

From the desk of Father Rich Yanos

On behalf of our priests and secretarial staff I'd like to raise your awareness about a particular problem/ challenge that we have in our effort to serve you, our parish members. Several times during any given week we receive calls at the parish office from persons identifying themselves as parishioners. Some of these calls are from people we see at either daily or weekend Mass or even quite regularly at parish activities. Yet, when we need to contact you for whatever reason, and we go to our parish database we find out that your address or phone number are just not there because you have never formally registered, or this information has not been updated. We have a very comprehensive database that includes registered parishioners all the way back to our earliest days of record keeping. If you have registered with us hopefully your important contact information is in our database if it was provided when you registered. REMEMBER, all those who call Queen of Peace their "parish home" need to formally register by filling out and completing our registration form.

"But" you may ask, "How can I know for certain if I am registered? I don't remember." One definitive answer to this question is that every Queen of Peace registered parishioner is receiving their Sunday stewardship envelopes in the mail. They go out to our entire active database. If you are not receiving envelopes, your important registration information data is either not part of the parish database or you have been marked "inactive" due to your non-use of your Sunday envelopes. It is very important that those who worship with us or who choose to claim Queen of Peace (formerly St. Eugene, Divine Savior, and Our Lady Mother of the Church) as their parish affiliation, be registered. This is not just so we can send you envelopes. (Though, of course, this is one essential element of being faithful stewards for all Catholics.) We would like to have a complete census of everyone who regularly attends Queen of Peace, as we would like to be able to include you in our mailings about information and events that affect the entire parish community. Especially, now that we have merged our parishes. Having your name, address, phone number and email address in our database also enables us to contact you when we find your personal items left in church, when you are sick or in the hospital, etc. so that we can follow up with a call or visit etc.

So, if you are not officially registered, please take a moment to either stop in the parish offices during the week or on Saturday during business hours. It would be wonderful to "officially" welcome you to our parish family. YOU ARE IMPORTANT TO US – and we really want to know who you are. Thank you for taking your relationship to your parish community seriously by handling this important task!


Our hope is to begin the introduction of receiving the Precious Blood of Christ at all our Masses as soon as we are able. We are in the process of seeking additional Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to enable us to have the extra stations that will be required to accomplish this goal. Though this has not been a regular practice here at St. Eugene Church it has been at Our Lady Mother of the Church. Many have expressed their desire to receive the Body and Blood of Christ at our Masses and I fully understand this desire.

Our plan is to begin slowly, starting with two cup stations at each of our Masses. These stations will be located off the front center aisle and on either side of the host ministers at St. Eugene Church and off the main aisle on either side of the host ministers at Our Lady Mother of the Church. As a reminder, the fullest sign of the Eucharistic Banquet is to both eat and drink. With this in mind I am fully aware, however, of the hesitancy of many to receive from the cup especially since the recent COVID pandemic. So, we will move slowly and patiently.

We are still in need of more ministers for us to have the numbers we will need to provide this opportunity for everyone who might wish to partake of receiving from the cup. This will require 8 extra ministers in addition to the 18 who already assist each weekend at our two churches. As you can see that is 26 Ministers each weekend. To be scheduled once every three weeks or so we would need a minimum of 78 EM's. If you would like to see us provide this opportunity sooner than later, please consider signing up to be a Minister of Holy Communion by filling out the form in the bulletin so that we can begin the training process for you. If you attend a particular Mass each weekend, please consider offering the gift of yourself in this beautiful and necessary ministry of service to our community of faith.

Hope you are all enjoying these warm summer days. Before we know it, school will be back in session and summer will be behind us. Have a great day!






Baptism in the Family of God seeks to provide you with an opportunity to encounter Jesus and his Church as you prepare for your child's baptism.

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Patience is rooted in Hope (an image of a bush filled with birds would be great)

Life, like the church, is often burdened with evil, smallness, and impurities. The Lord's parables give us a hope-filled perspective on all three.

Evil: in Jesus' parable about the good farmer whose enemy plants weeds at night, Jesus tells us that God is not the cause of evil but permits evil to exist with good out of his patient love. He will finally deal with it, but his love lets things stay messy for a time.

Smallness: It's funny that Jesus says his kingdom looks like ... wait for it ... a bush. What a letdown! Yet this little shrub still somehow has room for all the birds of the sky. The smallness of the Church, and even our own little lives, still provides plenty of room for all whom God sends.

Impurities: divisions and hypocrisies in the Church and our own hearts exasperate us. Recall that Jesus compares his kingdom to a lump of dough with impure leaven eating away at it and therefore making it expand. It's the secret of the Cross. Not how we'd prefer it. But finally, great news.

The field, the bush, the loaf: all three parables invite us to embrace a patience rooted in hope: one day the field will be weeded, the bush filled with birds, and the risen loaf leavenfree.

Divine Savior's Marian Shrine, Now known as the Queen of Peace Statue, Will be coming to a new location!

The Unification Committee has approved the relocation of the beautiful Marian Shrine, from the campus of Divine Savior, to Saint Eugene's Church. The shrine was erected by the parishioners in 1987, and was ironically named the Queen of Peace, the name of our new parish. It is fitting that she is moved to the new location.

The Queen of Peace is an 8' stainless steel sculpture weighing 1,200 pounds. The brick base that she sits on cannot be moved and will need to be reconstructed. 3G Construction has been hired to move the statue and replicate the base. The owners of 3G Construction are long-time active parishioners. The statue will be placed in a prominent place along Foster Ave.

We are asking for your financial support for the success of this project. Our goal is to raise \$30,000 which will cover the relocation cost, build a new base, beautify the landscape around the statue, and include lighting and benches.




