

From the desk of Father Rich Yanos

Next weekend we are fortunate to have Kevin O'Gorman who will be speaking at Our Lady, Mother of the Church and Jose Torres who will be speaking at all the Masses at St. Eugene on behalf of the annual Campaign for Human Development Collection that will take place on the weekend of November 18-19. Both men are actively involved with CCHD and we welcome them.

Hopefully, you have all seen the completion of phase two of the Queen of Peace Prayer Garden project at the southwest corner of the St. Eugene Church building. Many have commented on how beautiful it looks with the new lighting and walkways. There are still benches that will be installed and a more complete and dramatic landscaping that will unfortunately have to wait until spring of next year because of the weather. Many thanks to all the donors who have helped us get this project completed.

Speaking of completion...the roofers and tuck pointers have been very busy trying to get the parish office building sealed up. Great progress has been made but all the recent rain has slowed things down a bit. They assure me that it will be done before winter. I'm keeping my fingers crossed. We are also in the process of ordering all new windows to replace all the aging, broken, and poorly insulated original windows. This project will also have to wait until spring/summer of next year. When all of this is done there should be a significant financial savings with our heating and cooling bills. The next projects on the docket for the parish offices are the replacement of the heating and cooling units, most of which are not working properly or at all. When these are done, we can begin to address all the interior damage to the ceilings and walls that has occurred over the past decades. When finished we should be in good shape for another 50 years!

Helping us to accomplish all this work has been a combination of our parish savings along with the proceeds of the now sold Divine Savior Campus to the Village of Norridge. The sale and closing of the Divine Savior campus took place on October 11th. As sad and as hard it is to close a church facility, I could not be happier that the Village of Norridge will be the new owner of this space. If you recall, they had already purchased the soccer field area in 2019. There has also been a very amicable relationship between Divine Savior and the Village that goes back many years. May this new space for the Village enable them to achieve their goals.

All in our parish along with their family/friends are invited to join us on our upcoming 12-day tour of Sweden and Norway, departing on August 6th thru August 17th, 2024. Whether you have ever been to Norway and Sweden before, no tour of these beautiful countries is ever the same. Sharing this experience

with your family, friends and/or fellow parishioners helps to make it that much more enjoyable as we always have so much to talk about and share at the end of each of our days of sightseeing and touring.

Be sure to see the promotional information about this exciting trip in the brochures that can be found in the kiosks of our churches gathering spaces. We will be having an informational meeting on Tuesday, November 14th at 7:00 p.m. in the parish hall at Our Lady Mother of the Church for anyone that might be interested in signing up or hearing more about the highlights of this trip that will outline all the places we will be visiting.

This trip will probably fill up quickly. (Our Italy trip filled up in one day) For anyone wanting to join us you can hold your spot by filling out and sending in the RSVP form contained in the trip brochure with your deposit. Brochures are available at either of our parish offices, in the vestibules of our churches or by request.

I know its early, but I just wanted to remind all in our parish community that our Saturday evening Mass time will be changing beginning on the first weekend of January which happens to be January 6th. The 5:00 p.m. Mass will be moving a half an hour earlier to 4:30 p.m. Confessions will also be moving a half an hour earlier from 4:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. Please make a note of this change, especially those that attend the Saturday evening Mass.

Finally, I ask all in our parish to pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Without Jesus, there is no salvation. Without the Church there is no moral compass for our lives. Without the priesthood there is no one to provide the Eucharist – Christ's gift to humanity.

You will find on a table in the gathering spaces of our two churches the picture cards of our seminarians preparing to embrace the vocation of the priesthood. On the back you will find a little biography of these men. Please take a copy and keep it with you as you offer your prayers for them on their journey to, hopefully, their ordination and their service to God's Church.



Living Rosary

People pray a decade of the Rosary each day, forming one complete 20-decade daily Rosary for the triumph of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and in honor of the patron of the Living Rosary, Saint Philomena. During the Blessed Virgin Mary's appearance to the three shepherd children at Fatima on July 13, 1917, she said, "Sacrifice yourselves for sinners and say many times, especially when you make some sacrifice, 'O Jesus, this is for love of Thee, for the conversion of sinners, and in reparation for the sins committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary." The Blessed Virgin Mary showed the three seers a vision of hell, and then said, "You saw hell where the souls of poor sinners go. To save them, God wishes to establish in the world devotion to my Immaculate Heart. If what I say to you is done, many souls will be saved and there will be peace." 

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Last Easter season a new convert to Catholicism at my parish asked me with a grave tone in her voice: "Why do we call priests 'father' if Jesus says, 'Call no man on earth your father, for you have one Father, who is in heaven'?" Thinking myself clever, I asked, "Do you think it's okay to call someone your 'teacher' or 'mister' or 'dad'?" She said, "Yes, I do." I responded, "Well, Jesus seems to forbid that, too. So, it's obviously hyperbole that he's using." She thought for a moment and declared, "Then I will stop using those words, too!" And she walked away. Not the outcome I was seeking.

We shouldn't be too hasty in dismissing this complaint voiced by many non-Catholics. The expression "father" for ordained priests is not honorary for the individual man. The priest's fatherhood doesn't begin or end in him at all. Rather, the title "father" indicates that he is a sacramental sign of God's Fatherhood revealed in Jesus. I can tell you, as a very unworthy bearer of that title, we should give and receive that title with some trepidation (because of God's awesomeness) and with a little sense of humor (because of the lowliness of the men with the title).

The longer I'm a priest, the more I'm comfortable with people not using the title "father" and just calling me "John." After all, only God is Father in the truest sense. At the same time, Jesus has brought the Father close to us, very close. We honor this closeness in some men with the title "father." Who are the priests in your life whom Christ has sent to you? How wonderful that Christ has surrounded us with humble signs of his Father's love. It's good to celebrate that love with gratitude for the priests in our lives. — Father John Muir
