From the desk of Father Rich Yanos

Today, we celebrate the Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time.

This past Monday over 1500 parish leaders, school principals, deacons, associate pastors, and pastors gathered at the Rosemont Theatre in Rosemont. The reason for our coming together was for an Archdiocesan Day of Renewal. You might be asking.... What are we looking to renew? If you have been keeping up with the loud and clear message of Pope Francis over the past many years, he has been calling all in the Church to a renewal from within. We are being asked to embark upon the challenge of evangelization in the world in which we are living. We are being encouraged to bring the presence of Christ to all people. After all, it was Jesus himself who sent his disciples out into the world to proclaim the Gospel he modeled for us. This means that you and I are being called to a conversion of heart and are both being invited into this conversion as well as being encouraged to invite everyone into a new life in Jesus Christ.

For Catholics who for centuries have very much kept our faith to ourselves, this can seem very different, yet, when you think about it, our faith should be seen, felt, and perceived by all that we meet because our lives should be a reflection of what it is that we believe. For these reasons our churches in the Archdiocese of Chicago will be on a new mission of Evangelization as we strive to put our best feet forward in the process of Renewing our Church. As our parish embarks upon the next phase of the Renew My Church endeavor which is called "Building the New Reality" we will be tapping into the resources of the Parish Vitality Coordinator who has been assigned to our Vicariate. She will be offering her guidance, wisdom, and experience as we move forward. Her name is Samantha Polo. She will be speaking to our fifteen-member Unification Committee on October 10th. We anxiously look forward to what she has to say and for us to take this next leap of faith as we go about inviting others into a life with Christ and His Church.

Please keep us all in your prayers in the days ahead that will hopefully lead us to becoming a more faith-filled and vibrant body of believers. There will be much more to follow on this topic.

I would like to congratulate Fr. Greg Wojcik, our former associate pastor here at St. Eugene's, who was installed as the first pastor of the newly formed Saints Thomas Becket and Alphonsus Liguori Parish last Saturday night at St. Alphonsus Liguori Church in Prospect Heights, IL. It was a beautiful Mass and ceremony. As Fr. Greg takes on this new role as pastor, we offer him our prayers and support that he may be a compassionate, understanding, and faithful shepherd to his new community of faith. Our best wishes to him!

Many thanks to all those who came out with all their pets last Sunday afternoon as we honored the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi. As you might imagine there were quite a variety of dogs and cats among other animals. All of God's creatures were presented for their blessing for another year. I hope all had a good time as well as our feline, aviary, and canine friends.

If all goes as planned the sale and closing of the Divine Savior property and campus is scheduled for this coming week. As many of you are aware, several years ago the Village of Norridge purchased the east side of the Divine Savior property. (The soccer field area) The Village was also very much interested in securing the remainder of the property if it would ever become available, as they looked toward their future planning. Although this is a bittersweet reality especially for the former parishioners of Divine Savior, there must be a feeling of relief knowing that the grounds will continue to remain for community use. Let us pray that all goes well.

Finally, I would like to encourage everyone to come over to the Shaunessy Center after the morning Masses today (Sunday), from 7:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m., to enjoy a delicious pancake breakfast provided by our Knights of Columbus. 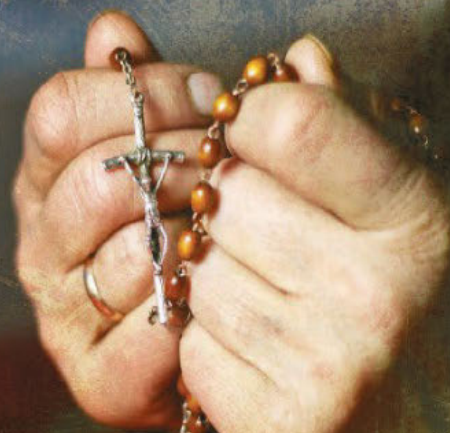

I hope that all will take advantage of dropping in to see what the group is about.

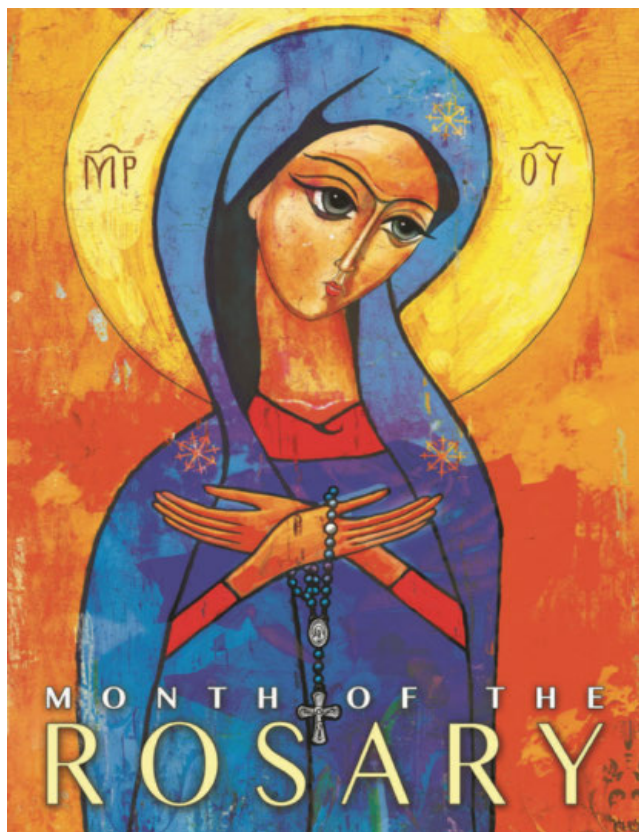
We meet every Wednesday in St. Eugene School room 110 from 10:00 to 12:00.

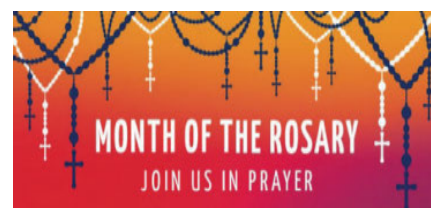

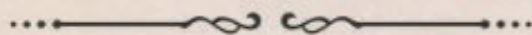

I'd like to share some information about the influenza virus and why it is important to get the flu vaccine.

It is recommended that persons ages 6 months and older should get the flu vaccine yearly to reduce the risk of influenza related illness, missed work or school, hospitalization or death.

Influenza is spread to others through the air from the infected persons respiratory droplets when talking, coughing or sneezing, or by touching a surface with these droplets and then touching the nose, mouth or eyes.

Anyone can get complications from influenza. The groups that are especially vulnerable include the older adults, those with health issues, pregnant women and their babies, and children under the age of 5 years.

Protection from the vaccine can vary depending on how well the vaccine matches the circulating flu virus, but it is still important to reduce your risk of flu and flu complications by getting vaccinated. The best time to get the vaccine is in late September or October as flu season lasts through the following April.

There are different types of flu vaccines available. The high dose vaccine is offered to individuals over the age of 65 years and for those whose immune system is compromised. Please talk to your health care provider if you have questions about what type of influenza vaccine you should receive or if you have concerns about the vaccine, including having a past severe allergic reaction or having a history of Guillain-Barre Syndrome.

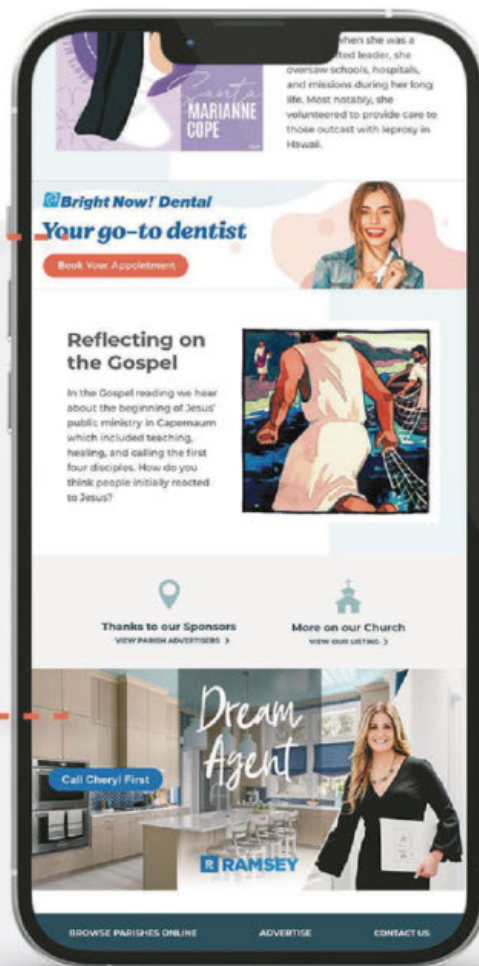

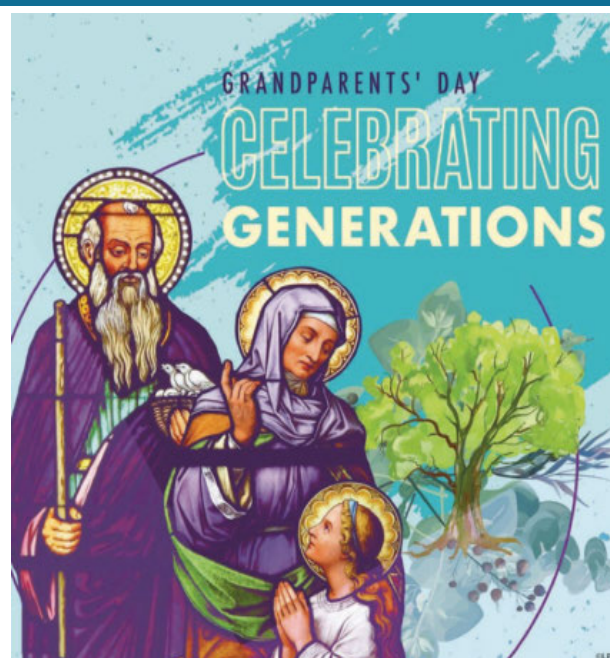
