

Mass

We will have a May Crowning in the church prior to school mass on **Wednesday**, **May 19**, **2021 beginning at 8:10 am**. The mass in the church will be attended by the 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades. All other classes will be viewing the procession, crowning, and mass from their classrooms to accommodate the current COVID restrictions. The start of mass will begin at around 8:30 am in order to allow for this special rite.

We are asking that students bring flowers to school in the morning on Tuesday and Wednesday, and turn those into their homeroom teacher. Those flowers will be collected and brought to the church by designated staff/students as part of a procession starting at 8:00 am on the day of the May Crowning. The flowers will be placed around the statue of Mary which will be placed near the altar in the church, and left there during mass. The actually crowning of Mary will take place after the procession, and when all of the flowers are in place.

Students not in the church will be able to see the flowers they bring placed near Mary by way of the video feed in the classrooms.

As Catholics we are asked to honor Mary during the month of May and to give extra dedication to the prayer of the Rosary. We need to take the time to honor her for being the perfect disciple and Queen of the Universe. A May Crowning is a tradition that allows us to do just that, and we invite everyone to participate.
