From the Pastor's Office*The Baptism of the Lord*

The readings at Mass take a giant leap forward. Very quickly we leave behind the things of Christmas and Bethlehem. Now we are in the adult life of Jesus. His growing up was quiet. He was a little boy just like every other little boy. Being the son of a carpenter, no doubt Jesus helped Joseph. Maybe Joseph asked Jesus to help him bang in the nails to make a table or a chair. Then it was time to go forth. Jesus left the domain of His family because He heard God calling Him to journey forth. God leads and Jesus follows.

The journey brought Him to the Jordan River. John the Baptist was there with his baptism of repentance. We imagine a cloudy windy day. There are people waiting their turn on the bank of the river. Jesus quietly joins them. John becomes aware of Jesus when He stands before him. Because Jesus was his cousin, surely they greeted and embraced each other. Filled with grace John knew who Jesus was. In that moment John was not going to baptize just another man of Galilee. He was about to baptize the Son of God Messiah. The story is told in that way. It has divine qualities. As John immersed Jesus into the waters, he heard a voice from the Heavens. "This is my beloved Son with whom I am well pleased." If you are going to tell the story about the Messiah you have to add some drama, maybe a choir of angels or two. You have to make it a little bit impressive. I am sure Jesus got up and walked away to allow the next person to be baptized. John paused for a moment and watched as Jesus headed for the desert. At this point Jesus must have had a kind of distant look in His eyes. He was not heading for the desert. God was pointing Him that way. From this moment it was God who led and Jesus followed. The missionary life of the Messiah begins now. Now is the time for John to retreat from the stage. His job was to announce to the world that the Messiah was coming. The moment is now. The words of Paul come to mind. Remember when he said that when he was a child he did the things of children. He lived and acted as a child. But now that he has become a man he leaves the things of childhood behind. It is time to go forth into the world and leave your mark. Today is that day for Jesus.

CHURCH SAFETY AT CHRISTMAS AND OTHER BUSY HOLIDAYS

We would like to thank the parish community for your patience and understanding during the Christmas Eve and Christmas Day liturgies, when the church campus was once again visited by overwhelming numbers of visitors and guests. At the 3 p.m. Christmas Eve Mass, we counted between 1400 and 1500 people in attendance for Mass in a church whose sanctuary holds less than half that amount. Keeping so many people of all ages and abilities safe, especially those who are unfamiliar with our campus and facilities, presents a very formidable challenge, which we have taken many steps to meet. The admonishments of fire and safety officials have prompted and held us accountable in doing so.

With the completion of the Parish Center, we have added two halls whose combined capacity doubles that of the church. Along with the video monitor in the Café used during our normal weekend liturgies, we are now able to offer a live feed of Mass in both the upstairs and downstairs halls to those who arrive after the Church sanctuary is full. The Liturgical Ministry volunteers at these Masses, though not working with their usual teams, adapt and accommodate these incredibly large numbers as best they can with hospitality and in administering the sacrament of Communion. We owe them much gratitude!

Under these circumstances, it is absolutely necessary to exercise control over the occupation of the church Narthex. The Church sanctuary has very limited entrances and exits, and passage through the Narthex is very important to maintaining a safe environment. Since the Narthex was not intended as part of the worship area, there is limited ventilation and air flow, which presents another danger if large groups are allowed to remain standing there. Once the Church is full, it is a matter of minutes before arriving visitors will completely occupy the Narthex, and the need to prevent this requires that a very strict standard is adhered to. As soon as exceptions are made and the rules are bent, our ability to make safety decisions with integrity becomes unacceptably compromised. For this reason, the Narthex is kept completely clear during these exceptionally large holiday Masses; this is far more necessary than it is during normal weekend liturgies, when small numbers of our regular worship community sometimes choose to remain there during Mass. Therefore, the Parish Center halls are made available and all arriving guests are sent there once the church sanctuary is full. These facilities have many more entrances and exits, and are capable of housing the additional crowds more safely. Our staff and volunteers are charged with accomplishing this as fairly and kindly as possible.

Again, we are grateful for the support and understanding of the parish family! It is truly impossible to anticipate or govern the attendance of Masses like these at Christmas, as well as on Palm Sunday and Easter. Please know that it is our duty and priority to keep each of you, and all who come to visit us for the worship of God, as safe as possible at all times.
