

From the desk of Father Rich Yanos

Today we celebrate the Third Sunday of Lent.

A covenant is a solemn agreement between two parties in which each promise something. The book of Exodus recounts how the Jews escaped from slavery in Egypt and made a covenant with God on Mount Sinai. The heart of that covenant is this: God promises to accept the Israelites as his people. On their part, they must promise to keep God's commandments.

In our second reading today, Paul writes to his Corinthian converts about the difficulty in preaching about a crucified savior. To Jewish people who looked for a powerful Messiah performing spectacular signs, it seemed unacceptable that the Messiah would suffer and die. To Gentiles, it seemed entirely absurd that someone who died such a humiliating death could be the savior of the world.

A message every adult should hear, because children are watching you and doing as you do, not as you say.

WHEN YOU THOUGHT I WASN'T LOOKING....

- ...I saw you hang my first painting on the refrigerator, and I wanted to paint another one.
- ...I saw you feed a stray cat, and I learned that it was good to be kind to animals.
- ...I saw you make my favorite cake for me, and I learned that the little things can be the special things in life.
- ...I heard you say a prayer, and I knew there is a God I could always talk to, and I learned to trust in God.
- ...I saw you make a meal and take it to a friend who was sick, and I learned that we all have to help take care of each other.
- ...I saw you give of your time and money to help people who had nothing, and I learned that those who have something should give to those who don't.
- ...I saw you take care of our house and everyone in it, and I learned we have to take care of what we are given.
- ...I saw how you handled your responsibilities, even when you didn't feel good, and I learned that I would have to be responsible when I grow up.
- ...I saw tears come from your eyes, and I learned that sometimes things hurt, but it's all right to cry.
- ...I saw that you cared, and I wanted to be everything that I could be.
- ...I learned most of life's lessons that I need to know to be a good and productive person when I grow up.
- ...I looked at you and wanted to say, "Thanks for all the things I saw when you thought I wasn't looking."

Some important news that effects all our parishioners... Although it has been over a year that our three parishes united under the new name of Queen of Peace, it was not until this past November that we were able to merge our three data bases. This meant that every parishioner now has a new envelope number. Our bank has asked us to remind our parishioners that all checks should now be made out to our new parish name: Queen of Peace. No longer should you be making checks out to St. Eugene, Our Lady, Mother of the Church or Divine Savior as very shortly our financial institution will not be accepting them. Thank you for your assistance in this matter.

I'd like to remind all in our Queen of Peace Community that our Parish Communal Lenten Reconciliation Service with individual confessions will take place here at St. Eugene on Tuesday, March 19th, at 7:00 p.m. I invite you to join us in receiving the healing power of Jesus and the gift of God's grace in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please plan on joining your parish community on Tuesday night, March 19th as you make your personal preparations for Holy Week and Easter.

Just a reminder that Stations of the Cross are prayed at St. Eugene Church every Friday throughout Lent at 7:00 p.m. On Good Friday, however, they will be celebrated at 3:00 p.m. at both Our Lady Mother of the Church and at St. Eugene Church simultaneously.

Our upcoming Scandinavian trip to Norway and Sweden is steadily filling up. For this reason, I'd like to invite and encourage anyone in our parish, along with your family and friends, who have never been to this part of the world or who have never experienced "group travel" to consider joining us. You'll not only be seeing and experiencing the scenery of two of the most beautiful countries, you'll also be sharing in this experience with a great group of people along with their pastor.



The Need Continues at St. Eulalia

The January grocery distribution at St. Eulalia's Quinn Center, albeit happening on the coldest day of the year, was "only" 60 bags of groceries, a major decrease from previous months. Maybe, we hoped, this was a sign of a downward trend?

Nope.

On Tuesday, February 13, 120 bags were distributed to families. That was the entire available inventory—60 bags left over from January and 60 more filled on February 11. (These are all non-perishables, so bags can be stockpiled and held over for the next month.) That means we will have to fill at least 120 bags at our next bagging session on Sunday, March 10.

Parishioners who have participated in the last few months have found it both fun and fulfilling. And it definitely reminds us of how blessed we are. (It's also an opportunity for service hours!)





Our Newest Saint

Maria Antonia of Saint Joseph, who is also called Mama Antula, was just canonized, and her feast day is Thursday, March 7. Saint Maria Antonia of Saint Joseph was born in Argentina in 1730, and consecrated herself to God when she was 15. She lived in a convent with other women, and assisted the Jesuits. But in 1767, King Charles III of Spain expelled the Jesuits. St. Maria Antonia of St. Joseph then traveled throughout Argentina and Uruguay, bringing the Ignatian spiritual exercises in ten-day retreats to more than 100,000 people. She spread the Gospel, raised alms for those who could not afford the retreats, and strengthened the faith of those whose faith had been lukewarm. St. Maria Antonia of St. Joseph died March 7, 1799, at the age of 69. Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I am the Lord your God ... You shall not have other gods beside me. -Ex 20:2--3

One of the greatest golfers of all time — if not the greatest — was Jack Nicklaus. Which is why it is baffling that at the beginning of each season he would return to his childhood coach and re-learn how to grip the golf club. It's like Shakespeare re-learning the alphabet and grammar. Why would he do that? Because Jack knew that the fundamentals are always relevant. Perfecting and obsessing over his grip allowed him to do everything else in the game well. In sports and life, the best ones love the basics.

Similarly, as we begin Lent, we re-learn the spiritual basics in the Ten Commandments. Consider the first, to "have no other gods besides me." This is our "grip." Is our connection to God one of absolute fidelity and exclusive worship? Am I willing to let go of my precious idols, the things I cling to instead of God? Once we say "yes" to this fundamental question of our spiritual "grip," then we are ready to properly engage with everything else in life. Watch how beautifully the game of life unfolds in the next nine commandments (numbered in parentheses): how we speak to God and others (2 and 8), how we organize our week (3), how we relate to our family (4) and the wider community (5 and 7), how we live our sexuality (6), and how we order all the other desires of the human heart (9 and 10). But don't rush to these later Commandments too soon! Everything in life is built on the first Commandment. The more we focus on worshiping God alone, the better we navigate the complexity of life with panache, effectiveness, and love.

Lenten challenge: This week, identify what you can do to better worship God alone. If you're not sure, scan the last nine commandments to identify what you are most likely to worship instead of God. Power, pleasure, control of your time, possessions, family, health, reputation, money? Commit to concrete action to help you let go of this "idol" to better hold on to God alone in faithful worship. Remember: the best love the basics.


Fr. Tolton Pilgrimage


