *Meal of the Day Cafe*, located in the Eisenhower Tower at First Avenue & the Eisenhower, had donated some extra catered food to the Quinn Center that afternoon. Even though it wasn't planned, the volunteer team used those contributions to pull together hot meals for this group of refugees. As you can imagine, they were most grateful.

If you'd be interested in participating in the grocery bagging or in volunteering on a Tuesday evening, please contact Jan Magnuson at <u>jan7744@comcast.net</u> or on her cell 312-806-7210. In the summer, bagging sessions happen on Monday afternoons, giving families their Sundays for summer fun. The next session is scheduled **for Monday**, **July 10 at 2:00 pm** for the July 11 grocery distribution.

You can also contribute to the purchasing of the groceries via Give Central or by putting an envelope marked for the St. Eulalia Food Pantry in the Sunday collection or dropping it off at the rectory. (Remember: the St. Eulalia envelope in your monthly packet is for the parish church and not the food pantry.)

Martha's right. In the end, that is all that matters – people are fed.



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was in middle school, there were times I didn't want my fellow students to see my parents drop me off or pick me up in the school parking lot. I was embarrassed of my parents. Why? I have no idea. Maybe it was our station wagon. Or I didn't want to look like a little kid. But in retrospect that was a silly thing to do. I was a kid. And I had two parents who loved me and had built a wonderful family. I was afraid of the other kids' judgment. How silly! I should have been afraid of forgetting or downplaying my family, which is where my identity had its deep roots.

This is a way to understand Jesus' words to his disciples this Sunday, when he says, "Don't be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna." Fear, in this sense, refers to where we find our deepest identity and our highest love. That's why Jesus says next that when we acknowledge him before others, he will acknowledge us before the Father. It doesn't mean we're brash or boastful. But rather we unhesitatingly and humbly embrace our identity as followers of Jesus and children of God the Father. After all, if we love who we are and where we come from, who cares what the other kids think about us?
