From the Pastor's Office

Third Sunday of Easter

In an attempt to understand, and using Peter's words today, he said, lawless men manipulated the crowd into believing that Jesus from Nazareth was a trouble maker, a criminal, a usurper of law and order, and needed to be condemned. Most people in the crowd had little idea who this Jesus was. They stood Him next to other criminals. They supposed Him to be one of them. Crucify them all! Ancient people in ancient Rome were well used to crucifixions. The highways were dotted with crosses and corpses. After the crucifixion of Jesus, these Jews had blood on their hands. They condemned an innocent man. Peter addresses them, and he tells them that they are responsible for the death of an innocent man. But then, Peter goes on. He tells them that "God raised this Jesus. Exalted at the right hand of God, He received the promise of the Holy Spirit from the Father and poured Him forth,

as you see and hear." There is no bitterness here. We acknowledge the part we all played, but now we must move on. Let the message of Jesus be proclaimed. Usually when the founder dies, often the institution dies with him. In this example the Church just grew and grew. Jesus reveals His majesty to His people. The two disciples on the road to Emmaus had quite an experience. Because they were followers of Jesus, naturally they talked about what happened in Jerusalem as they walked. A stranger going the same way joined them and they walked together. They are full of talk. Then Jesus began to teach them. They discussed and debated. It was all fascinating. When they came to the end of their journey, naturally the two disciples invited their new friend to join them and take some food. Jesus took the opportunity to bless the bread, and in some mystical awakening, the two disciples recognized that the Messiah was in their midst. Then He disappeared. Did that just happen to



us? It turns out that there were many sightings of Jesus around the same time. What on earth is going on? Everybody is talking about it. Forget going to Emmaus, the disciples returned to Jerusalem very quickly to give their account of what they had experienced. It is all very exciting and remarkable.




