

From the Pastor's Office

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus seems to be very urgent in the gospel today. He speaks about getting ready to meet our maker. I was watching an episode of Grey's Anatomy recently. Bailey's mother was brought into the hospital because she had dementia, and now she had Covid as well. We watched Bailey battle with the fact that her mother was dying. Jesus said to his disciples in the Gospel today, "You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." Brutal truth, we are all going to die. Like most people we begin to worry about that as we enter old age. We start counting the possible years that hopefully lie ahead. A friend who was sick told me that he always wanted to see Rome. I remember thinking that was never going to happen now. You left it too late. We live with all our dreams and imaginings. The future seems to float ahead into a fog. I don't want to face

death so I distract myself with all kinds of nonsense. You would be amazed at how many people call the priest at the last minute. They want to confess or they want to talk with God. They had plenty of time before to do this, but they just floated along. With all this limited time ahead of me, what is it I have to do now? Maybe I should get a passport and fly to Rome. Maybe, I spent years hating my family, old friends. Is there something I need to do about that? While I am able, I need to get my house in order. Sometimes that means literally. It is amazing the state of some people's houses. Trash everywhere. Things dumped all over the place. That to me is a reflection of what is going on in your head. You are a bit of a mess. I remember years ago when I lived in London. It was time to prepare my homily for next Sunday. I couldn't concentrate. I couldn't get going. I usually prepared my homilies at a desk in my room. I realized that my room was a mess. I needed to clean my house first before I could get going. You stand in front

of your mess, you begin by picking up that piece of paper and putting it in the trash bin. You begin to clean the dishes



and put them away. You throw out the garbage. Very soon you find yourself on a roll. After that you stand in front of your cleaned up house and you feel good. We need to get our houses in order, not just the place where I live. I will be going on a long journey some day and before I go I need to get my life in order. I mustn't leave my mess for somebody else to pick up.

Mission Appeal Next Weekend: August 16-17



St. Catherine of Siena is deeply honored to welcome **Most Rev. Dr. Johannes Gorantla, OCD**, the Bishop of the Diocese of Kurnool, India, who will be preaching at all Masses August 16-17. Bishop Johannes is a man of deep prayer, wisdom, and unshakable faith. Born on February 27, 1974, in a small village in southern India, he entered the Discalced Carmelite Order, professed solemn vows

in 2000, and was ordained a priest in 2002. With a profound love for the Word of God, he earned his Doctorate in Biblical Theology from the prestigious Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome. He fluently speaks eight languages and has shared the Gospel with people from many cultures across the world.

In 2024 he was appointed Bishop of Kurnool, where Catholics represent less than 1% of the population. Despite many challenges, Bishop Johannes leads a vibrant missionary diocese committed to educating over 1,500 poor children, offering medical care to the underprivileged, empowering women, and evangelizing in some of the most spiritually needy regions of India. His 20 years of priestly ministry include national and international service, rooted in humility, learning, and love for God's people. Come and be inspired by a true shepherd who embodies the spirit of the Gospel and the mission of the Church. Let us welcome Bishop Johannes with open hearts and joyful faith!

An Update from the Society of St. Vincent de Paul

Each week, four days a week, the members of the <u>Society of St. Vincent de Paul</u> at St. Catherine's answer the call of our neighbors in need. Neighbors call on a dedicated line, and teams of Vincentians fan out to various parts of our parish boundaries to answer the call.

During the last 10 months of the fiscal year 2025, a total of \$159,650 was spent. Of this, a lion's share of the money (\$63,172) helped with rent and eviction-prevention, while another significant amount (\$41,584) covered gas, electricity, and phone bills. None of this would be possible without the support of our parishioners. The second collection at all of the upcoming weekend masses will be dedicated to this cause. We are so grateful, and thank you for your generosity, without which none of this would be possible.

Religious Education Registration Open for 2025-2026

<u>Religious education registration</u> is open for the 2025-2026 school year. For grades 1-6, there are two options:



First Communion Registration

First Communion is a two-year program. Families who are going into their second year have already been contacted with registration information. If this will be your child's first year preparing for First Communion (grade 1 or higher), we will be doing registration in-person. We're going old school this year because we want to get to know families better and build parish community. If you have a child who needs to begin their first year of First Communion preparation, e-mail their baptism certificate and the date you completed the diocesan EIM/VIRTUS workshop to marti.salas@stcatherine-austin.org. If they were baptized here at St. Catherine's, let Marti know and she will look it up. After that, you will be sent a sign-up for a time to come in and register.

Post-First Communion Registration

Grades 7-12 Pre-Confirmation and Confirmation

Parents of students in grades 7-12 who are interested in Pre-Confirmation or Confirmation classes must schedule a meeting with Livia Telles-Rodriguez before registering. Meetings can be scheduled by <u>clicking here</u> or scanning the QR code.



Pre-Confirmation: Two years of pre-Confirmation classes are required before a student can attend Confirmation class. Pre-Confirmation classes can begin as early as grade 7. There are two options this year for pre-Confirmation: Sunday youth classes at St. Catherine of Siena twice a month **OR** at-home homework. Everyone must attend Sunday Mass twice a month and attend parish events.

Confirmation: Students in Confirmation class have completed two years of pre-Confirmation and are in grade 9 or above. Confirmation class will take place on Sundays in-person at St. Catherine of Siena for one semester. Everyone in Confirmation class must attend Sunday Mass twice a month and attend parish events.







Updated EIM Compliance Information

The mission of the Diocese of Austin's Ethics and Integrity in Ministry (EIM) program is to help protect people from abuse and unethical behavior through education, action, and reporting, and to listen to and learn from those who have experienced abuse in order to provide healing.
