



From the desk of Father Rich Yanos



The traditional name for the Third Sunday of Advent is Gaudete Sunday. The name comes from Gaudete in Domino semper, Latin for "Rejoice in the Lord always."

Because one of Advent's tasks is to prepare us for Christ's return at the end of time, this season once had a penitential quality like that of Lent. Gaudete Sunday with its rose vestments and relaxation of austerities softened the period that gave a glimpse of its fulfillment just as its counterpart, Laetare Sunday, does at the midpoint of Lent.

Viewed now as a season of devout and joyful expectation, Advent retains very little of its old penitential focus, but we still have the option of using the liturgical color of rose today as we rejoice that Christmas is near, and Christ's second coming is nearer than it was yesterday.



Our Parish Communal Advent Reconciliation Service will take place on Tuesday, December 19th, at 7:00 p.m. Confessions will be heard in both English and Polish. As you make your personal preparations for Christmas, I invite you to join us in receiving the healing power of Jesus and the gift of God's grace in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please plan on joining your parish community on December 19th. There will be many priests hearing confessions on this night as this will be the only parish Communal celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation in preparation for Christmas other than our regular Saturday afternoons at 4:00 p.m. However, there will be no confessions heard on Saturday, December 23rd. Please plan on joining us.



I just wanted to remind all in our parish community that our Saturday evening Mass time will be changing beginning on the first weekend of January which happens to be January 6th. (Only 3 weeks away) The 5:00 p.m. Mass will be moving a half an hour earlier to 4:30 p.m. Confessions will also be moving a half an hour earlier from 4:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. Please make a note of this change, especially those that attend the Saturday evening Mass.



As practicing Catholics, we all know that going to Mass every weekend is not an option but rather an obligation, something that faithful Catholics participate and share in. I prefer to see our gathering with each other around the Lord's Table each week as an opportunity to come together with our fellow believers to offer thanks and gratitude for all God has done for us as we are fed with both Word and Sacrament to go out into the world to put our faith into action. We do this because it is one of God's desires for us, one of His Commandments, namely -- to keep holy the Sabbath Day. God must have known something of the value of His creations setting time aside each week to give thanks and praise for all He has done for us. Sadly, today, many have seemed to have forgotten this desire of our loving God. As a priest I hear so many reasons/excuses why people "opt" out of attending Mass. Quite frankly, I have to admit many of them are a bit lame. A while back I remember reading an article that was titled, "Common Good Excuses". It addressed the many excuses that people use for not attending Sunday Mass and a response to them. I thought you might find the following helpful or at least thought provoking...

What's in it for me? Everything! God desires only and always your good. He became a man in large part to give us himself in the Mass. Why should you deny yourself such a gift?

I don't need to go to Mass to get close to God. At Mass, you receive God himself – Jesus Christ truly present in the sacrament. Even a beautiful mountain vista can't compare to that.

I had a bad experience with the Church. This is always sad. But many of us also had bad teachers – and we know the whole education system isn't bad. Jesus wants to bring you healing at Mass.

I don't get anything out of Mass. Don't expect it to be entertainment. Learn about what it does: joins us to Christ, separates us from sin, wipes away venial sins, commits us to the poor, and prepares us for heaven.

I don't have the time. There are 24 hours in a day, 168 hours in a week, Mass takes one hour. That's less than 1% of your week. You have the time; find it.

I'm a sinner. I don't deserve to be at Mass. Welcome to the club! We are a Church of saved sinners. None of us deserves to be here. See you at the confessional...



It's hard to believe that in a little over a week from now we will be celebrating the birth of our Lord at our Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Masses. I look forward to seeing all of you and your families at our many Masses over the next couple of weeks. Please note that our Christmas and New Year's Mass schedule are slightly different than regular weekends. Hopefully, by now, you have received my Christmas letter and our Christmas Season Mass Schedule. As you know some of our Masses during the holidays can be very crowded. If you are planning to attend these Masses, again, please try to get here a little earlier than usual to help ease the congestion. And remember...it's Christmas, so let's try and be nice even when that may be the last thing you're feeling when being delayed in the parking lot for a few extra minutes. \odot

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Why do we believe in Jesus and the Catholic Church? Why should we continue to do so? We've never seen him face-to-face (at least not most of us, I assume). Most of us have never had mystical visions of angels or saints. We live in the same world as our atheist and secularists friends. Why do we believe in Christ if we've never seen him?

The simple, symbolic answer the Gospel presents to us this week might surprise us: we believe because of John the Baptist. Early in John's Gospel we hear: "There was a man sent from God, his name was John. He came for testimony, to bear witness to the light, that all might believe through him." The Baptist powerfully announces Jesus. This is a historical fact, and it is also now a pattern at work in our lives.

John the Baptist stands for the entirety of the old covenant, everything entrusted to the Jewish people. And yet he prophetically opens the door to something entirely new in Jesus, to the revival and fulfillment of God's promises. In every generation, and in every human life, God continues to do this. He has done it through people named Augustine, Francis, Catherine, Theresa, and countless others. In my life, the Baptist's spirit has come through persons named Eric, Paul, Mary, and Ron. I challenge you to name at least three people through whom God has announced the coming of Jesus in your life. Consciously thank God for their testimony. And let's commit ourselves to listening to the spirit of John the Baptist testify again this week so that we might more strongly believe in the light.
