STCS Policies and Procedures

Forgotten Items

An important part of building responsibility in children is allowing them to experience logical and natural consequences. When a student has to leave class to call home for forgotten items, he/she is losing valuable instructional time.

Instructional time will not be interrupted to deliver books, and homework, etc. Students will not be allowed to use the school phone to call home for forgotten items during instructional time.

Lunch count orders are calculated and submitted by 8:20 am. The quantity of food prepared is based on this lunch count. Therefore, parents are not permitted to bring lunches after lunch count is taken (with the exception of students with life-threatening food allergies). Special carry-out lunches are permitted for the birthday student only, with advanced written notice to the homeroom teacher.

If a student has forgotten an item at school after he/she has been picked up in carpool, the student and/or parent will not be able to re-enter the building to retrieve the item.

After School Sports Events

Students wishing to attend all sports events after school must be picked-up at regular dismissal or checked out of KV and be brought back to the game. Students are not allowed to remain on campus unsupervised. Students are not able to attend games without a parent/guardian.



There will be no access to school buildings during games with the exception of the restrooms in the gym.



Now accepting applications for 2024-2025 school year

St. Theresa Catholic School is now accepting new student applications for the 2024-2025 school year! If you have friends or family that are interested in joining us next year, our application is available on our website under <u>Admissions Process</u>.

Re-enrollment for your currently enrolled students will take place early in 2024, as usual. You will receive a separate email about re-enrollment in early 2024.

For new applicants, the application deadline to be considered in our first round of decisions for the 2024-2025 school year is **February 5**, **2024**. We WILL continue to consider applications submitted after this date, so long as there is space in the grade. PK3 applicants must be three years old as of September 1, 2024 and toilet trained before school begins in August 2024.


