FROM THE DESK OF FR. RICH

Today we celebrate the Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Our first reading taken from the book of Malachi was written after the Jews returned from exile in Babylon. Faced with problems on all sides, many in the community doubted whether God would ever again act on their behalf. In today's passage, Malachi responds to these skeptics.

The second letter to the Thessalonians addresses concerns that the early Christians had about the coming of Christ in glory. Some were excessively interested in the day and hour of Christ's coming. Others thought that his imminent coming was an invitation to idleness.

October is the month when all parishes in the archdiocese do their annual count of weekend Mass attendees. So, if you saw our ushers walking up the aisles before, during or after Mass last month, that's what they were doing. We do this every year in all parishes to get an idea of how our communities are trending especially since the COVID pandemic. This information is even more important now that our three parishes are blended together. These are the numbers that are also reported to the archdiocese.

Regarding last month's October count, I have some very good news to report. For the fourth year in a row, we have experienced an increase in our weekend mass attendance. For your information I thought I would let you see for yourself what our average attendance is and has been for the past seven years so that you can see the trends that we closely monitor from year to year. These totals also represent total attendance at both Our Lady, Mother of the Church and St. Eugene.

2019 (pre-COVID) Average weekend Mass attendance:	1,406
2020 Churches closed due to COVID shutdown:	no count
2021 Average weekend Mass attendance:	652
2022 Average weekend Mass attendance:	1,212
2023 Average weekend Mass attendance:	1,253
2024 Average weekend Mass attendance:	1,316
2025 Average weekend Mass attendance:	1,378

These numbers represent an upward trend over the past few years and that is a good sign considering we also had over 1,000 funerals over this seven-year time period, many of whom were active parish members. Let's pray that the increase in our weekend Mass attendance continues as we look toward our future.

PLEASE WELCOME OUR OCIA CLASS



Lector Workshop

QUEEN OF PEACE PARISH



Charlene Soby from Holy Name Cathedral gave a wonderful two-hour presentation on the lector ministry: sharing its history, how to prepare to serve as a lector, and how to proclaim the Word of the Lord.

Lectors learned that our voice is a tool for effective proclamation, including volume, articulation, pace, and enunciation. Lectors also learned the importance of eye contact, and using a finger to keep one's place.

The presentation included where to incorporate pauses, and when to make slight changes in tone. Even very short readings were discussed, noting that the words are powerful, to use pauses, and keep a deliberate tempo. Unexpected occurrences were also brought up, and it was recommended to keep reading glasses in the sacristy. Lectors are to practice twelve readings, and proclaim them at the microphone during the next session.
