# From the desk of Father Rich Yanos



Dean Queen of Peace Parish Family,

Recently I received the results of the Disciple Maker Index Survey which everyone in our parish was invited to complete during the Lenten season earlier this year. Our next task is for the leadership of our parish to carefully analyze the results of this important survey. This will be one of many tools that will help us to plan for our future and form some of the decisions that will be made to help build up the Body of Christ that is our parish of Queen of Peace.

Thank you to the 160 of you who took the time to complete the DMI Survey either on-line or on paper. The survey asked for input on several aspects of faith and community life and how each one's personal faith journey was supported by the parish.

Some of the initial findings are listed below.

**Demographics:** Of the respondents, 71% were women, 53% were over the age of 65, 60% have been in the parish 20+ years.

# Some favorable indicators include:

81% attend Mass Weekly or more frequently.

91% believe in Jesus' moral teachings for one's own life as taught by the Church.

86% believe that the Church is critical in our relationship with God.

78% believe that we are a welcoming community.

80% would recommend our parish to others.

82% believe that our music program fosters spiritual growth.

# Some areas of opportunity for growth include the following:

Only 50% have confidence that the parish equips one to have conversations about one's faith with family and friends.

Only 54% believe that the parish is on the right track to fulfill our mission in the next five years.

Only 47% are comfortable sharing the story of Jesus with others.

Only 35% are comfortable sharing their own faith journey with others.


The results of this survey have shown that we have many strengths, but also many opportunities for growth and improvement. Over the next year our staff and newly forming Leadership Teams will not only be looking at the results of this survey in greater detail but will also be formulating a plan to tackle one to three of these opportunities for growth with the hopes of making some inroads into improving not only these numbers but the ultimate goal of building a more personal and comfortable relationship with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Again, with the support of lay leaders, staff and ministry leads, we will take our time in the coming months to prayerfully develop realistic, yet aspirational, actions for the future. Our work will certainly connect with the spiritual renewal effort underway across the Archdiocese with the Renew My Church process, while also attending to the unique opportunities for improvement and growth here at Queen of Peace.

In the meantime, I invite you to review these preliminary results, thus far. As always, my door is open if you would like to share ideas and suggestions with either me or any of the members of our Unification Committee.

Thanks again, to all those who assisted our parish and me by filling out the Disciple Maker Index Survey.

# The Rosary of the Seven Sorrows

September is the month of Our Lady of Sorrows, and the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows is Friday, September 15. There are different versions of the Rosary of the Seven Sorrows. One way to begin is with the Sign of the Cross, an introductory prayer, an Act of Contrition, three Hail Marys, and this short prayer, "Most Merciful Mother, remind us always about the Sorrows of your Son, Jesus." At each of the seven Swords of Sorrow, pray an Our Father, seven Hail Marys, and the Most Merciful Mother prayer. Our Lady of Kibeho taught the following introductory prayer to Marie-Claire Mukangango, who was later killed in the genocide in Rwanda, "My God, I offer you this Rosary for your glory, so I can honor your Holy Mother, the Blessed Virgin, so I can share and meditate upon her suffering. I humbly beg you to give me true repentance for all my sins. Give me wisdom and humility, so that I may receive all the indulgences contained in this prayer."

1<sup>st</sup> Sword of Sorrow – The Prophesy of Simeon

2<sup>nd</sup> Sword of Sorrow – The Flight into Egypt

3<sup>rd</sup> Sword of Sorrow – The Loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple

4<sup>th</sup> Sword of Sorrow – Mary Meets Jesus on the Way to Calvary

5<sup>th</sup> Sword of Sorrow – Mary Stands at the Foot of the Cross

6<sup>th</sup> Sword of Sorrow – Mary Receives the Body of Jesus

7<sup>th</sup> Sword of Sorrow – Mary Witnesses the Burial of Jesus



Our Lady of Kibeho taught the following concluding prayer to Marie-Claire, "Queen of Martyrs, your heart suffered so much. I beg you, by the merits of the tears you shed in these terrible and sorrowful times, to obtain for me and all the sinners of the world the grace of complete sincerity and repentance. Amen." Afterwards, say three times, "Mary, who was conceived without sin and who suffered for us, pray for us." End with the Sign of the Cross.

# Live The Liturgy Inspiration of the Week

Our personal relationship with Christ is important, yes — but thank God, that is not all there is to being a Christian. We depend upon the support, the encouragement, and even the correction of the rest of the Body of Christ.



# Queen of Peace Parish 2023-2024 Religious Education Program Provided at St. Eugene School

Dear Parents and Guardians,

On behalf of Queen of Peace Parish, we would like to invite you to register for the 2023-2024 Religious Education Program. Both of our programs rely not only on our Religious Education teachers, who are certified teachers and catechists but also on the parents assuming an active role in the faith formation of their children.

**Regular Program Classes - Grades 1-7:** Classes take place in a classroom setting with the overall work covered in class with the exception of the seventh grade students who complete additional papers and service hours in preparation of receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation in the fall of their eighth grade year.

Classes are held on Tuesdays beginning October 3rd and are held from 3:45-4:45 p.m.

Independent Study Program - Grades 1 - 7: This class is for parents who want their children to complete their grade-level chapter work at home and want to use their church attendance as their participation in religious education.

This program requires your child to attend at least fifteen of their weekly masses at Queen of Peace Parish at either St. Eugene Church or Our Lady Mother of the Church from September to April. These bulletins must be signed by the presiding priest of the mass. The set of all 15 bulletins is to be dropped off as a bundle at the school office by April 21.

In addition to getting their fifteen bulletins signed, students will complete 18 textbook chapters - including all questions on every page throughout each chapter, including the Chapter Reviews and Faith In Action pages. The Chapter Work can be scanned and emailed, or dropped off weekly at the school office at 7930 W. Foster Ave.

Seventh graders will complete a different textbook, additional papers, and service hours in preparation of receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation in the fall of their eighth grade year.

Book pick-up will be held on Wednesday, October 4th, from 3:00-4:00 p.m. in the school gym.

# **Nurses Notes:**

I'd like to share some information about the influenza virus and why it is important to get the flu vaccine.

It is recommended that persons ages 6 months and older should get the flu vaccine yearly to reduce the risk of influenza related illness, missed work or school, hospitalization or death.

Influenza is spread to others through the air from the infected persons respiratory droplets when talking, coughing or sneezing, or by touching a surface with these droplets and then touching the nose, mouth or eyes.

Anyone can get complications from influenza. The groups that are especially vulnerable include the older adults, those with health issues, pregnant women and their babies, and children under the age of 5 years.

Protection from the vaccine can vary depending on how well the vaccine matches the circulating flu virus, but it is still important to reduce your risk of flu and flu complications by getting vaccinated. The best time to get the vaccine is in late September or October as flu season lasts through the following April.

There are different types of flu vaccines available. The high dose vaccine is offered to individuals over the age of 65 years and for those whose immune system is compromised. Please talk to your health care provider if you have questions about what type of influenza vaccine you should receive or if you have concerns about the vaccine, including having a pBlessingsast severe allergic reaction or having a history of Guillain-Barre Syndrome.
