

FROM THE DESK OF FR. RICH

Today, we celebrate the Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Elisha, who lived about 800 years before Christ, was the successor of the great prophet Elijah. Naaman was a pagan army officer from Syria who came to Elisha, seeking a cure for his leprosy. We pick up the story at this point in the first reading.

Our second reading today continues from the second letter to Timothy. This letter was written about 30 years after Paul's death to a typical Church leader, as represented by Timothy. Today's passage begins with a summary of Paul's teachings about Christ, and concludes with what may be part of an ancient Christian hymn.

This weekend, our 8th grade students received the Sacrament of Confirmation. Receiving this sacrament completes their initiation as members of the faith community into the Church. We congratulate them and their families as they now make this transition from being initiated into our faith and church life to a deeper and fuller relationship with Christ and his Church. Our hope and our prayer as the faith community of Queen of Peace is that this celebration will be the beginning of a life-long venture of deepening, strengthening, and appreciating the relationship our Lord, Jesus Christ, wants with each of us as we are called to help build up the Body of Christ that is His Church. Congratulations and best wishes to all the Confirmands and their families!

Today's second collection will be taken up to assist all those whose lives have been ravaged by the conflict between Israel and Gaza. As a result of this horrible war going on there, so many innocent victims (including those who belong to Christian communities) are facing violence, dire living conditions, and hunger.

It saddens all of us to see the faces and the bodies of young children and adults suffering from malnutrition. In many ways, we can feel helpless in addressing and responding to this complex story that involves international players. But there is a way we can respond and help. Two very reliable agencies of the Catholic Church are already there providing vital emergency humanitarian relief and psychological care for the sick, malnourished, and wounded. They are the Catholic Near East Welfare Association (CNEWA) and Catholic Relief Services (CRS).

Please offer your support as best you can this weekend. Whatever you can give will go far to alleviate the suffering of our brothers and sisters in the Middle East.

For those who might be curious or interested in hearing about all the details of our upcoming trip to Poland, we will be having an informational Meeting that all are invited to attend this Tuesday night, October 14th, 2025, at 7:00 p.m. at Our Lady, Mother of the Church's Hayes Center.

Next weekend, we celebrate World Mission Sunday and our fundamental vocation to be, in the footsteps of Christ, messengers and builders of hope. This year's theme, Missionaries of Hope Among All Peoples, reminds us of the message of this Jubilee Year. Let us reflect on our common call, as the community of the baptized, to share the love of God with everyone. Your generous donations given in the World Mission Sunday Collection will support the efforts of countless missionaries in 1,124 areas where the church is young, poor, or persecuted. Let us build a communion of prayer and action.

Over the next two weekends, you will have the opportunity to meet our new Parish Pastoral Council members as they will be commissioned at various masses over these weekends. You will also find their pictures and a short biography about each of these dedicated men and women in the bulletins of October 19 and 26.

Finally, I would like to encourage everyone to come over to the Shaunessy Center after the morning Masses next Sunday, from 7:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m., to enjoy a delicious pancake breakfast provided by our Knights of Columbus. If you have never come to one of these breakfasts before, you are in for a real treat and quite a variety of items to choose from. Give it a try, you won't be sorry. Hope to see you there.



Hope That Does Not Disappoint (cf. Romans 5:5)

Our dear Pope Francis selected the theme inspired by the Jubilee Year: Missionaries of Hope Among All Peoples. He urged us to be like those missionaries who have travelled far to share the love of God in Christ: "May we too feel inspired to set out in the footsteps of the Lord Jesus to become, with him and in him, signs and messengers of hope for all, in every place and circumstance that God has granted us to live. May all the baptized, as missionary disciples of Christ, make his hope shine forth in every corner of the earth!"

Sent Forth from Chicago to the World

Earlier this year, we witnessed the election of Pope Leo XIV, a missionary pope originally from Chicago. In his first address to the world, he encouraged us to be a missionary Church by opening our arms to "all those in need of our charity, our presence, our readiness to dialogue and our love." He wants us to be guided by Holy Spirit and offer God's love to everyone.

Pope Leo XIV knows that missionary support is vital. Before being sent to the Vatican, he was bishop of the mission Diocese of Chiclayo, Peru. Today he is Holy Father to all peoples. As pontiff, he oversees the Pontifical Mission Societies which are tasked with coordinating support for dioceses with the greatest needs in Africa, Asia, Latin America, the Middle East and Oceania.

World Mission Sunday

World Mission Sunday is an annual global celebration of our unity as one Church. We gather to reflect on our common evangelizing mission to bring the hope of Christ to the ends of the earth. We are also encouraged to give generously to support missionary efforts in the poorest, most remote, war-torn and persecuted dioceses of the world. On this World Mission Sunday, we are sent forth to be messengers and builders of the hope of Christ. As members of the family of God, united in mission, we celebrate with churches on every continent. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, let us open our arms to the world and offer our prayer and generosity.

We are especially blessed this year as our beloved Pope Francis chose our theme for the Jubilee Year: Missionaries of Hope Among All Peoples. 


