

From the Pastor's Office

The Most Holy Trinity

To complete the cycle now we celebrate Trinity Sunday. The Holy Spirit has been poured out. In the funeral liturgy we talk about the veil being lifted. We see God face to face. Now we are given a chance to get a glimpse of God in His Wholeness. God reveals Himself to us wholly and completely. God is Father, Son and Spirit. God loves us so much that he reveals Himself to us completely. What makes me sad is that after all that, I meet mature adult people and they are still afraid to come close to God. I know why. From their childhood because of some terrible catechism and teaching they were told to be very afraid of God. If you don't behave yourself God will come by with the Bogeyman and He will take you away. That is terrible damage we do to our children. Properly we should all be excited to come close to God. As much as our parents love us, God loves us even more. I would go so far as to say that God yearns for us. He aches for love of us. It must hurt God a lot when we hide from Him. We have to fix that. People are so afraid to come close to God that when they come to confession they have to invent sins just to confess something. People start confessing sins from years ago for fear they never confessed them at all. I don't fear God. Lots of times I get so mad with Him that I let Him have it. Why not? If I am going to be in relationship with Him, then I am going to let Him have it when I think He is wrong. You should hear some of the fights I have with God. Now going into the future as the Church, we have all our cards in a row. God is with us, who can be against us? Nothing and no one. Just like in Mission Impossible, our mission, should we choose to accept it, is to tell the world about God. I get very disappointed when I meet people who tell me that their parents never talked about God at home. They never offered a prayer in their life. They never did a work of charity. They never were witness to Christian values. They never went to church. The world of God and Church opens up a whole new universe to us. Why would we deprive that to our children? Clearly the mission was refused by parents generations ago. We are now living in a world of devout grandparents, lapsed children and pagan grandchildren. It makes me sad. But you know what? I am going to keep going. I am going to speak about God all the time. I am going to drive lapsed people crazy with my God talk. I am going to be Christlike to them and it will drive them crazy. I am going to offer a prayer in their presence and I am going to ask God to bless them, whether they like it or not.

From the Pastor's Office

My Beloved Parish Community,

Starting Pentecost Sunday, the Bishop's dispensation for devout Catholics to attend Church at least once a week has been lifted. Going forward we wish to lay some ground rules. We are taking into consideration that currently only 35% of people in the nation have been fully vaccinated. That means 65% of the people are not yet vaccinated. That includes most/all of our children. Families with young children are still concerned. Some people who are fully vaccinated wonder why the whole world is not open yet. We have been guided by the public health guidelines which are beginning to change. Right now we have moved to Stage 2. There are still some restrictions on public gatherings indoors in place. For now, we will abide by these restrictions but will begin to consider when we might be able to open the campus for gatherings.

Given these restrictions there will still be a cap on how many people can gather in the Church. Beyond the acceptable number of people attending Church we will invite those we cannot seat in the Church to go to the Parish Center to watch Mass on a live stream and participate in Eucharist in Johnson Hall. Johnson Hall is also available for those who wish to be seated in a fixed social distanced environment.

The Bishop has delegated responsibility and decision making to the local pastors. Because of that, we are mandating that those who wish to volunteer as Ministers in any St. Catherine of Siena ministry or activity and in any capacity to be vaccinated. Those who have not been vaccinated yet we ask that you do not volunteer until you have been vaccinated. Those requiring vaccination include the following, without limitation: Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors, Ushers, Wedding Coordinators, Funeral Ministers, Mass Coordinators, Baptismal Coordinators, Choirs, Musicians, Environmental Ministers, ACTS, Pre-School personnel, Catechists at all levels for adults and children, Parish staff, Office Volunteers, Café Baristas, Hospitality Volunteers, RE volunteers, Senior Ministry, RCIA staff, Sacristans, Community Ministries volunteers and St. Vincent de Paul.

All barriers and restraints in the Church have been removed. People will now seat themselves in Church and we will cease all disinfection of the pews and other surfaces. We will introduce more ministries in the Church to help with the larger numbers of people.

We intend to cut back our live streaming of Masses. Live streaming will be made available only for all daily Masses, the Vigil Mass at 5: 00 p.m. on Saturday and for the 9:30 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. Masses on Sunday.

Eucharistic visitors to the homebound and nursing homes will begin again within specific guidelines. We will assess the situation daily and make changes as needed. It is our hope we can return to a more normal schedule as soon as possible.




