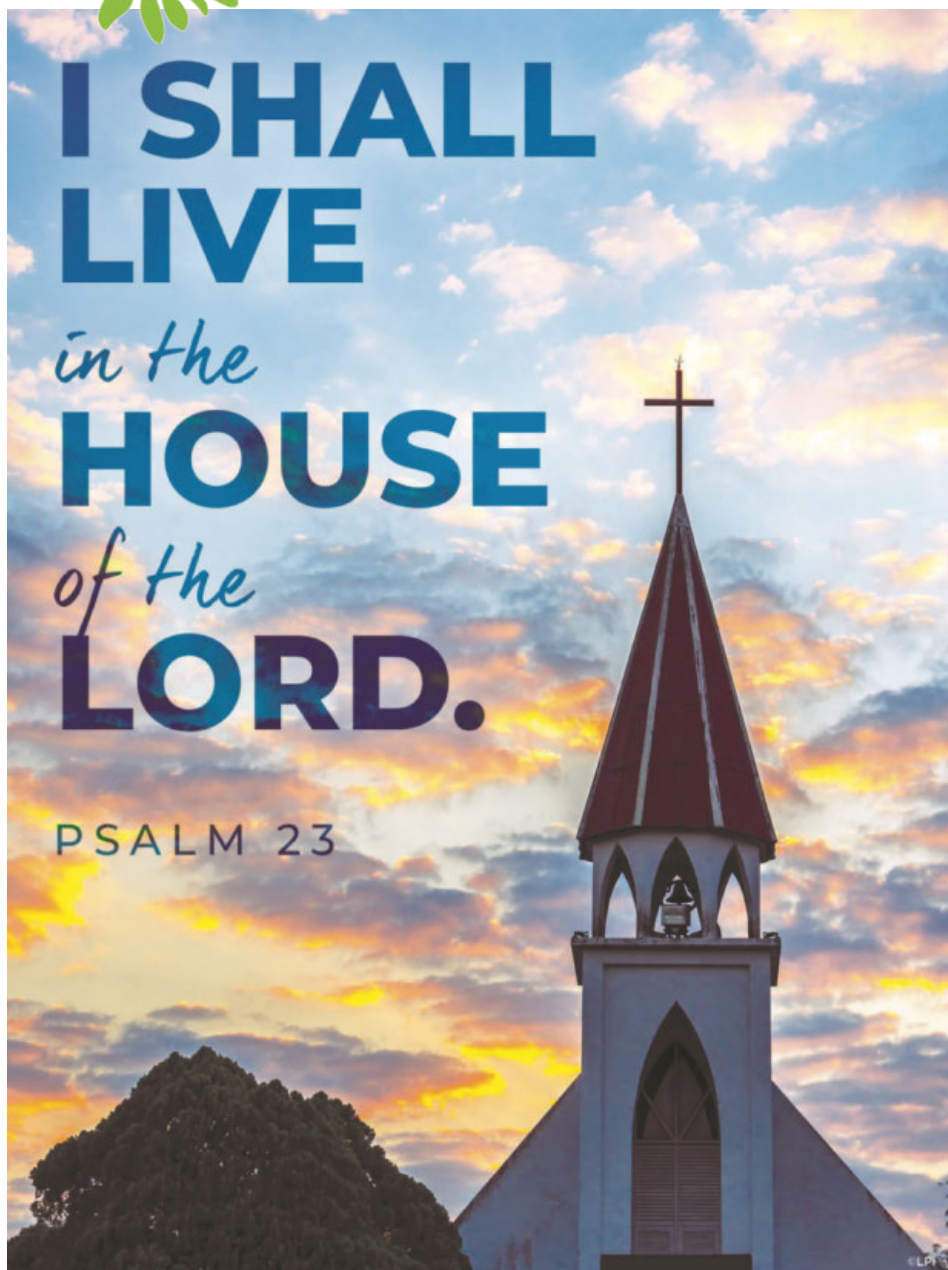

From the desk of Father Rich Yanos



"A young French woman, Pauline Jaricot, founded the Society for the Propagation of the Faith more than two hundred years ago in 1822. Although in poor health, she accepted God's inspiration to establish a network of prayer and collection for missionaries, so that the faithful could actively participate in the mission 'to the ends of the earth.'"

Overseen by Pope Francis, the Society for the Propagation of the Faith has an over 200-year history of solidarity. Today when you contribute to the World Mission Sunday collection, you make it possible for the Pope to provide support to:

- 844,000 catechists teaching the faith
- 258,540 Religious Sisters caring for children and families
- 38,140 seminarians preparing for the priesthood
- 26 million children in primary schools
- 12,000 clinics caring for the sick and dying
- 8,750 homes for orphaned children and the elderly



When it seems that so much divides us, World Mission Sunday rejoices in our unity as missionaries by our Baptism, as it offers each one of us an opportunity to support the life-giving presence of the Church among the poor and marginalized in more than 1,100 mission dioceses. If you are able, place a donation to support World Mission Sunday in the 2nd collection next weekend.

All Soul's Day, November 2nd, is the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. Queen of Peace Parish will have Shrines of Remembrance of our beloved dead at each worship site. At St. Eugene Church, the Shrine will be in the sanctuary. You are invited to bring pictures of your deceased loved ones and place them on the tables in the vestibule. For all pictures, please place a sticker or tag with your name, address, and phone number on the back of each picture. These pictures may be picked up the weekend of November 11-12.

The Bishops of the United States have expressed very well this social meaning of our concern about climate change, which goes beyond a merely ecological approach, because ‘our care for one another and our care for the earth are intimately bound together. Climate change is one of the principal challenges facing society and the global community. The effects of climate change are borne by the most vulnerable people, whether at home or around the world.’” USCCB, Global Climate Change Background, 2019. 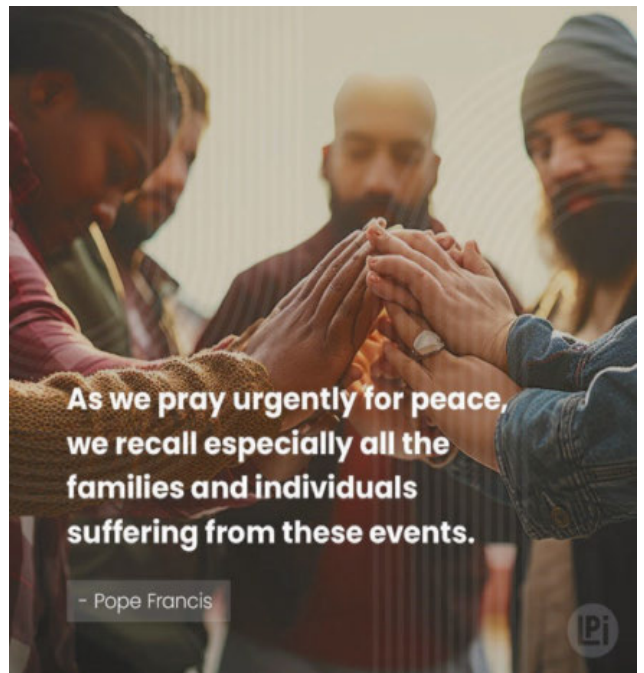

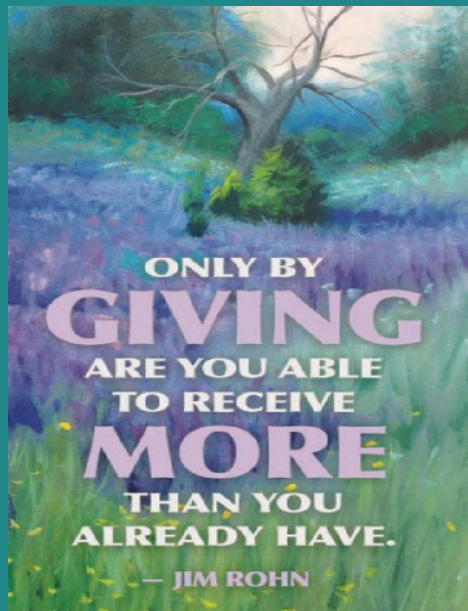

Our first practice will be on Wednesday, October 25th. Please enter through the westernmost door of the church by the music area.

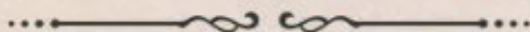

Pope Francis invites us to renew our zeal for evangelization by meditating on the story of the disciples on the way to Emmaus. He says, "Let us set out to make other hearts burn with the word of God, to open the eyes of others to Jesus in the Eucharist, and to invite everyone to walk together on the path of peace and salvation." All of us contribute to the missionary movement of the Church with our prayers and activities, material offerings and personal witness.

"Everyone has a right to receive the Gospel" (Evangelii Gaudium 14)

The **Pontifical Mission Societies** are a worldwide network within the Church that foster missionary cooperation on both the spiritual and material levels. We all have a responsibility to care for our brothers and sisters in mission areas and to support young local churches. The Societies have been pontifical since 1922, which means they are official instruments of the universal Church under the guidance of the Holy Father himself.

The **World Mission Sunday** collection contributes to the Pontifical Society of the Propagation of the Faith, enabling:

- Over 844,000 catechists to share the faith.
- 258,540 Religious Sisters to tend to families and children.
- 38,140 seminarians journeying towards the priesthood.
- Education for 26 million children.
- Medical assistance in 12,000 clinics.
- Comfort in 8,750 homes for the orphaned and elderly.

How to participate:

Pray: According to Pope Francis, prayer is the soul of mission! Ask the Holy Spirit to inspire you to go forth and witness to the Gospel in your daily life. Talk with Jesus about our brothers and sisters who struggle for dignity and freedom around the world. Listen for God's call in your life.

Sacrifice: Offer your time and energy to people and organizations who carry out the loving mission of Jesus at home or far away. Offer a financial gift in the World Mission Sunday collection to support training future priests and religious, empowering lay catechists, funding clinics for the sick and dying, and providing homes and education to vulnerable children.

What is World Mission Sunday?

Established in 1926, World Mission Sunday is an annual global celebration within the Catholic Church. This special day is observed in every local church around the world on the second to last Sunday in October.

How do we celebrate it?

We renew our own call to be missionary disciples of Jesus Christ and offer our support for the Church's missionary activity in the most remote and resource-limited areas of the world. The collection taken this day supports mission dioceses in Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands and parts of Latin America and Europe.

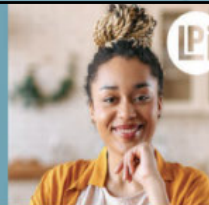

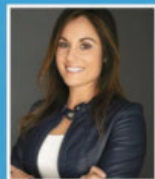

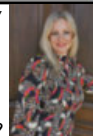
