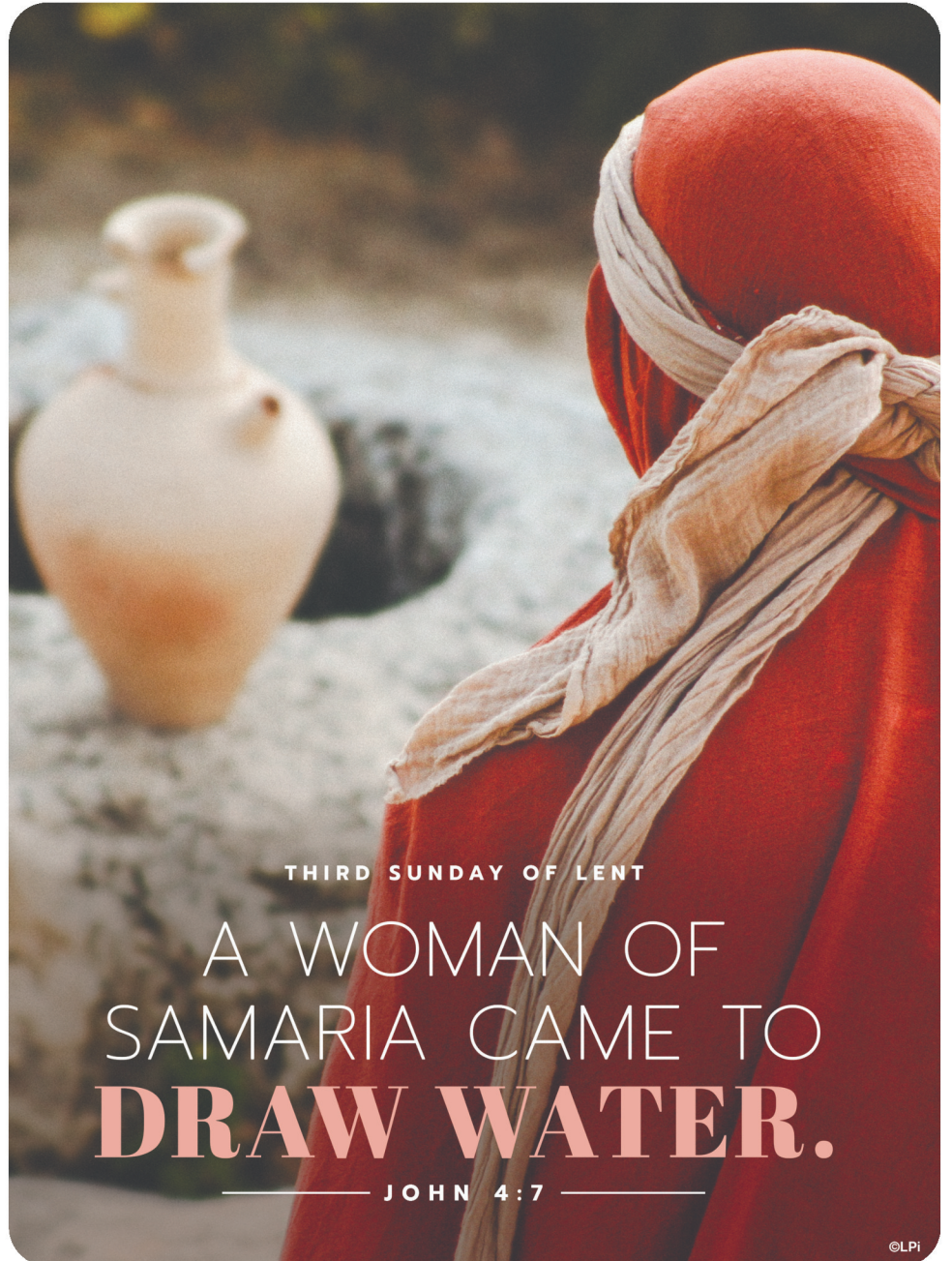

FROM THE DESK OF FR. RICH

Today we celebrate the Third Sunday of Lent.

The book of Exodus tells of the Israelites' escape from Egypt and their wanderings in the wilderness. Their trials during that time, the way they faced them and the way God responded, provided future generations with food for thought whenever they faced difficulties.

In writing to the Romans, Paul is dealing with a community he had not yet visited. Many Roman Christians were converts from Judaism who believed they would be saved by how they lived out the Jewish Law. Paul stresses here, as he does frequently in his writings, that the Christians are not saved by the Law, but by faith - faith in what Jesus accomplished by his dying and rising.



Our Parish Communal Lenten Reconciliation Service with individual confessions will take place at St. Eugene Church on Tuesday, March 31st, at 7:00 p.m. I invite you to join us in receiving the healing power of Jesus and the gift of God's grace in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This will be the last opportunity for confession before Easter. Please plan on joining your parish community on Tuesday, March 31st as you make your personal preparations for Holy Week and Easter. No confessions will be heard on Holy Saturday, April 4th.



Finally, I'd like to remind everyone of our last fish-fry dinner that is coming up this Friday, March 13th. It will be held in the gymnasium at St. Eugene from 4:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. There are many items to choose from other than fish. If you've never come to one of our fish-fry's I would strongly encourage you to try it! There will also be a delicious meatless dinner that will be held at Our Lady, Mother of the Church on Friday, March 27th from 4:30 to 7:00 p.m. Please plan on joining us for this Lenten meal.
