## FROM THE DESK OF FR. RICH

This weekend we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Lent.

It is about 1000 B.C., 250 years after Moses brought God's people from slavery in Egypt to the Promised Land. It took a long time for these people from different tribes to unify as a nation.

The turning point came when David became their king. The story of how he was chosen is told in today's first reading from the book of Samuel. Samuel was a venerable old prophet. Jesse was a resident of Bethlehem and had eight sons, the youngest of whom was David.

The ancient city of Ephesus was located on the western coast of what is today Turkey. The Christians there existed in a society dominated by pagan values, which today's reading equates with darkness.

Through the generosity of our parishioners the needs of so many were met through these Outreach Ministries. Unfortunately, when COVID arrived everything changed as "Social Distancing" ended so much of the outreach that was able to be done.

That was then, but this is now...and it is time to re-form/re-group our Social Concerns ministry and outreach efforts. To accomplish this, we will need a team of dedicated, compassionate, loving and service-oriented parishioners who are willing dedicate some of their free time as volunteers to be as Christ to those who have fallen upon difficult times. If there was ever a ministry that enables us to put our faith into action, this would be it.

For this reason, I am asking anyone in our parish who would like to be a part of our newly forming Social Concerns/Outreach Ministry Team and who is willing to assist the needy of our community through the management of our Social Concerns resources, to fill out the form below that will let me know of your desire to serve in this capacity. Once I have received enough names to form this ministry (ideally 6-10 parishioners), I will call us all together for an informational meeting and discussion so that we can review and determine our next steps.

I ask all in our parish to pray and to discern whether this might be your opportunity to serve our Lord through service of our most vulnerable brothers and sisters.

## DECORATING FOR HOLY WEEK/EASTER

The Liturgical Decorating Committee need some “extra hands” to help change the sanctuary from the season of Lent to the seasons of Holy Week and Easter. The Holy Week/Easter schedule is as follows:

### ST. EUGENE CHURCH:

**Saturday, March 28, from 12:30 until 1:30 pm.** Decorating for Palm Sunday.

**Wednesday, April 1, from 6:30 until 8:00 pm.** Decorating for Holy Thursday. Set up Tabernacle of Repose and decorate area.

**Thursday, April 2, from 8:30 until 9:00 pm.** After Holy Thursday Mass.

Remove everything from the altar and sanctuary, except the Tabernacle of Repose and area around it.

**Friday, April 3, from 9:30 until 10:00 am.** Decorate for Good Friday.

Put up the black Good Friday banners and remove the flowers and candles from the alter of repose.

**Saturday, April 4, from 9:00 until 10:30 am.** Decorate for Easter.

Change banners; decorate with flowers; put up swags; decorate vestibule.

### OUR LADY, MOTHER OF THE CHURCH:

**Friday, March 27, from 10:00 until 11:00 am.** Decorating for Palm Sunday.

**Tuesday, March 31, from 8:30 until 9:00 am.** Remove everything from the altar and sanctuary.

**Friday, April 3, from 4:00 until 5:30 pm.** Decorate for Easter. Decorate with flowers and decorate vestibule.

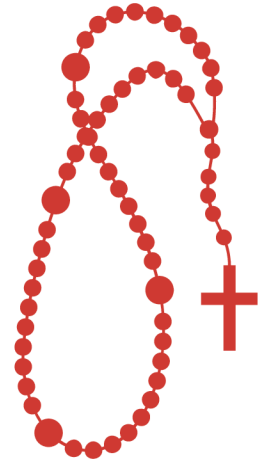

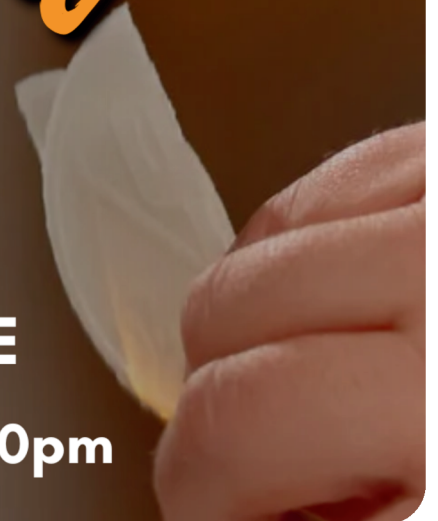
