From the Pastor's Office

1st Sunday of Advent

Jesus speaks to us about the coming of the Son of Man. He tells us to stay awake because we do not know on which day the Lord will come. If I could call Jesus on his cell right now, I would ask him to change these words. "Stay awake" doesn't say it strongly enough. Better to say, "Wake up! Get up out of that bed you lazy good for nothing. Asleep all the time." When was the last time you were fully awake? You go to work asleep. You are on the phone asleep. You eat dinner asleep. You watch TV asleep. If I came into the room and asked what you were watching, the chances are high you would say "I have no idea." We seem to live in a constant twilight zone. We have become programmed to be robots living people's lives. As soon as Thanksgiving came, the majority of you had your Christmas lights on that night. Everything was completely done, finished, and decorated the first night. There is no need to look forward because it is all done. There is no more yearning. The children don't have to get excited

anymore because it is all done, finished, bought, and paid for another year. I remember in my childhood the excitement we felt this time of the year as we watched the Christmas lights being put up. In the weeks of Advent, we loved watching the decorations going up and the stores filling with Christmas anticipation. We loved this time of transition, the expectation. But nowadays it is straight into it. There is no more longing. Christmas is fully decorated on the night of Thanksgiving.

A writer in Time magazine said that he lamented the fact that we have no more downtime during the year. We just move from one holiday to the next without a break. Thanks to Hallmark and all that hungry lot, now we have to celebrate their made-up holidays as well. Recently I watched a re-run of the animated movie, "The Incredibles." This is a family of superheroes who have to live in the Superhero Relocation Program, they are hidden in the suburbs. Bob, the husband is bored to death with his insurance job. His wife Helen nags him because he is not paying attention. She reminds him about their child's graduation. Bob

reminds her that it is not a graduation. All he is doing is moving from fourth grade to fifth grade. Then Bob loses it by saying this: "It's psychotic! They keep creating new ways to celebrate mediocrity."

Is this the reason why we have forgotten how to yearn and long for the coming of the Messiah? Will commerce and retail ever give us a break so we can actually wake up? We are entering the season of getting ready for the coming of the Lord. This year, let us acknowledge all the pretense and the phony, the plastic glitter, and the too much of everything. Our Mother the Church invites us to enter a season of reflection and quiet. There is no need to be going crazy and frantic. There is no need to be completely started and finished on the first day. Let's all chill out and be tranquil and easy. Paul says: "Let us conduct ourselves properly as in the day, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in promiscuity and lust, not in rivalry and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ."

For Diane: A personal tribute from Fr. Pat

Diane came to work in St. Catherine's around the same time I began as Associate Pastor. Very quickly she showed herself to be very competent and reliable. On lots of occasions when you called St. Catherine, it was Diane you were speaking to. As the years passed Diane proved invaluable to us all at the office and her special talent was to guide and direct couples who were planning to get married. At a distance you could see that Diane was meticulous at her job. In a second, she would go to her computer and with the press of a button she had all the details on screen. Diane always spoke lovingly about her childhood on the family farm. It turns out she had names for all the animals. I used to tell her that she reminded me of Anne of Green Gables. Her childhood sounded idyllic and happy. Diane regarded our parish staff like her second family. She became very involved in parish life, and she got much enjoyment from her participation in the Women's ACTS Community. A couple of years ago, Diane's father died. Around the same time, Rhonda Smith's husband died. Diane and Rhonda were friends and they grieved together. During that time, I was due to have a vacation. I like to go to London on vacation because I lived there for many years. I had the bright idea that I might invite Diane and Rhonda to take the trip with me. On the way to London, Diane told me all about how excited she was because it turned out she was a great fan of Harry Potter. Very quickly I knew where to take her. We headed for King's Cross Station, Platform 9 %. Just in case you get the wrong idea, this is a tourist attraction. It is not real. But, die-hard Harry Potter fans want to visit their shrines. 


