

A few Sundays ago we had Jesus give a discourse about the Bread of Life. You might remember He said, "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood...etc." As a result of these words, many of those who followed Him left. They couldn't take it. The thing is that Jesus knew this was going to happen. We are given a similar example from the Gospel reading today. Jesus brings them all to Caesarea Philippi. There He began to tell them that His destiny lay in Jerusalem. Once He arrived in Jerusalem Jesus told them that they would arrest Him and crucify Him. This was so hard to take that some/many of His followers left Him. Maybe their thinking was like, "I'm not going to follow a loser." Who do you say Jesus is? That is a question all of us need to answer. We don't need to have a profound answer. Just have an answer. It is troubling to think that there are lots of people who come to the Church, they say their prayers, sing their hymns and they take communion. But they have no idea who it is they are worshipping and adore. The Letter of St. James today, the second reading, punches hard. The question he raises reveals the theological divide between the Catholic and Protestant world. The traditional Latin phrasing is "sola scriptura" (scripture alone.) Most of the Protestant Churches have little time for scripture and tradition. The other great debate among Catholics and Protestants is revealed in James' words today. Are we saved by Faith alone? Or, are we saved by Faith and Works alone. The Protestants would say we are saved by Faith alone. We are saved by the grace of God working in us. Catholics would absolutely agree with the Protestants, except for one thing. Catholics would say that we are saved by Faith alone and that faith is given expression by the good works we do. All of that is something we all need to ponder. My words go out to those people in our parish who come to Mass and who go home again. They don't get involved in anything, they don't support anything we do, they don't show up. Are you people really Catholic? God bless your wonderful faith, but you do nothing to show it exists. That is the problem. Fix it!

2021 FINANCIAL UPDATE

It has been an extremely difficult year at St. Catherine’s. The exigencies of this pandemic have forced us to close our Parish Center to gatherings and to livestream all of our ministry activities including RCIA and Religious Education. We have endeavored to learn the art of livestreaming Masses, conducting zoom meetings, the virtual publishing of the bulletin and other messaging tools and the recording of an assortment of programming to meet the changing needs of our community in this challenging time. Just as we began to plan for the reopening of our facilities, the delta variant of Covid came knocking at our door with the elevation of the risk guidelines to Stage 5. This unfortunately forced the continuation of the unwelcomed closure of our facilities. It has truly been a challenging year for every ministry and we hope and pray that this new year will offer opportunities for the regrowth of our Parish Community in what will surely be a new normal.

As you can see from the following Financial Report we ended this fiscal year positively with net income in excess of \$380,000. In spite of the challenges presented by this pandemic, we gratefully saw tithing reach almost \$1.8 million. Given the difficulties presented by this pandemic we are truly grateful that we missed our fiscal year projection of \$1.9 million by only a small margin. This is, of course, due to the dedication of our community who rose to the challenge to continue tithing online and via mail in spite of the fact that only about 43% of our parish community were able to attend Mass in person while most others only virtually. On the expense side we ended the year at 80% of the budgeted amount due also to pandemic campus reductions.

Through the generosity of this community we were able to repay \$240,857 of our debt on the Parish Center during fiscal year 2021. As of August 31, 2021, the balance on our loan is \$1,705,067.62. With the ongoing help of the community we hope to continue to make additional principal payments so that we might be able to retire this loan in less than 8 years.

With everything operating in slow motion, it was a good time to make some much needed campus improvements. With income holding steady we were able to replace our old and warped Church doors and glass frontage. The old doors weighed more than 300 pounds and were difficult for even the most able-bodied to open and close. The new doors and glass have given the Narthex a brighter appearance and made opening and closing much easier for all. We were also able to upgrade the pews in the chapel which is now being used for daily adoration. We hope you enjoy the new look in the chapel as it represents a coming attraction of what will happen in the Church once Covid is history.
