

From the Pastor's Office

Palm Sunday

Usually when Palm Sunday comes around, I emit a sigh of relief that Lent is about to end. I also emit another sigh that Holy Week is about to begin because that tends to become very emotional. Palm Sunday is the great introduction. The great drama begins. Jesus arrives in Jerusalem. This is the time of the Passover, so the city of Jerusalem would be thronging with people. Jesus is just another pilgrim entering the city. Unfortunately, the Jewish Authority have been watching out for Him. Keep an eye on that one. We are given the great hosannas as Jesus enters the city but that great welcome is hidden behind the great swell of other people with their bags and their animals. The city of Jerusalem is extra busy. Estimates say the population of Jerusalem in Jesus' time was something between 50 to 100.000 people. In the time of Passover this number exploded to one or two million pilgrims. Remember that this is a pilgrimage city. It runs efficiently with all the various services and resources a pilgrim might need. Passover was all about animal sacrifice so the streets must have been plagued with sheep everywhere. Beyond, on the hills you must have seen many caravans of camels, tented villages, campfires everywhere, and exotic people. The city is exciting. If they are going to keep an eye on the movement of Jesus they must act quickly. Guards are everywhere watching. The last thing they want is this Jesus person causing a revolution in the city during the most important annual celebration. Long before His entry into the city, Jesus knew what this would mean. He came to Jerusalem basically to face His destiny. It was time to stand before His accusers and answer them. Jesus knew full well, the slightest excuse and they would arrest Him. Now was not the time to be distracted. Now was the time to gather His people and celebrate Passover with them. Only this Passover was going to be radically different. This Passover was going to inaugurate what we call the Eucharist. A great theological swell was coming. Great drama was going to come as well. Of course they were going to arrest Jesus. They were looking for an excuse. Of course they would put Him on trial. Let's have a great show trial. Let's shame this one. Let's destroy Him and His followers and we'll say no more about it. They will forget Him soon enough. We've seen all this before.



New employees and new volunteers currently active in ministry must submit the EIM Application at www.eappsdb.com/austin (as a First Time Applicant) and attend an in-person EIM Workshop (as of Jan. 1, 2021, new applicants may not use the online EIM training for their initial EIM compliance requirement). EIM Workshops have resumed for new applicants (or no prior EIM Workshop attendance) and are typically for members of the host parish/school community only at this time.
